#### Welcome to Lacours

We welcome to our Church this week Dr. and Mrs. Lawrence L. Lacour. They will be with us to lead in our United Methodist Mission through Sunday evening, May 8.

Dr. Lacour is Director of the Department of Preaching Evangelism of the General Board of Evangelism of the Methodist Church with headquarters in Nashville, Tennessee. He is a B. D. graduate of Drew Theological Seminary, and has earned the M. A. and Ph. D. from Northwestern University in the field of speech. He has preached in evangelistic missions in many countries, including a special mission to Japan. Since 1957 he has been on the administrative staff of the General Board of Evangelism.

Mrs. Lacour, who will share extensively in the Mission, is an accomplished harpist and also is trained in the field of guidance and counseling, having earned the M. A. at Northwestern in this area. She will serve as harpist in all services, and will give a series of lectures especially for women each week day morning.

We will have a special opportunity to greet Dr. and Mrs. Lacour at a reception in Fellowship Hall following the Evening Service this Sunday. Pastors and wives of other Methodist Churches of the city will be in the receiving line.



### Sermon Preview

#### "DEEPER DIMENSIONS OF FELLOWSHIP"

There are two levels of Christian fellowship which are important for the life of the Church. The more superficial is that of the Fellowship Supper where we join in warm human congeniality with those socially acceptable to us and enjoy ourselves. The deeper level is that of our common brotherhood in Christ, our real togetherness in the Holy Spirit, which the New Testament calls *koinonia*. We may quickly characterize these two levels respectively as the fellowship of the Covered Dish Supper and the fellowship of the Lord's Supper. Unfortunately the former has largely pre-empted the concept and practice of fellowship among modern Christians, and we are found playing together more often than we are found praying together.

The pressures of contemporary culture demand a more distinctive identity of us as Christian. We are becoming slowly once again a self-conscious minority in a secular culture. We are being forced into a recognition of our need for each other. There is a discernible realization among thoughtful people throughout Christendom that the return of a genuine *koinonia* is a prime requisite for our becoming God's Saving Remnant for His Kingdom.



### Sermon Preview

#### "THE ACHIEVEMENT OF TOGETHERNESS"

We must recognize that there were divisive forces in Christianity from the very beginning, even among the Apostles who disputed among themselves as to who should be the greatest. The church at Corinth developed cliques within its fellowship, and some were "of Apollos," some "of Paul," and some "of Cephas." Paul in his letter asked the definitive question, "Is Christ divided?" Our Lord prayed for the oneness of his people and taught them always to love one another.

These contrary forces have continued across the centuries and are with us still, creating many divisions among us, and even within denominations producing divers stresses and strains. We cannot reasonably expect all liberals and conservatives within the Church to become moderates and thereby achieve a degree of unity. If there is to be any realization of togetherness it seems that it must come through mutual respect, Christian love, and loyalty to Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior.

Some greater realization of togetherness seems to be a condition for the Divine Presence and for Pentecostal Power.



#### Sermon Previews

#### "FILLED WITH NEW WINE"

When the Holy Spirit came upon the disciples it so filled them with love and understanding and a sense of their mission as disciples of Christ, that the crowd which gathered around mocked them and said, "They are filled with new wine."

There is still a need for such "Christ intoxicated" disciples today as the church faces its mission to the world. Those of us who assume such responsibility find ourselves at the beginning of a new church year asking the same question that troubled the early followers of Jesus: "Lord will you at this time restore the kingdom to Israel?"

At Pentecost we find the answer that found the early disciples of Jesus. After His death and resurrection they prepared for their mission in "trustful expectancy" since He had assured them that the Counselor, the Guide would come to "lead them in the way of truth." While they were thus preparing and in prayer, the presence of Christ, the Holy Spirit, came upon them with such power that they caught on fire with the impact, understanding now what the "Good News" really was, and what their part in witnessing to it involved. They were to be disciples unto all the earth, preaching, teaching, healing, and loving as they were loved.

The results of being filled with this new wine were many. Great deeds of love and service were shown. All believers were united together as one; each treated the other as brother; they shared in the deeper dimensions of fellowship and frequently were together. With glad and generous hearts they were always "praising God and having favor with all people."

The sermon will concern itself with the question of "Is now the time...?"; with the answer of Pentecost; and with the result of transformed lives. Are we the kinds of human skins into which God's new wine can be poured? "No one puts new wine into old wineskins; if he does, the wine will burst the skins, and the wine is lost, and so are the skins; but new wine is for fresh skins."
