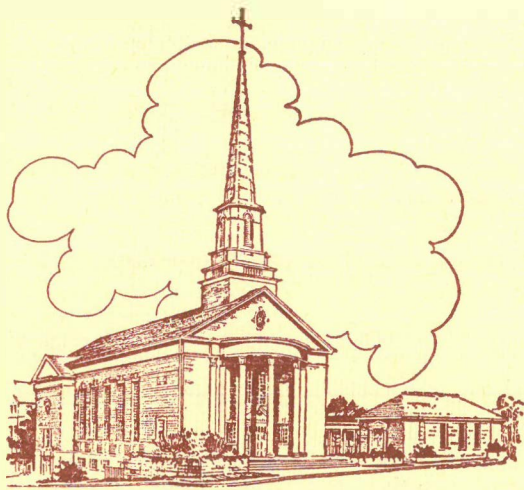

NEW CONFERENCE YEAR

On June 1, we begin a new church year. The budget adopted for the new year amounts to \$200,000. Of this amount \$177,000 has been pledged. This is a sizeable amount of money and indicates your desire to develop a program in keeping with our buildings. However, we should have \$10,000 in additional pledges in order to assure that our budget will be met. If you have not made your pledge for the new year, please do so next Sunday. METHODIST STUDENT DAY

The first Methodist Student Day Offering was taken in 1886. Since then the church has faithfully supported the movement to help Methodist College Students. Millions of dollars have thus been consecrated to the education of young people through gifts and loans. Our contribution is included in Trinity's Ten-in-One Offering which we take in March each year.

We will, however, observe Methodist Student Day on June 14. A special invitation to attend that morning is extended to our college students and the graduating classes of our high schools. The sermon will be prepared with you in mind.

HOLY COMMUNION

This Sunday we will be privileged to administer the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper for the first time in our new church. The last service in our former building was the Holy Communion, and since that time we have not been able to join in this most sacred of all Christian worship services at the morning hour. It will therefore be a time of special significance for all of us. We urge all of you who can to attend the early service in order to divide the congregation as evenly as possible.

The ushers will be prepared to direct the congregation toward an efficient and orderly procedure. It is customary for ladies to remove their glove from the hand used to take the elements. Persons receiving communion should be present for the Invocation and stay through the Benediction. Offerings left at the Communion Rail go into a fund to be used by the ministers for the aid of the needy.

Persons who find it inconvenient to kneel may stand at the communion rail. One of the ministers will be happy to serve the elements in the pew to persons whose movements are restricted—please sit on the second row and ask an usher to notify the minister.

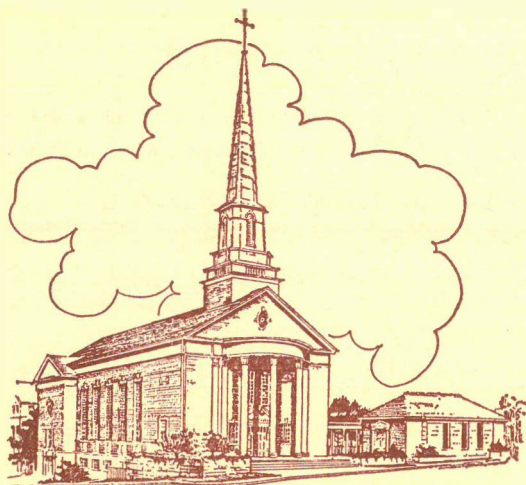

CALL AND RESPONSE

"One of the great Missionary challenges of our day is the training of the laity for Missions," says the Reverend Tracey Jones author of the study book, *Our Mission Today*. I know of no minister who would challenge this statement. 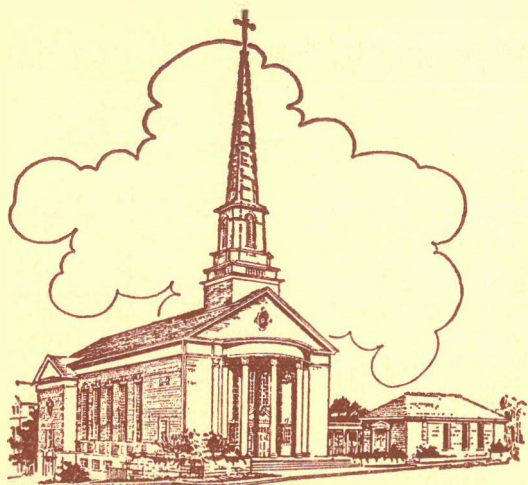

NEWS IN THE WORLD OF RELIGION

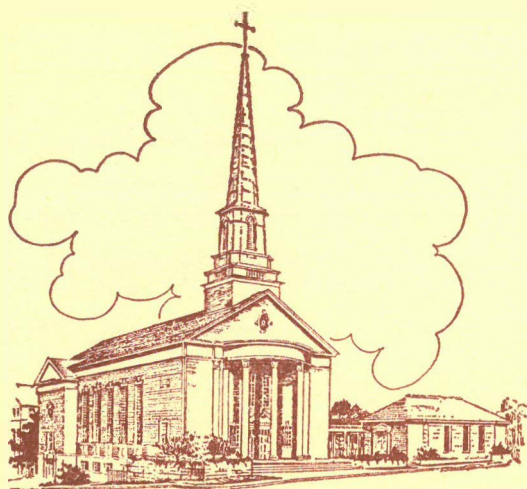
The Methodist General Conference has granted permission for Methodists in five countries to become independent, self-governing churches during the next four years. The Methodists who were given the right to become autonomous churches are those of Cuba, Liberia, Indonesia, Burma and Pakistan when they vote for such status. They comprise 87,057 members in 1,128 local churches. The granting of autonomy to the churches in the five countries is regarded as significant, as they would become the first churches in 34 years to separate organically from the parent Methodist Church. In 1930 the Methodist churches of Korea, Brazil and Mexico became autonomous. They have continued since then as independent churches, though still fraternally affiliated with American Methodism.

NEWS IN THE WORLD OF RELIGION

So far as is known, there are only two women ministers serving as district superintendents in the Methodist Church. Both are on overseas mission fields. Thus the series of "first" on the mission field in regard to women's rights and responsibilities continues. The first woman to be appointed a district superintendent was Miss Gusta A. Robinett, of Columbia City, Indiana, a missionary who was named superintendent of the Medan Chinese District in Indonesia (Sumatra) in 1959. She was appointed to the district superintendency by Bishop Hobart B. Amstutz of the Singapore Area. Now a second woman is serving as a district superintendent in the Singapore Area, also appointed to her post by Bishop Amstutz. She is the Reverend Miss Lim Swee Beng, who is superintendent of the Malacca District in the Malaysia Chinese Annual Conference in Malaya (now part of Malaysia). She sits in the cabinet of the Malaysia Chinese Conference and administers a district with sixteen congregations, having a membership of 1,665 (full and preparatory). Miss Lim is the first woman national to be appointed to the superintendency.
