"ONE WITNESS IN ONE WORLD"

"We are called under God to the achievement of greater oneness." With these words the General Conference of the Methodist Church launched its Quadrennial Program of analyzing the Church and its witness in the world. The theme "One Witness in One World" directs our attention to our own local church, the unity or oneness that we share with each other and with the church, and the witness which we make in our city. To help us in this task of self-evaluation and appraisal our preaching emphasis and study group opportunities for the next six weeks will be centered on this task.

All of you are asked to participate in this emphasis by reading THE LETTER TO THE EPHESIANS. There are six chapters—this is only one chapter a week for the next six weeks. Both the morning and evening sermons will be drawn from this letter. It is here that we discover the Quadrennial emphasis: In Christ we find reunion and oneness and in His church is given this expression to the world.

Beginning May 10 there will be offered *Three* study group opportunities using the book especially prepared by Bishop Roy H. Short for the Quadrennial study, entitled "One Witness in One World." These books are available now at the church office for those interested. These groups are scheduled to meet Monday morning at 7:00 A.M. (breakfast); Sunday evening, 6:15 P.M.; and Wednesday evening, 7:30 P.M. Please note your choice on the Registration Cards Sunday or phone the church office before May 5.

No greater opportunity can be given to us as a church than to use these next six weeks to take a hard look at ourselves. We are called to oneness with each other and with God. The fourth chapter of Ephesians reminds us:

"You all belong to one body, of which there is one Spirit, just as you all experienced one calling to one hope. There is one Lord, one faith, one baptism, one God, one Father of us all, who is the one over all, the one working through all and the one living in all."



SOME SILLY ASSUMPTIONS

Have you heard that today's teen-agers are much worse than their counterparts of a generation ago? I have heard of sixty specialists in St. Louis who claim this. It is a silly assumption; it is ridiculous for us to claim that teen-agers are infinitely worse. We can't measure the differences anyway. Given the same social conditions that now maintain, your generation or mine would not have been any better. The statement that youngsters are much worse than they use to be is based on two things: a bad memory and an incapacity for seeing the situation as it is.

Many people who do not have teen-age children assume that all teen-agers are involved in all the bad things we read about. This is a silly assumption, too, and is the same kind of stereotyping, of false categorization, that occurs in racism, or in prejudice against some ethnic group, or against particular types such as airmen, or university students, or on and on you might go.

A third silly assumption appears when we assume that the answer to all teen-age problems is really simple: If the parents know where the teen-agers are, and if the kids have to work, the whole thing will be fixed.

If it appears that teen-agers are worse, it could be because the surrounding cultural situation is much more shallow. . . . Not all the truble that has been reported is juvenile anyhow, unless you raise the age bracket of what you call juvenile.
