

# FEAR or FAITH

Bryce Harlow, one time assistant to President Eisenhower soys, "I no longer run around demanding that America 'catch up' with Russia. If we did that, we'd hove to rip up fourteen of every fifteen miles of our paved highways, and two of every three miles of railroads, sink eight of every nine ocean-going vessels, scrap nineteen out of every twenty cars and trucks, destroy fifty million T.V. sets, and nine out of every ten telephones, abandon three-fifths of our steel capacity, two-thirds of our petroleum and nine-tenths of our natural gos. We'd hove to put sixty million of our people bock on forms, which they could not own, and jam most of the remainder of us into city tenements holding six to twenty persons in each room."

It would appear that the "catch-up-with Russia" fans hove become confused about which goal our team is driving toward. One wonders why we hove become so filled with fear of Russia? Perhaps the answer is to be found in the area of our Spiritual life. Can it be that our growing materialism has joined with the failure of so many people to worship Almighty God faithfully each week in eroding our spiritual resources? America hos no reason to feor any nation in terms of material wealth and ability. But no notion and no individual is any stronger than the faith by which they ore sustained.

Let us join enthusiastically in a campaign to know and to deepen our faith. Then the Lord will become the strength of our lives and we will have no need to be afraid of anyone or anything. "Catch up" with Russia? What we need to do is "catch up" with Christ. Which gool is your team driving toward, fear or faith? The Faith team meets for practice every Sunday. Those wishing to "try-out" for the team will be welcome. I will hope to see you not once, but twice each Sunday.


RICHARD G. MILK DAY


# MEXICAN METHODISM

Thanksgiving renews awareness of our need for the Saviour. When we cease complaining about what we do not have and praise God for our manifold blessings, we then realize that "He hath not dealt with us after our sins; nor reworded us according to our iniquities." This sacred period rushes forward, homes, churches, stores, offices are decorated with festive garlands; concerts are conducted whose glorious sacred music makes one feel it must have been composed in the very presence of God. Christmas Day comes, and people throughout the world kneel at the same manger—some in peril of their lives for such worship—remembering again that eternal and personal promise, "Unto you. . . . o Saviour."

It is a tragedy that many in our time have never found—or have lost—the glory of the days between Thanksgiving and Christmas. This is why we suggest that you do your Christmas Thinking Early.
