Sermon Preview

COMMUNION MEDITATION, "EVEN SO, COME, LORD JESUS"

It is fitting that we observe the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper on the First Sunday in Advent. The prerequisite for a genuine experience of Communion is a deep openness to the presence of God. The appropriate response of the Christian to the approach of Advent is one of anticipation and openness. The posture of kneeling is indicative of our prayerful attitude. When we "take and eat" the bread and wine, we are showing the outward form and act of receiving the Living Lord into our lives.

Except for a benediction, the very last words in our Bible are, "Even So, Come, Lord Jesus." (Revelation 22:20) They form a concise and well focused pattern for both our recipiency to Holy Community and to Advent.

Advent lies at the center of Christian belief. It represents the divine initiative, God seeking man, eternity breaking into time. The Christ event of history represents to us in dramatic ways the continuing redemptive act of God. Those who emphasize the once-for-all Jesus of history and those who emphasize the Second Coming of Christ both miss the primary point of Advent: that God is forever and always coming to us and claiming us for Himself.

Sermon Preview

UNIVERSAL BIBLE SUNDAY "THE BIBLE VIEW OF LIFE"

The masses are no longer Biblically oriented, even in the simplest and most general sense. A deadening blanket of secularism has descended upon us, and many now live in a one story thought world. The time is past due when we must affirm deeply and strongly before the world the Biblical world view. This Universal Bible Sunday is certainly an occasion for this affirmation.

Three general summary observations about Bible views may prove helpful to us. The Biblical view of God is best expressed in the word theistic. As contrasted with the deistic view, which believes in an originally creative but absentee God, this view conceives of God as creative and redemptive. He is Lord of both nature and history. The Bible view of man is that he is creature and subject to his Creator, though given an antonomy which allows him the freedom of choice, even in the acknowledgement of his creaturehood. In refusing this acknowledgement man moves into self-idolatry, and thus becomes estranged from his Creator.

How God and man may become reconciled is the real story of the Bible. The redeeming love of God is its central theme. Our reconciliation is our salvation. In his love we are redeemed.



Sermon Previews

"HE COMETH TO JUDGE THE EARTH"

"For he cometh to judge the earth." Psalm 96:13 "And Jesus said, For judgment am I come into the world." John 9:39

Although to some it will seem out of character for us to cast Jesus in the role of judge, even a casual reading of the gospels will show that he is often set over against his hearers, and both directly and indirectly is in judgment of them. On some occasions his very presence is judgment. In many personal encounters, he speaks his judgment.

In the rich meanings of Advent God's righteous judgment upon the earth is one of theological substance. This is especially true when we see the Christ event as climactic in the great drama of the divine redemption. Placing the two brief texts above side by side one from the Old Testament and one from the New Testament, points up this larger context.

The relationship between judgment and redemption is very close both in a psychological and theological sense. Their juxtaposition in scripture episode and observation is frequent. Even in matters of health, body and mind, submission to judgment is prerequisite to therapy. The very same principle operates in the area of spiritual health and well-being.

Sermon Preview=

"THE GREAT CONDESCENSION"

This sermon will be based upon the great *Kenosis* passage from St. Paul's Letter to the Philippians, 2:5-11. Here Christ is represented as not grasping at equality with God, but as "emptying himself, taking the form of a servant, being born in the likeness of men." And even when in the likeness of men, he continues his self-humiliation by becoming "obedient unto death, even death on a cross." Intrinsic to the idea of incarnation is this further idea of divine self-emptying. The continuing operation of the *Kenosis* principle in the life and ministry of our Lord serves to explain and support the idea as basic.

This sermon will seek to derive a working principle for the Church and for the Christian from the concept of *Kenosis*. A great question today for us is whether or not we shall seek glory—called success—or whether or not we shall move to our life and task with uncalculating meekness, to empty ourselves of self and to become instruments of God's doing, to lose ourselves for his sake and the Kingdom's prosperity.



Sermon Preview=

"THE PRIMACY OF GOD IN RELIGIOUS THOUGHT AND EXPERIENCE"

Surely one of the strangest aberrations of current so-called "radical theology" is that we can have religion without God. To the unsophisticated common sense of the average Christian this is ridiculous. Common sense gets strong support from comparative religion where it learns that such claims are not new. It also learns from historical theology that such aberrations are not so "radical" after all.

How can one even define religion without God? Many have tried, one well known attempt being to designate it as "morality touched with emotion." But these sorties seem to satisfy only the makers, and leave us without robust substance. They certainly fall short of the great opening words of Scripture, "In the beginning, God," and of the majestic, "I am that I am."

This primacy of God is strongly manifest in our religious experience and life. Religion is real in its relationship between persons, man and God. All our larger understandings of this relationship, estrangement, judgment, redemption, reconciliation, require two antonomous and acting persons.

The idea of ethics without theology, of goodness without God, appeals to some. But for our Biblically oriented minds, the righteousness of God is basic to our righteousness, and the taproot of our ethical value system is essentially theological.
