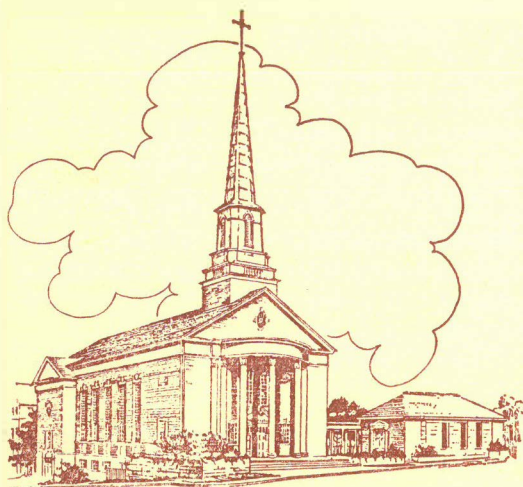

CHAPEL ORGAN DEDICATION AND RECITAL

This Sunday afternoon at three o'clock and at our five o'clock Vespers we will make a joyful music unto God as we dedicate our Chapel Organ and share in a recital played by our organist, Mrs. Walter James. Truly it will be a "joyful music" that will fill our hearts and lead us in our worshipful Chapel to a closer communion with God.

Perhaps it is significant that an instrument such as our Chapel Organ which can enrichen our lives and lift them above ourselves nearer to God, is given to our church in loving memory of a young man whose life did the same for his fellowman. CHURCH ATTENDANCE

January to Easter has been set aside as a time for special emphasis upon the importance of Church attendance. Bishop Henley wrote in the last issue of the *Florida Methodist*, "Too many of our people have the philosophy that going to church is something that we perform or neglect with impunity. As a matter of fact, habitual attendance upon the worship of God has proven itself to be a source of spiritual strength, inspiration, and insight. The family that neglects to participate in the gathered congregation each Sunday morning forfeits precious treasures of inspiration and experience. The home needs the Church. Children need to be accompanied by their parents to the house of worship. Ministers and officers of all our churches are called upon to summon their congregations to faithful and loyal attendance upon the worship of God."

During our Friendly Visitation we will encourage our people to be loyal to their promise to attend church. Attendances will be checked each Sunday and a chart made to indicate the church attendance habits of members and visitors. Please cooperate by signing an Attendance Registration Card each Sunday. The results of this study will be of great help to the Commission on Membership and Evangelism as they make plans for a greater Trinity Church.

FLORIDA CONFERENCE ORGANIZED IN TRINITY

The First Session of the Florida Annual Conference was held in Trinity on February 6, 1845, with Bishop Joshua Soule presiding. The new conference was organized into four districts: Quincy was a new district that included northwest Florida and south middle Georgia. It was a short-lived district, being dissolved in 1849. The St. Mary's District embraced southeast Georgia and northeast Florida. The Tallahassee District covered all of middle Florida and Georgia east of the Quincy District; this was the most prosperous part of the Conference. The Newnansville District was the largest, which extended from Georgia on the north, the Suwannee River was its northern bounds, to Key West on the south.

The final business of the Conference was to appoint the pastors. There were seven thousand members in thirty-six pastoral charges that were spread from Albany, Georgia, to Key West, a distance of six hundred miles and from Apalachicola to Brunswick, Georgia, approximately two hundred and fifty miles. Thirty-two men were available to fill the thirty-six pastoral appointments.

One hundred and twenty years ago yesterday, the organizational meeting of the Florida Annual Conference was held here at Trinity. Last June there were four hundred and seventy-four ministerial members and five hundred and eighty-five churches in The Florida Conference. These churches had 276,266 members and raised over twenty million dollars last year.

PLANS FOR A REVIVAL CHOIR

Enthusiastic music must always accompany a successful revival. As we look toward the first week in March and the revival to be held by the Methodist Churches of Tallahassee, we must make plans for a great choir to participate in each of the evening services. The choir will meet each evening one-half hour before service time and under Mr. James' leadership rehearse a well-known gospel hymn to be sung in the service as an anthem. Talent will not be a requisite for participation. All that will be required will be a heart full of joy and the desire to be of service. Make plans now to sing in the Revival Choir. We need seventy-five people, or more.

MINISTRY TO THE CUBAN PEOPLE

Our Communion offering today will go for the support of the Ministry to the Cuban people in our state. The Florida Conference provides an active ministry to our Cuban friends. This program is made possible by the contributions made by our people on the first Sunday in February. A budget of \$35,000 represents minimum needs. featuring

WILLIAM MacGOWAN

ON TUESDAY EVENING, FEBRUARY 16th, AT 8:00 P.M.

This Tuesday evening, we will hear a recital on our new 2,674 pipe organ by a native of Tallahassee who presently is the organist and choirmaster of All Saints Church (Episcopal) in Pasadena, California.

Mr. MacGowan is the son of Mr. and Mrs. W. Leroy MacGowan, 1561 Marion Avenue, and the nephew of Mrs. C. L. Hardwick and Mr. A. Bernard Byrd, 1520 Hickory Avenue; Mr. and Mrs. James D. Plant, 2008 East Forest Drive; Mr. and Mrs. Arthur L. West, 1101 Old Fort Drive, and Mr. and Mrs. Robert A. Taylor, 643 Beard Street, all of Tallahassee.

He has carried his talents to the far corners of the United States. As a concert organist he has generated wide-spread enthusiasm for his creative interpretation and ability. Born in Jacksonville, he has studied organ with Palmer Christian, Robert Baker, and Robert Noehren. He received his Master of Music degree at the University of Michigan and has held church positions in Michigan, North Carolina, and Massachusetts. Since 1962 he has been the Organist-Choirmaster at All Saints Church in Pasadena, where he directs all musical activities of the church. In 1963 he was appointed Staff Organist and Harpsichordist at the Berkshire Music Center, Tanglewood, summer home of the Boston Symphony Orchestra. There he taught in both the Listening and Analysis and Chamber Music departments.

For five years Mr. MacGowan was harpsichordist for the Boston Chamber Players of which he was a founding member. In addition to owning a three-stop, Flemish model harpsichord (Hubbard), he owns and performs on his five-stop portable positiv (Schlicker).

MacGowan is a member of both the Pasadena and Los Angeles Chapters of the American Guild of Organists, the Choral Conductors' Guild, and the Episcopal Diocese of Los Angeles Commission on Church Music. His recording premiere of Joseph Wagner's "Liturgy for Organ" was released by Dorian Records in February of 1964. The Canterbury Choir of All Saints Church, which he conducts, has been heard on CBS radio nation-wide, and was chosen to sing at the Kennedy Memorial Service, nationally televised from the Los Angeles Sports Arena.

Mr. MacGowan's program for the evening will include selections from the following composers: Diedrich Buxtehude, Giovanni Battista Pergolesi, Ernst Pepping, Johann Sebastian Bach, Samuel Sebastian Wesley, Cesar Franck, Felix Mendelssohn-Bartholdy, and Charles Tournemire.

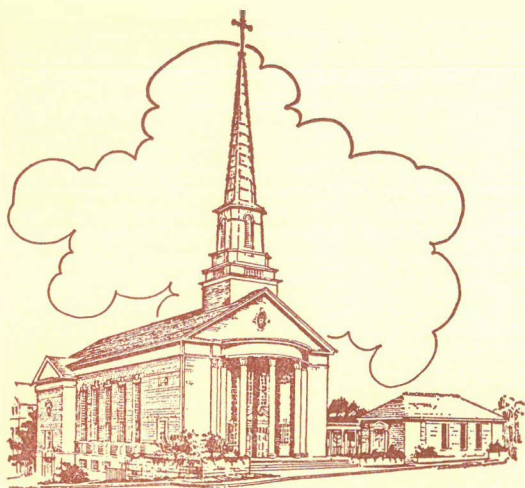

A MAN FOR OTHERS

Last month on January 14th, Albert Schweitzer celebrated this ninetieth birthday. Here is a man who injected into the world the serum of genuine feeling towards others, who knew that the greatest tragedy in human existence was that which dies within a man while yet he lives and breathes. To men who knew only hatred from the white skin, Dr. Schweitzer laid at their villages the love of Christ. He became the incarnation of this love. It was a faith in life and the reverence due it that gave rise to his thoughts and deliberations which guided him to the people at Lambaréné. In all of his life his thought has played an important part. As he once said, "The man who thinks stands up freer in the face of traditional religious truth than the man who does not." It was his thinking about God's love to man that caused him to act upon its invitation to love others as he was loved. How firmly he could say then: "the essential element in Christianity as it was preached by Jesus, and as it is comprehended by thought, is this, that it is only through love that we can attain to communion with God. All living knowledge of God rests upon this foundation: that we experience Him in our lives as Will-To-Love." It is this love that has placed Albert Schweitzer among the greatest of men. His greatness has been spoken of by many men throughout our time, but perhaps Norman Cousins in his book, *Dr. Schweitzer of Lambaréné*, states it most beautifully:

"It is not so much what he has done for others, but what others have done because of him and the power of his example. This is the measure of the man. What has come out of his life and thought is the kind of inspiration that can animate a generation. He has supplied a working demonstration of reverence for life. He represents enduring proof that we need not torment ourselves about the nature of human purpose. The scholar, he once wrote, must not live for science alone, nor the businessman for his business, nor the artist for his art. If affirmation for life is genuine, it will demand from all that they should sacrifice a portion of their own lives for others."

WHAT THE CHURCH EXISTS FOR

"The Church exists for those who never go near it." This quotation is attributed to the late William Temple, Archbishop of Canterbury, who was one of the most intelligent and competent churchmen of modern times. When he was elected moderator of New College Edinburgh, Dr. James S. Stewart quoted Bishop Temple's declaration. Dr. Stewart then added that "the real tragedy is when a church is quite content to leave the barricade at the frontiers and the line of demarcation intact, looking askance at those outwith its own spiritually like-minded family circle, and maintaining a mute, aloof, condemnatory *apartheid* from the secularism round its doors."

Both these prophets were calling the church back to the real purpose for her existence: *to proclaim and demonstrate to the world the good news of God's love revealed in Jesus Christ.* Commanded by her Lord to go into *all* the world she cannot be an *exclusive* organization but must be an *inclusive* fellowship. She is, therefore, best understood not as a club existing for the pleasure of her members, but as a movement created by God to serve His purposes. If the church in our day is to be such a movement her members must be "afame with faith." The good news means that there is offered to the world the power of the Resurrection, and to every member of the Body of Christ a share in that risen, supernatural life of Jesus which is the very life of God.

In a very real sense the church exists for burning and the flame of faith is the source of her power. This is why we all need a Revival. The flame of our faith needs to be rekindled and set ablaze. Then, "like brands plucked from the burning: we must go into the world to carry the light of God's love to those who will never come near us when we worship and work. Thus may we change hostility and indifference so that the world will listen to the church's Lord and join us in worshipping Him. It is my earnest prayer that this week of Revival and Spiritual Renewal will mark the beginning of a new day in the life of Trinity Church. We are called to be His witnesses and a flaming faith is essential to effective witnessing for our Christ. Let us *Pray*, *Witness* to others, and *Attend* the week of Spiritual Renewal that a Revival of faith may become possible.

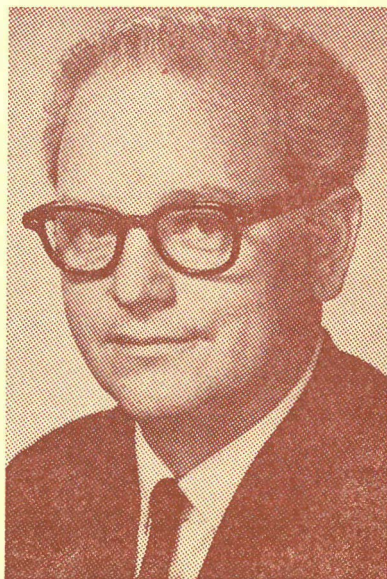


BISHOP PAUL V. GALLOWAY
