"400th ANNIVERSARY OF CHRISTIANITY IN THE PHILIPPINES"

Four centuries ago Christianity was brought to the Philippines by missionaries who came with the Spanish conquistadores.

Last year Christians in the Philippines, Roman Catholics and Protestants, observed the anniversary. "Although the founding Protestant missionaries came to the Philippines at the end of the nineteenth century, Protestants share to a great extent in the Christian heritage and the blessing of having had 400 years of missionary activity in the Philippines," stated Dr. Enrique Sobrepena, General Secretary of the United Church of Christ in the Philippines.

Sermon Preview

"CALL TO CONTEMPLATION"

The sermon for this Sunday is the first in a series of six Lenten messages under the general title "God Calls His People." Other sermons in the series will be: "Call to Concern," "Call to Churchmanship," "Call to Commitment," "Call to the Cross," and "Call to Conquest." These sermons will serve not only as appropriate to the Lenten season, but also as supporting our participation in the Venture in Faith program now going on throughout our Conference.

This sermon title may suggest contemplative prayer or prayerful contemplation. While both of these are worthy of our attention, it is the latter which is the theme of the sermon.

These are times of unsettlement in the minds of men. Old categories are broken up, old values are discarded, and many are floundering in moral and spiritual confusion. Sermon Preview

"CALL TO CARE AND CONCERN"

The sermon for this Sunday is the second in a series on "God's Call to Us" being presented during Lent. Others in the series will be "Call to Churchmanship," "Call to Commitment," "Call to the Cross," and "Call to Conquest."

This sermon will emphasize the Christian call, so deep and extensive in our Lord's teachings and doings, for a sensitivity to the needs and sufferings of others. The meanest opposite of love is not so much hatred as indifference, as expressed in the frequently used cliché, "I couldn't care less." The word we translate *love* in our New Testament is *agape*, which became *caritas* in the Latin versions, and thus *charity* in I Corinthians 13 in the King James Version. All of these words illuminate the original concept for us. Perhaps the simple word *care* will serve us best for the theme of this sermon.

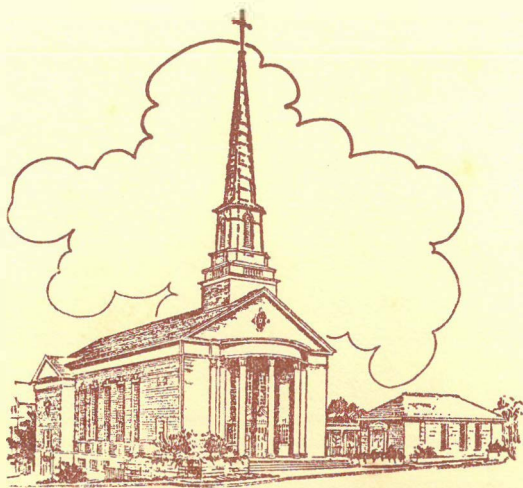

"CALL TO CHURCHMANSHIP"

"Now you are the body of Christ and individually members of it." I Corinthians 12:27

When a concerned churchman looks at the Church and at its place and influence in the contemporary world scene, he finds both negative and positive elements in some abundance. He may go either way in his expectation of the future, into discouragement or into hopefulness.

Much criticism is directed at the Church in these days. Most of this centers around the claim that it is no longer relevant to mankind's situation and greater needs. We who are its adherents are said to sit in our comfortable pews and mouth smooth cliches while the world of man bleeds and dies. It is most interesting that much of this criticism comes from within the Church.

And therein lies our most promising positive factor. The institution which does not allow self-evaluation and criticism is asking for its death. But if vital self-criticism is actually encouraged, and even engendered by controlling philosophies, an institution is renewable and has the potential of becoming vital and influential again.
