Wesley Fellowship Class Hears of Community

Dr. Al Quade of the Florida State University faculty spoke to the Wesley Fellowship class, May 19, about Tallahassee's need for community action on current social problems.

Dr. Quade, professor of marriage and family living, stressed the types of problems, such as juvenile delinquency, alcoholism, divorce, sex irregularities, chronic family indebtedness, and family life broken by desertion, pointing out that factual studies show these problems arise from faulty childhood training.

Persons involved in these problems, he said, almost without exception come from homes where Christian living is not practiced. He said it is the duty of the church to take action toward stabilizing the home of these persons so that the present trend of problems will not continue to multiply itself by producing children who will repeat the mistakes of their parents.

Mrs. Mallie Slater, member of the Wesley Fellowship Class, was installed as secretary of the Leon County Classroom Teachers association, Tuesday, May 21. Mrs. Slater teaches a section of the fifth grade at Caroline Brevard School.
