Sermon Preview

"HOSPITALITY TO CHRIST"

The best time of the year for the Christian teacher and preacher is Advent. Most of the great themes and doctrines of essential Christianity are implicit in the form and substance of Advent. Among these are: the divine initiative; God's self-disclosure; Incarnation; Redemption.

The Service of Holy Communion is so rich in Christian content that it is the form of Christian Worship for all seasons. In no other is it more appropriate and meaningful than in Advent and at Christmas time. Its meaning is pointed up in the worship relationship of divine offer and human receptivity. The grace of God in Christ is offered through the bread and wine and the Communicant responds in faith by his "taking and eating." This shows forth his hospitality to Christ, which is deeply requisite to genuine Christian faith and experience.

As powerful as the symbolism is in this act of Communion, we must remind ourselves that the underlying reality, where offered grace and receptive faith combine to create dynamic covenant, is the essence of Christian Holy Communion.



Sermon Preview

"WORD OF GOD AND WORDS OF MEN"

One of the promising areas of renewal in the Church today is the widespread rediscovery of the Bible. This seems to be taking place throughout Christendom, in Roman Catholicism as well as in Protestantism. More than a century of strong critical study of the Bible has made available a far greater understanding of its origins and its teachings than we have ever had. New and better translations are appearing, Bible dictionaries and commentaries of high scholarship are being published, so that any diligent student, even without knowledge of Hebrew and Greek, can acquire a good store of Biblical knowledge.

The sermon time this Sunday will be given over to a discussion of our heritage in the English Bible, from the Reformation to our time. Copies of two pre-King James Bibles, a Geneva Bible and a Bishop's Bible, will be on exhibit. Also a modern reprint of William Tyndale's New Testament of 1534 will be shown. The display will include copies of the American Standard, the Revised Standard Version, the New English Bible, several books of the new Anchor Bible, as well as many individually translated versions, such as Moffatt and Goodspeed.



Sermon Preview

"HEAVENLY DRAMA ON EARTHLY STAGES"

The central doctrine of Christianity is the Incarnation. It is precisely put forth in the Prologue of the Gospel of John in the words, "and the word was made flesh, and dwelt among us." Many other verses in the New Testament succinctly set forth this great idea, such as "God was in Christ, reconciling the world unto himself."

The gospel story from Advent to Pentecost may well be understood as an act of the grand drama of redemption, which is the real story of the Bible. We Christian people believe that the events in the life of our Lord, as well as his life and ministry as a whole, represent some truth about God's nature and will. We may think of the Advent as an episode in God's mighty act, hence as an earthly event with a heavenly significance.

Even while we are in the midst of Advent, and pre-occupied with one episode, we must not forget the whole act, nor even the whole drama. To fragment the gospel is to weaken or destroy it.

We have difficulty in remaining spectators at this drama. It has a message which concerns us; to view it with sincerity and interest is to become involved in its meaning and movement. Witnessing it becomes encounter and encounter becomes confrontation.

Sermon Preview=

"THOU SHALT CALL HIS NAME JESUS" (Matthew 1:21)

The Names of Jesus is the title of a very interesting study by an English New Testament scholar, Dr. Vincent Taylor. The number and range of the names, titles and designations of Our Lord in the New Testament are astonishing. Taking the Synoptic gospels alone—Matthew, Mark and Luke—we are able to discern a line of development as the story unfolds. Jesus came to mean more to his followers than they seem at first to have anticipated. Their growing appreciation of him progresses from "Rabbi" through "Prophet" to "Christ" and "Lord," with other titles in-between. The fact is that from the beginning his followers have had difficulty in finding a category which contains all that Jesus Christ meant to them. Some defended his humanity, some his divinity, and all together ended by proclaiming his full divinity and his full humanity, a combination which affirms his uniqueness. The richness of his person and ministry -his many faceted meaning for them-led them to the well known designation, "Jesus Christ, Son of God, Our Savior," The first letter of each Greek word in this combination title forms the acrotic ICHTHUS, which was the Greek word for fish. This explains the origin of and use of the fish as an early Christian symbol.
