### COMMUNION MEDITATION — "THE BREADTH OF THE CROSS"

For twenty centuries men have looked at the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ. Some have looked with scorn or even indifference, though most have looked with wondering reverence. Christian thinkers have pondered its meaning and many are the wondrous facets of truth they have discovered. To some it has been God's redemption of sin enslaved humanity, to others the influence of one who died, not for good men only, but for all men including the most evil.

Today, using some words from the Ephesian Letter of Paul, I want us to ponder the extent of the outreach of the cross, to see that it has meaning as the sign of God's seeking love to every human being who has ever lived, lives now, or ever shall live. Perhaps we shall even see that if there are beings with personality on other planets, lost among the stars, even for them, the cross of Christ is important.


### YOUTH CENTER NOW OPEN

### Sermon Preview:

### "A PART OF LIFE, OR A WAY OF LIFE!"

We are living in a turbulent world! We are caught in the struggle with inevitable change.

J. Edward Carothers says, "Today is flooded with the necessity for making decisions we never dreamed we would have to make. . . . A major religious problem of our time is the inability of people to understand conditions as the future pours in upon us. . . . The pouring in of the future cannot be stopped, wished away, argued away, or ignored."

In the midst of rapid and revolutionary changes, a spirit of widespread anxiety prevails. The basic reason for our anxiety centers in this question: "Which way will the scales tip — for better or for worse?" All of us need to seriously ask ourselves some very very searching questions: Are we a part of the problem, or a part of the answer? Is our Christian religion genuine? Is our religion merely a part of life, or is it a way of life?

The Apostle Paul, in his letter to the Romans, chapter 12, strongly expresses the conviction that every Christian has a responsibility to put his weight on the side of that which is right—that which is the will of God! "Be not overcome of evil, but overcome evil with good!"



### "AWKWARD AND ALIVE"

Several years ago, at a theological lecture, I heard a prayer quoted in which the smoothness, mechanical precision, regularity, and formality of the church was deplored, and God was petitioned to make us once more "awkward and alive."

Now frankly I have never yet found a church that was so icy and precise that there was never any sense of things being out of synchronization. On the contrary, I find that churches invariably experience an unsettled feeling, as if we were never quite through getting everything just right.

What I hope to share with you in this sermon is my conviction that it is the continual presence of the Holy Spirit in the church which keeps us a bit off balance, so that we are constantly in action, at work on the unfinished task of following where He leads, in other works, "awkward and alive."

### PROMOTION DAY


Next Sunday, August 28, is Promotion Day in the two children's divisions of the Church School. Children will receive details in the mail during the coming week.

### "SELF-ACCEPTANCE A PRELUDE TO SELF-EXPRESSION"

St. Paul's statement "What I would, that do I not; but what I hate, that do I" describes the common feeling of frustration because of the wide gap between our goals and our accomplishments. Another kind of frustration comes when the goals we do reach fail to bring the satisfaction we expected. For all the encouragement our society gives to "activity and self-expression" something seems to be missing.

"Self-acceptance a Prelude to Self-expression" attacks this problem on the basis that "an individual's estimate of himself is the basis of satisfactory living." The Christian concept of man as a child of God is the frame of reference in which we are encouraged to begin this estimate of self.

When life seems to be going to pieces, or one has "hit bottom," the external superficial supports give way. It is the inner support, man's "self-acceptance" which holds him together. How one may work toward this self-acceptance, and strengthen this inner support is the purpose of the morning message.
