Sermon Preview:

"Holy Communion as Renewal of Covenant"

A member of a Confirmation Class once asked during the session on the Holy Communion, "What are we supposed to be doing when we go down there and kneel?" Perhaps older candidates and even church members have often wanted to ask this question, possibly in somewhat more sophisticated form.

The answer given to the child was that we should kneel and pray, praying with a certain openness of mind, heart and soul, and asking the Living Lord to come more fully into our lives. The further explanation was given that as we receive the bread and wine into our bodies, we are to let this represent the reception of the Living Christ into our lives.

If will doubtless be helpful if we follow the idea of Covenant and consider the Service of Holy Communion as a renewal of our Covenant with God, even a new declaration and act of obedience. There is no doubt of our need for renewal, although we may vary in the degree and intensity of renewal. For some renewal is the regaining of lost ground; for others the sustaining of worth in the daily round; for still others the ascent to higher realizations of God's love and grace. For all the key of renewal is obedience—obedience to the commandment of love.

Sermon Preview:

"COMMANDED TO LOVE"

On recent Sundays we have been seeking to understand our relationship with God in terms of Covenant, and have realized the mutuality involved in Covenant. Man's side of the agreement is his obedience, by which he both enters and remains in Covenant with God.

We find the nature of our obedience brought into sharper focus by the two Great Commandments, our Lord's summary of the law. The strength of these Commandments is very great for us; first, because of their deep Biblical rootage; second, because of the authority of Jesus himself; third, because of the authenticity of the Commandments in their ready appeal to our minds and consciences.

While it seems relatively easy for us to understand what it means to love our neighbor, it is somewhat more difficult to comprehend the meaning of our loving God. Both theological and psychological elements contribute to this difficulty. The sermon is intended to be a contribution toward understanding and obeying this Great Commandment of our Lord.

"COMMANDED TO LOVE"

"The second is this: 'You shall love your neighbor as your-self'." (Mark 12:31)

"A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another; even as I have loved you, that you also love one another." (John 13:34)

Jesus combined the commandment to love God with all our heart, soul, mind and strength (Deuteronomy 6:4-5) with the commandment from Leviticus 19:18 — "You shall love your neighbor as yourself."—to provide us with a summary of all the law and prophets.

To receive the full impact of this commandment, we must associate it with the New Covenant idea of Jeremiah—"I will write it upon their hearts"—and with the insights of spiritual and ethical inwardness so often and so fully expressed in the teachings of Jesus. This internalizing of principle and commitment leads into the place of motive and becomes an active ingredient in the dynamics of behavior and personality. Love, so conceived, becomes more than law, and is a deep and powerful principle controlling all we are and do.



Sermon Preview:

"THE GOOD SAMARITAN IN DISREPUTE"

The parables of Jesus are peopled with interesting personalities, known to us not by names but by primary characteristics. The best known of all these is the Good Samaritan, and his parable is probably most often told and referred to.

But in these days the Good Samaritan has come upon some disrepute, and is no longer emulated so easily as in former and simpler times. One explanation for this is the widespread tendency to non-involvement prevailing among us. Nearly everyone has heard the shocking story of "38 Witnesses," and doubtless some of us know of episodes nearer home. Another explanation is our increasing dependence upon professional Good Samaritans, functionaries who dispense public charity, social workers, and case minded government agents.

If this trend prevails and deepens the Good Samaritan fades more and more into the background, we are steadily de-personalized, and Orwell's 1984 gets here ahead of schedule.

Somehow the Good Samaritan must make a comeback. The only way he can do this is to come alive in the hearts and minds of true followers of the Lord Jesus Christ, who gave him to us in the first place.
