## Sermon Previews

# COMMUNION MEDITATION — "DIVINE PRESENCE AND DIVINE POWER"

The Christian doctrine of the Trinity is not so much the result of theology or even of logic as it is the explanation of the threefold experience which early Christian people knew. As good Jews they believed in God as Creator, the God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob, and now as followers of Jesus they understood God as Father.

Added to this was the tremendous impression Jesus had made upon them. He was an unusual person, extraordinary in his appeal, and overwhelming in personal presence and power. He broke through old categories and defied explanations of common sense and philosophy. They came to see uniqueness in him, and thereby discerned dimensions of the divine. They called him Lord, and felt that in him God was speaking to them.

When he went away they still felt a Presence and a Power, and remembered his promises of both. On Pentecost they were deeply possessed by this heaven-sent power. The fulness of the gospel was upon them and they were new men in Christ.

The philosophers and theologians refined this difficult concept of Three-in-One, but its reality was—and is—in the experience of true believers.



## WELCOME TO NEW ASSOCIATE MINISTER



## Sermon Preview=

## "EVERYTHING NAILED DOWN IS COMING LOOSE"

The sermon title is a line spoken by the angel Gabriel in Marc Connelly's folk play *Green Pastures* when he looks down from heaven upon the turmoil and confusion on earth. More recently it is the title of an excellent lay sermon appearing in the *Saturday Review*. The setting of *Green Pastures* is in ancient Biblical history; it was written and produced first in the 1930's, depression time in our country. Both times it appeared that everything nailed down was indeed coming loose.

The present times make this still a very good line for the thoughtful observer. But the Christian participant in contemporary turmoil and confusion doesn't give up to it. His faith is stabilizing, creative and redeeming, and he goes forward to make his redemptive thrust. The Bible provides much support and many texts. One of the best is from Job, who, when about him and his family everything nailed down was coming loose, bravely affirmed "My righteousness I hold fast, and will not let it go." (Job 27:6)

The sermon seeks encouragement in Christian faith and in observation through Christian eyes of our present human situation. It will seek to lead to the conclusion that after all is said and done, some things nailed down are not coming loose.


## MUSIC NOTE
