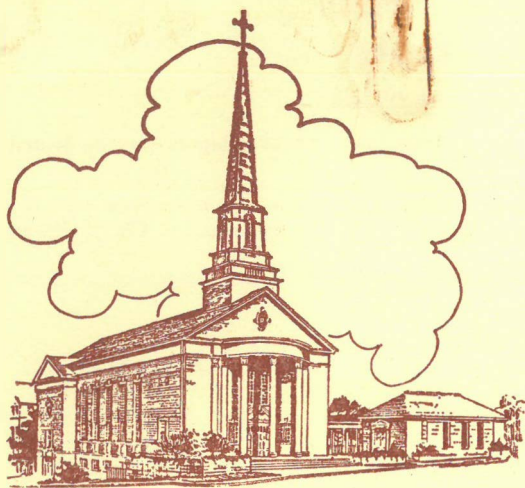

Sermon Preview

"THE BIBLICAL IMAGE OF MAN"

*"What is man that thou art mindful of him? Or
the son of man that thou visitest him?" Psalm 8:4*

This verse from Psalm 8 will provide a starter for our looking into the Bible to see if we may discern the image of man projected there. The first question is not so much a philosophical inquiry as it is a poetic expression of religious wonder. Also we may note within the poetic interrogative, the beginning of a great answer, "That thou art mindful of him?" "That thou visitest him?"

After looking briefly at some non-Biblical images of man, we can begin with the Psalmist's own startling declaration that man is to be understood in relationship to God. The Bible regards man from the Godward point of view. Two observations follow from this: Man is a creature, though a creature of high estate, in the image of God; man is a sinner, beginning his sin in an act of disobedience by which he seeks to become his own God and Saviour.

The second general line of development is that man is seen in relationship to other men. The story of Cain and Abel, appearing very early in the story, sets up the context and begins the consideration. Thus man begins his sinning against God, and continues it against man. As the great drama moves on these are intertwined and sin against man is recognized as sin against God. Thus man's ethical thought and life are from the beginning theologically based. Man is, in the Biblical view, a theological being.

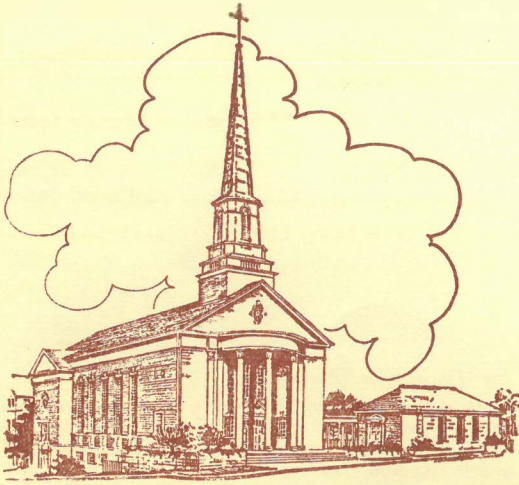

Sermon Preview

"CHRISTIAN WAYS TO PERSONAL IDENTITY"

*"So you are Simon the son of John? You
shall be called Cephas." John 1:42*

We answer too quickly the question, "Who are you?" We resort to devices of identification, such as names, tags and buttons, and thus come up with a superficial answer. Even when we include race, nationality, vocation and assorted affiliations, we may be still at surface level.

Steps toward deeper self-identity are made when we seek to answer the question, "What are you?" We probe still more deeply when we think on the inquiry, "Why are you?" When we ponder these great questions, we are entering at least the realm of philosophy, and for some of us the promising land of personal religion.

The experience of becoming a Christian and growing in Christian life and thought leads us to answers to all of these searching questions. This sermon will seek to demonstrate this working out of Christian life.

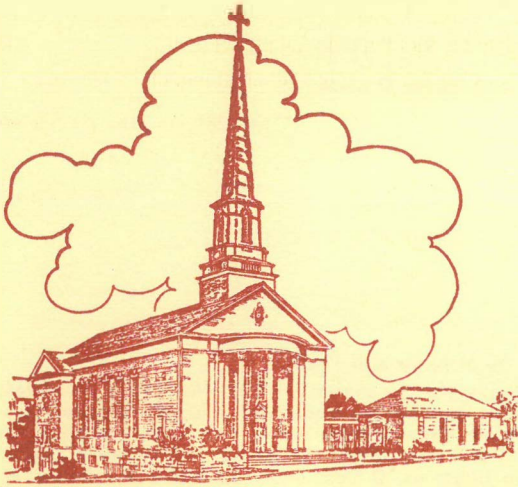

Sermon Preview

"LET HEAVEN BEGIN HERE"

*"Thy Kingdom come, thy will be done, on
earth as it is in heaven." Matthew 6:10*

This great petition of our Lord's Prayer loses its tremendous import through familiarity and easy repetition. If we could see it, or hear, or say it as if for the first time, we might realize its weight and significance.

One realization which will sharpen its impact upon a praying Christian, is the degree of commitment implied in the request. First of all, one must recognize, is that one is praying for the will of God to be done in one's own life. This is radical, demanding, and sweeping.

Jesus came preaching, announcing the imminence of the Kingdom of Heaven and inviting men to enter it by way of repentance. He spoke much of this kingdom, making it the central theme of his teaching.

To what extent may a genuine Christian realize the fact of this Kingdom in his own life? The sermon will speak to this great and central question.

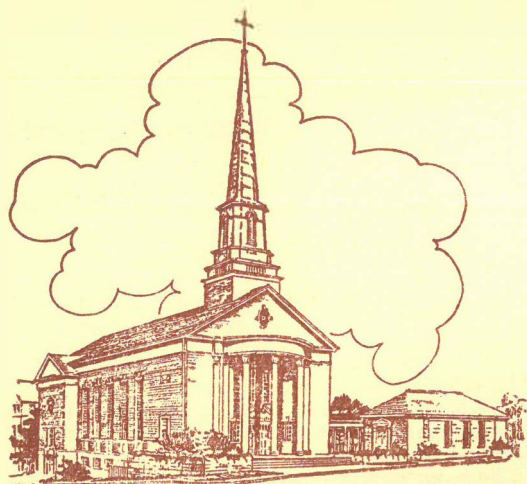

Sermon Preview

"A LAW OF SPIRITUAL GROWTH"

"For to him who has will more be given, and he will have abundance; but from him who has not, even what he has will be taken away." Matthew 13:12

This saying of Jesus is troublesome for many Christian people. Its difficulty for us is compounded when we read it out of its context and especially when we interpret it materially.

Its context is the Parable of the Sower, where Jesus is talking about spiritual receptivity and growth. This verse is a generalization of what he has been saying, and may be understood as a law of spiritual growth.

To realize its operation in our lives, we must see spiritual experience as dynamic and not static, as process and not position. The negative operation of the law is seen in theological reductionism, where the end result is scantiness in belief, or in devotional neglect whereby spiritual awareness is dulled or is altogether lost.

Its positive operation is by the principle of the accumulative, as in compound interest, or as in the assimilation of new knowledge by the already knowledgeable person.

Following an exposition of the text along these lines the preacher will suggest some particular ways of spiritual growth.
