Help, HELP, H-E-L-P

I am not sure that our position can be equated with that of a drowning person, but I do know that it sometimes seems desperate; consequently, I am asking for your understanding, cooperation and support.

As your minister it is necessary that I have some time for study, meditation and prayer that is free from interruption. When this period is broken it often means than an idea is lost forever or that a considerable period of time is lost in trying to recapture it. Consequently, I plan to be in my study from 8 a.m. to 11 a.m. each morning, and in the office from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m. Monday through Thursday. If your phone calls could be made to the office between 11 a.m. and 1 p.m. it would be helpful. This will also be a convenient time for interviews. Appointments will be happily arranged at other hours, but I hope you will help me by phoning so that a definite time can be scheduled. It is my hope that you will feel free at any time to call upon me as your minister. My wife will always come to the study for me (there is no phone there) in case you need me between 8 a.m. and 11 a.m., but unless it is something that calls for immediate attention I will appreciate your helping me to keep these hours free from interruption.

You can also help by phoning the Church Office the names of relatives, friends, and neighbors who are admitted to the hospital. I visit in the hospital regularly but am often embarrassed by discovering that some member has been in the hospital and discharged without my knowing it. The records available to me at the hospital have not proven adequate nor have I been able to learn all our people well enough to be sure that I recognize their names by looking at a list without addresses. The only sure way for us to know about any illness is for you to phone the Church Office. We'll appreciate your help in rendering this important pastoral service.

Some weeks ago a university student came by my office to talk about the church. In the conversation he mentioned how difficult it was for him to meditate during the prelude because of the rather loud conversations going on in Opperman Hall. It will undoubtedly help many people to get more out of our services if we whisper prayers after the Prelude begins. Then, too, there are the interruptions which come when late comers can't be seated on the end of a row of seats. It would be most helpful if those who are seated first in a row would move to the center.

We have a wonderful church and some of the finest people in the world make-up our congregation. I know you will help when you understand a need. God bless you each and every one.

LOOKING AHEAD

All of our attention is now directed toward the successful conclusion of our Every Member Visitation Program. The organization, planning and training part of the E.M.V. has been marvelous to behold. Our people have been quick to offer their services and faithful as well as capable in performing their duties. The final training session for the Visitors will be held this afternoon at 4:00 P.M. in Trinity Hall.

Next Sunday, January 20, is Loyalty Sunday. Every member of the congregation is asked to demonstrate his loyalty in three ways: first, to attend one of the worship services that morning; second, to remain at home that afternoon until he has been contacted by a team of Visitors; third, when the Visitors call to be prepared to assume a share in Trinity's program that will indicate his devotion and loyalty to Christ's Church.

As of January 31 all previous pledges to Trinity's Budget and Building Fund will be cancelled (the only exception being a few for which special arrangements have been made). Your new pledge to a Budget, which combines both programs, takes effect on February 1.

A large number of our contributors have adopted a policy of keeping their contributions current by signing bank orders. This means that the bank transfers the appropriate amount from your account to that of the Church on the first day in each month. If you wish to make your contribution in this manner you should sign a new bank order, as all the old ones will terminate as of January 31.

Sunday, January 27, will be Victory Sunday. On that day we plan to announce the budget pledged, and to dedicate your pledge cards at the altar of the Church.

ON TITHING

There are two ways in which the tithe is sometimes mis-represented, and perhaps this is the reason some people have not been willing to try it. One of these mis-representations is that the tithe is a mechanical thing, and will guarantee prosperity, since God will be required to honor one who tithes. The other mis-representation is that tithing is an isolated part of one's religion, and has no bearing on worship or religious observance.

Actually, tithing is a way of life, not a part of life. It begins with the realization that all things come from God, and we are only stewards of what He has entrusted to our care. It ends with the realization that tithing of income is only one phase of worship, or religious observance, and that our time, our energies and our lives themselves are to be under His direction. So we begin with tithing; but we end up belonging completely to Him.


