COMMUNION MEDITATION "THE RENEWAL OF COVENANT"

The coincidence of New Year's Day with Sunday and with our regular First Sunday Celebration of the Lord's Supper strongly suggests and almost demands that our thoughts and feelings at Communion gather around the need and act of renewing our basic Christian covenant.

Sermon Preview

"THE MANAGEMENT OF LIFE"

"For I have learned in whatsoever state I am therewith to be content . . . I know both how to be abased, and I know how to abound . . . I can do all things through Christ which strengthened me." Phil. 4:11, 12, 13

All of us are confronted with the challenge of managing our lives. Some respond not at all and let life run on into messy shallows. Some make firm resolutions and seek to build on selected bits of wisdom, such as may be found in old proverbs. Some give up and finally turn themselves over to the psychiatrist. The most frequent error in our human response is that we don't dig deeply enough to get real meaning and pray deeply enough to make real commitment.

St. Paul tells us about his personal response in this great text in Philippians. He is testifying to an achievement of faith, a strengthening by grace. The text easily yields the sermon outline.

Epiphany is the Greek word meaning "manifestation," and refers particularly to the showing forth of the Christ child to the Gentiles, represented by the magi.

The liturgical colors used on the altar and vestments worn designate the season of the church year. White is the color of joy, of Thanksgiving and of victory, and is used at Christmas, Easter and Ascensiontide and a few special days such as the Epiphany, the Transfiguration, Trinity Sunday and All Samts Day.

CONFIRMATION CLASSES

The Annual Confirmation Class for Sixth Grade boys and girls will begin on Sunday, January 22nd. The class will meet at 5:00 P.M. each Sunday in a room to be designated. Sermon Preview

"IN SEARCH OF MORAL AUTHORITY"

Today we are in the midst of deep disturbance in morals. Old values are being questioned, and new values are slow to come. Some are presuming to live on a scant value diet, and many are floundering without firm direction.

To some this revolution in morals is a sanction to libertinism; for them the breaking down of fences simply gives broader pastures in which to roam. To others the present ferment is opportunity for reformation and renewal.

The Christian, of course, is in the second group. He brings to his time the great resources of his tradition and faith and is prepared to enter the arena of discussion. He knows that his Bible majors in ethics and human relations throughout its course and content. This is his field, and he does not propose to abandon it wholly to other approaches. Although, when he is an intelligent Christian, he is willing to incorporate the insights of psychology and sociology into his thinking.

This sermon will attempt to find the essential place and nature of moral authority.

-Sermon Preview

"ALL ONE BODY WE!"

The period of January 18-25, which includes this Sunday, has been set up as "A Week of Prayer for Christian Unity." Most of us are willing to pray for the oneness of God's people, even as did our Lord. But we are so far from realizing answers to our prayers, and the problems of bringing us together are very great and baffling. Many Church leaders throughout the world, however, deeply believe that God is moving among his people to bring them together.

A new word has come into our Christian vocabulary and is gradually gaining in usage. *Ecumenism*, and its derivatives *ecumenical*, *ecumenicity*, etc., comes directly from a Greek word meaning the whole household and family of God. It is roughly synonymous with catholic. The word *universal* is also nearly synonymous, but is reductive of the deeper meaning intended, suggesting spread but not depth.

This sermon will be an effort to introduce us to thought and concern on this great subject, and to encourage prayer out of deep faith for a genuine oneness of all God's people.

"WORLD NEED AND CHRISTIAN RESPONSE"

"We know that we are the children of God, and the whole world lieth in wickedness." I John 5:19

The two statements of this text seem quite incongruous, and a reader's first reaction is to be slightly startled that they are together in one verse of scripture. On second thought, we realize that their juxtaposition serves to bring into focus the place of the gospel and its witnesses in the needy world.

For the sermon outline the statements are taken in reverse order, "The whole world lieth in wickedness." If this was a true observation of the world when it was made — about 100 A.D. — it is tragically still true. To develop the statement as applicable to our day, we will say that we see the world lying in a state of confusion, of suffering, and sin.

The claim that we are the children of God is not simply a statement of fact, but carries the implication that we are set down in this world of wickedness to do something about it. This is the essential point of the sermon.
