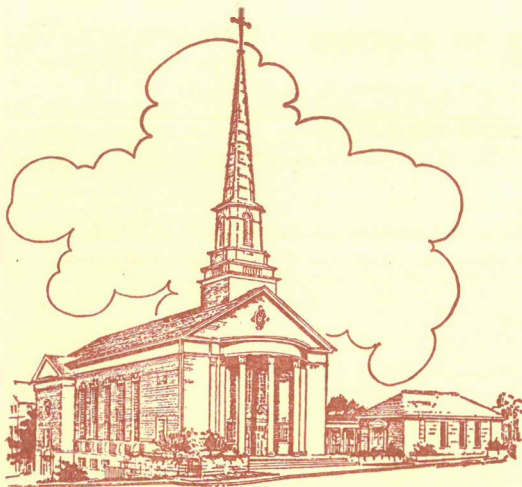

STATEMENT TO THE CONGREGATION

On Tuesday afternoon the Florida Annual Conference convened in the Branscomb Memorial Auditorium on the campus of Florida Southern College in Lakeland. Our Conference is now one of the larger and more vital Conferences in Methodism. Our missionary giving and evangelistic outreach are tops. We now have more than 285,000 members, 600 churches and 550 ministers. During the Annual Conference there are hours of inspiration and worship as well as long hours of reports, discussion and action. You will be welcome to attend any or all of the sessions.

In addition to presiding over the Annual Conference a Methodist Bishop is charged with the responsibility of appointing ministers to fill the pulpits of Methodist Churches. This he does with the aid and advice of the District Superintendents and the Pastoral Relations Committees of the local churches. This is a tremendous responsibility and one which is not taken lightly.

Several weeks ago the minister of one of our two largest churches died. This tragic event has made it necessary for several pastoral changes to be planned. After prayerful consideration Bishop Henley felt it might be necessary for your pulpit to be involved. He then consulted with your Pastoral Relations Committee. I am told that they were generous enough to request that I be reappointed as your minister. However, aware of the similar situation that confronted Trinity three years ago, they indicated that they felt you would understand if the Bishop and his Cabinet felt it absolutely necessary to involve your pulpit.

The appointments of ministers for the coming year will not be read until Sunday noon. But because of the unusual circumstances involved Bishop Henley has authorized the Pastoral Relations Committee and myself to make this statement to you. All of us, the Bishop, the District Superintendent, the Pastoral Relations Committee, the other churches involved and myself, regret that any change is necessary at this time. We would all prefer that it were some years hence. However, the vacancy caused by the death of Dr. John H. Hanger must be filled.

When the appointments are read I am to be moved to the First Methodist Church of Coral Gables. This is the second time in my ministry when I have moved feeling that my work was unfinished. The other time was three years ago when I left the Tampa District after only two years to come here. Again this move was made necessary by the death of your beloved pastor. Although the appointment to Trinity was neither sought nor expected, I gladly came and assumed the responsibility involved. It has proven to be one of the more thrilling experiences of my life. I shall always cherish the experience that has been mine in being permitted to serve as your minister during these years. They have been difficult but rewarding years. Your loyalty and devotion has been a constant source of inspiration to your ministers.

It is difficult to put into words the deep feelings of loss that Adelaide and I have at the thought of leaving you and this church. Here we seem to have everything that a minister longs and dreams and hopes for. Moreover, I sincerely believe that the Holy Spirit is at work in the life of this congregation. I am fully expecting a fresh birth of spiritual renewal and power to break forth soon. However, we go to our new work as we came to you, not having sought or expected the assignment. However, glad to be permitted to service and witness with another fine people. We covet your prayers and your abiding friendship. We shall never forget you and this lovely "house of God," and we shall be forever grateful that we were permitted to share these years with you.

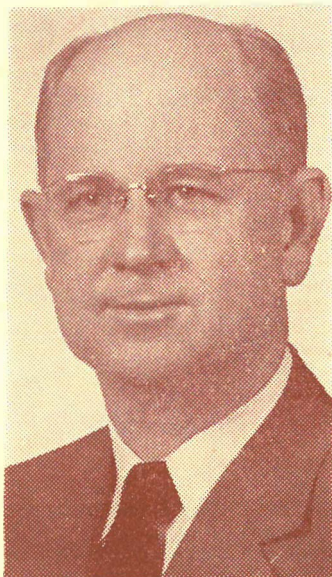

Dr. George A. Foster was appointed Sunday by Methodist Bishop James W. Henley to be the senior pastor at Trinity Methodist Church. Dr. Foster has been a member of the Florida Conference since 1932 and has served churches at Jacksonville, Pompano Beach, Sarasota, Ocala, Park Temple Church in Fort Lauderdale, Palma Ceia Church in Tampa, and has been a District Superintendent of the Miami District. Dr. Foster has also been very active in Conference activities, being a member of the Florida Conference Board of Education for sixteen years of which he was chairman for eleven years. He is presently a member of the Board of Trustees of Florida Southern College, the Conference Board of Pensions, and the Conference Planning Commission. He was a delegate to the General and Jurisdictional Conferences of 1960 and 1964 of the Methodist Church. Because of his interest in education and his outstanding ability, he is a frequent speaker at youth assemblies and other Conference gatherings. Dr. Foster is also active in community activities, being a member of the Rotarian and taking part as member and chairman of various Library Board of Directors and as a member of the Broward County Mental Hygiene Clinic and of the Broward County Welfare Council.

Dr. Foster was born in Andalusia, Alabama. He received his public school education in Florida being a graduate of Walton High School. He received his AB degree from the University of Florida, his Bachelor of Divinity degree from Duke Divinity School and has received a Doctor of Divinity degree from Florida Southern College. He has also studied at Union Theological Seminary in New York and at Mansfield College, Oxford University.

Mrs. Foster is a native of Tennessee and a graduate of Peabody College and of Scarritt College for Christian Workers with a Master's Degree, a major in Bible Studies. She was a missionary to Brazil from 1930 to 1933. The Fosters have one daughter, Miss Julia Foster, who is a graduate of Duke Woman's College and is presently a candidate for her PhD in Biblical Studies at Boston University School of Theology.
