

"AN UNIMPORTANT DIALOGUE"

First Voice: Hello! It's nice to see you downtown this beautiful day. How is everything at your house today?

Second Voice: Oh, all right I guess, but that sermon I heard some time ago about Jesus being unattractive to many of us has caused me some concern. I can't seem to shake

it from my thoughts. First Voice: Jesus unattractive! How ridiculous. I always said those preachers of yours were doing nothing but upsetting everyone. Why Jesus is the most attractive person I know and all I have to do is just to look at the painting of him we have hanging

I know and all I have to do is just to look at the painting of him we have hanging on our wall and know why. It makes me feel real good to know he's mine.

Second Voice: But that's what I've been thinking about. Why does it make you feel real good? What does feeling good mean? I remember in my college days how I came face to face with a most handsome fellow one day, a big man on the campus. My heart almost exploded the rest of the day I felt so good because I had seen him. But then one of my girl friends asked me to tell her about him. I found myself at a loss for words. The sight of him had caused me to feel good, but I really didn't know your much about him other than the compute sheater. I didn't really show his know very much about him other than the campus chatter. I didn't really know his principles, how he would act in certain situations, or why he was what he was.

First Voice: I don't see the connection this has to Jesus.

Second Voice: I guess I am trying to see if we can really know him just because he makes us feel good when we see pictures of him and sing hymns about him, recalling his earthly life to us. Our preacher suggested we also had to study about him; his life, his teachings, his words and how his whole person applies to the life we are trying to live. He said our intellectual stimulation is as important as our

physical admiration.

First Voice: Humph! That's their trouble. They think we have all the time in the world

to give to the church.

Second Voice: But the church is us, you and me. And the time we spend in learning about Christ's relevance in our lives is time well used it seems to me. It helps us

to be better stewards of all our time.

First Voice: Oh, all those books and study groups are for the scholars and the college students. All that is past me now. You can see how true that is by looking in the church library in the 232 section, the section where the books about Jesus are shelved. Very few have ever been checked out. Only the dust has ever laid a finger on them. And those study groups—not many become a part.

Second Voice: But surely they can help even us to get a clearer picture of who and what

Christ was and is. Last night Tommie asked me what Jesus would do if he had been slapped in the face by another boy. I knew I had not read it in the Gospels

and all at once I was at a loss for words.

First Voice: That's an easy one. He would have turned the other cheek.

Second Voice: But I'm not sure that is correct either. It is more involved than it seems.

But anyway that's the answer I gave too.

First Voice: All this chitter-chatter and I'm about to miss my afternoon TV show. I really must run, my dear, my time is limited you know. Don't worry about that sermon, you'll forget it soon. Bye bye.

Second Voice: Bye, see you again. It is getting late. Perhaps I could run by the church library and look at one of those books. Perhaps I could sign up to be a part of one of those study groups. Oh well, they will always be there; anyway, I don't guess it's so important after all.

A NEW CURRICULUM FOR OUR CHILDREN

All curriculum materials for children in the Methodist Church are completely new. The first quarters bright new materials were placed into use last Sunday at Trinity. These Christian Studies for Methodist Children seek to relate the full message of the gospel, witnessed to in Scriptures and church history, to the alert, early-maturing children of our church families. You will want to make sure that your children are at Sunday School on time every Sunday, and that you prepare yourself to help them make the most of the new lesson materials. There are Sunday School classes for adults and youths. Children should never be sent to Sunday School but rather accompanied by their families.

The third and fourth grades will begin to make special use of the Bible in their studies. In order that every child may have his own Bible the Church School will present the members of these two grades with copies of the Scriptures especially prepared for their use at the 8:30 A.M. 

NEW LIFE IN THE CHURCH

Earnest Christians everywhere are seriously concerned as to how spiritual renewal may be found both for themselves and for the churches to which they belong. Many persons agree that the secret of such a renewal of the spiritual life lies in a more intimate experience of study, prayer and communal responsibility. Such intimate experiences are most likely to occur in personal or small groups. It is in such groups that members come into primary personal relationships with God, with other persons, and with themselves. The commandment to love God, and our neighbor as ourselves, is here recognized to be not so much a responsibility laid upon us, as a description of our deepest need.

So much of our life today reduces our relationship to impersonal contacts. God is thought of as some impersonal power we would like to have as our friend; our neighbors are people, prospects, or problems; and we are objects being pushed to and fro by the swift running tides of our times. All of us need to know God and other persons in an interpersonal way in order that we may love them and ourselves. This is what being human is all about.

In response to this need people all over the world have been finding their way into personal groups—groups where they both know and are known as persons. In these small groups they meet face to face regularly for the study of the Bible and of their Christian faith; for prayer; and for the exchange of experiences, needs, and insights. Here, too, they take thought as to how they can best fulfill their calling as Christians to love and serve God and other people. There is great variety of detail in the conduct of such groups. All of them must be small enough for the members to know each other, the attendance must be regular so that the group can be united in its thought and understanding, and the thought and discussion must be directed by some study of common interest.

In an effort to encourage the beginning of additional personal groups in Trinity, we are listing some possible interests and times on page four of this bulletin. Please read them over prayerfully and indicate your first and second choices in the appropriate boxes with a 1 and 2. Then consider the suggested time schedule and indicate your first and second choices of a time to meet in the appropriate boxes. It is planned for these groups to begin the week of October 4 and run through the week of December 6. We will try to offer those studies and times which are of the most interest to you. Fill in your name, address, and telephone number, tear off the page and use it to register your attendance at church this Sunday.

I have the feeling that the renewal of the Church must begin with you and me as individuals. If the life of the church is to be revived in our time we must come to "speak that we do know, and testify that we have seen." Our purpose is to gather in such a spirit that Christ may be recognized as being in our midst. Then the renewal of the Church will have begun.

See you in Church Sunday with your personal groups and times chosen. Let us each begin to pray that God will bring new life to the Church beginning with me.

THE UNFOLDING DRAMA OF THE BIBLE. An introduction to the Bible as a whole which should be of special interest to Church School workers and parents whose children are using the new curriculum. It is a survey of the Bible and will prepare persons to undertake the study of specific Biblical books or passages in the future. BIBLE STUDY using the gospel of MARK. BIBLE STUDY using the gospel of JOHN. Using the Bible and a Bible commentary these groups will examine the meaning of the Scripture and its application in our everyday lives through interpretations and individual testimony. ADVANCED STUDIES. A discussion group using contemporary books on religious themes such as *Man's Search for Meaning* by Victor Fronkl, *Honest to God* by J. A. T. Robinson, and *The Future Is Upon Us* by Roy L. Smith. The group will attempt to come to grip with ideas of contemporary thinkers who are trying to speak to the Church through fresh insights and words. THE METHODIST CHURCH IN SOCIAL THOUGHT AND ACTION. This is the title of a four volume work which has been condensed to a paper back study book by Dr. Georgia Harkness. This study is being presented by the Commission on Christian Social Concerns. It is expected that it will be presented at a breakfast meeting and at one other time. A HISTORY OF EARLY CHRISTIANITY. This course will look at pre-Christian and Christian thought through the personalities, the writings, the events that have molded our Christian heritage through the fifth century A.D. THE MEANING AND SIGNIFICANCE OF CHURCH MEMBERSHIP. This course will use the Membership Manual of the Methodist Church as a guide. It should be of particular interest to persons interested in uniting with this Church or who have joined in recent years. ADULT BIBLE COURSE. This group will approach study of the Bible from a perspective never before used in Methodist periodicals—a three-year study of the Old and New Testaments in which Biblical history, theology, and literature will be studied simultaneously. These ten sessions will consider the first quarter's lessons which are an introduction to serious Bible study. I will join the SHEPHERDS CLUB which will meet for training and experience in Lay Visitation Evangelism. This group will attempt to prepare laymen for witnessing and visitation. All churchmen can prepare themselves to share in this rewarding experience. After sessions of preparation the group will meet monthly for sharing and visitation assignments. Young People, Men, Women, and Couples are encouraged to consider becoming members of a Shepherd's Club. 

METHODIST SOCIETIES

"So I told them, 'If you will all of you come together every Thursday in the evening, I will gladly spend some time with you in prayer and give you the best advice I can.'

Thus arose, without any previous design on either side, what was afterwards called a Society, a very innocent name, and very common in London, for any number of people associating themselves together. The thing proposed in their associating themselves together was obvious to every one. They wanted to 'flee from the wrath to come' and to assist each other in so doing. They therefore united themselves 'in order to pray together, to receive the word of exhortation, and to watch over one another in love, that they might help each other to work out their salvation.'

There is only one condition previously required in those who desire admission into this Society,—'a desire to flee from the wrath to come, to be saved from their sins.'

They now likewise agree that as many of them as had an opportunity would meet together every Friday, and spend the dinner hour in crying to God, both for each other and for all mankind.

It quickly appeared that their thus uniting together answered the end proposed therein. In a few months the far greater part of those who had begun to 'fear God and work righteousness,' but were not united together, grew faint in their minds, and fell back into what they were before. Meanwhile the far greater part of those who were thus united together continued 'striving to enter in at the strait gate' and to 'lay hold on eternal life.'

Upon reflection, I could not but observe, This is the very thing which was from the beginning of Christianity."
