## Sermon Preview

#### COMMUNION MEDITATION—

#### "THE FOOD OF THE SOUL"

It has been inevitable that we should understand and interpret the reality of our souls through analogies with the body. Thus in the Bible the health, hunger and satisfaction of the soul are often spoken of. A good sample from the Old Testament is Psalm 107:9: "For he satisfieth the longing soul, and filleth the hungry soul with goodness." The New Testament has more examples, such as, "Blessed are they which do hunger and thirst after righteousness, for they shall be filled."

The Gospel of John does not have a story of the establishment of the Lord's Supper as do the other three gospels. In its sixth chapter, however, is the story of the feeding of the multitude followed by a strong and interesting sequel in which Jesus interprets himself as "the bread of life." One central saying is verse 35: "I am the bread of life; he who comes to me shall not hunger, and he who believes in me shall never thirst."

The Communion Meditation for this Sunday will be based upon the thought of the appetites of our souls with special use of the sayings of our Lord in John 6.



## Sermon Preview

#### "FINDING OUR IDENTITY IN CHRIST"

One of the enrichments of Christian faith obtainable from the writings of St. Paul is the idea of the "Indwelling Christ," designated by Albert Schweitzer as "Christ-Mysticism." The simplest statement of the concept is in Galatians 2:20: "I have been crucified with Christ; it is no longer I who live, but Christ who lives in me."

The real question the modern Christian asks is whether or not the designation represents a reproducible substance for Christian experience. Is this something which can happen to us? Or is it a peculiar way of describing a mystical experience limited to religious geniuses or saints?

Apparently the Apostle believed that it is a substantive reproducible experience available to all faithful followers of Christ. He wrote to the Ephesians to say that he was praying for them "that Christ may dwell in your hearts by faith" (Ephesians 3:16). He also wrote to the Corinthians to say, "Do you not realize that Jesus Christ is in you?" (II Corinthians 13:5).

This sermon will seek first to set forth the idea of the "Indwelling Christ"; second, to defend the possibility of our knowing the reality, and, third, to give it a place in our larger Christian experience.



## =Sermon Preview =

# "OUR IDENTIFICATION AND INVOLVEMENT IN THE CHURCH"

When the Apostle Paul characterized the Church as the "Body of Christ," he gave us an insight into the nature and function of the Church which has intrigued Bible students and theologians through the centuries. More recently theologians involved in the Ecumenical Movement have sought to recover and develop a theology of the Church. This Pauline doctrine of the Church remains central in their thinking.

As in most approaches toward interpreting a doctrine there are those who take a "high" way and those who follow a "low" road. The former consider that the Church as the Body of Christ may be regarded as an "extension of the incarnation," whereas the latter insist that the phrase Body of Christ is only an illuminating metaphor. Whichever way we go, we will follow St. Paul in allowing the Church a high place in our personal beliefs and commitment.

The Apostle writes that we severally take our places of privilege and responsibility as members of this Body. He writes that we are "members in particular." This suggested particularity of our involvement brings us to the heart of the meaning of Church membership.
