-Sermon Preview:

COMMUNION MEDITATION "GOD'S TOMORROW IS TODAY"

Most of us were taught at an early age to pray, "Thy Kingdom come thy will be done, on earth as it is in Heaven." Later, as we learned about life with its problems, and the Christian Faith with its promises; we came to see that the deepest needs of our lives will be met only when that prayer is answered. We experience fear, loneliness, guilt, pain, want, war, pestilence, and famine, so we look for the King who will conquer all these.

But hope is deferred and we see the same problems confronting new generations, which were the scourge of former times. Some have given up all hope in view of this delay. Others have focused all their expectation on the distant future, expecting everything then, and little or nothing now.

The aim of today's meditation is to show that the gospel is good news about the *present* activity of God. Jesus spoke of the future reign of God, but he spoke a great deal about the Kingdom as present with us now. The miracles done by Jesus, and his followers, were cited by him as evidence of the inbreaking of the new age.

God is with us, the power of the new age is already at work, and the Sacrament of Holy Communion is a sign to us of this reality.

=Sermon Preview=

"GOD SO LOVED . . ."

The American Medical Association declared some years ago that mental illness is America's number one health problem. It was revealed that there are more hospital beds filled with the mentally ill than all other diseases combined. The full effect of this statement has not yet been felt. Our main concern still seems to be the custodial care rather than the cause and cure of the mentally ill.

A national survey revealed that 42% of the people who become mentally ill have already been to their minister, priest or Rabbi. 29% have been to their physician, and only 6% to first to the psychiatrist. The church is the first line of defense against

mental illness.

During these recent years I have come to accept the concept which is common among physicians, that the difference between the emotionally disturbed and the average person is mainly a difference in degree and not a difference in kind. That is, we are all a little bit sick, emotionally, and when the outside pressure get greater than the inner strength anyone can "go off his rocker."

The sermon this Sunday will try to show how our basic Christian concepts, when observed, make for inner strength. We will not be thinking about the mentally ill, but the average person. Jesus' statement (John 10:10) that he came to bring abundant life will serve as a back-drop for our discussion and a challenge to our action.

Sermon Preview

"WHAT IS THAT IN THINE HAND?"

When God called Moses to be the instrument by which He would save His people, Moses was full of questions, doubts, and hesitations. When Moses finally accepted the mission he was given and asked how he would authenticate himself as God's messenger, he was shown that God would work through the ordinary shepherd's staff (or club or stick) that Moses happened to be carrying when he saw the burning bush.

This is a parable for us. We too are going about every day with completely ordinary instruments of work, or circumstances of life, or bits of knowledge, or human relationships, any of which when touched by God could become the means of God's action here and now in our lives and the lives of those about us.

The sermon today will attempt to point out something of the Christian Mission awaiting everyone who is willing to engage in it. Not that we should all change from our present occupations to "church work," but that the work we are now doing, shall become the work of the church.


LECTURE ON THE "DOCTRINE OF THE TRINITY"

"ON HEARING VOICES BEHIND US"

"And thine ears shall hear a word behind thee, saying, This is the way, walk ye in it. When ye turn to the right hand, and when ye turn to the left." Isaiah 30:21

In these days of movement and change in all areas of thought and life, we have been so busy looking ahead and anticipating things to come that we are in danger of breaking loose from our moorings and venturing out into uncharted seas. Some wise ones among us are recognizing that a radical break with our heritage leaves us more poorly equipped to move into the threatening new world, and are steadily urging us to find understanding and strength in the rich storehouses of history. Thus the Great Books plan of study. Thus the renewed interest in Bible studies throughout the Churches. The text from Isaiah provides an excellent springboard for our consideration of our situation,

We are facing several frontiers which we can avoid only by abnormal withdrawal, a stubborn provincialism or some sort of extremist style slashing out at change. Not least among these frontiers is the ethical, and all others seem to have great humanitarian and ethical involvements. Christianity, with all its leaders and institutions, has a tremendous responsibility, both for its own preservation and progress and for the guidance of its people, as we move across these frontiers.

The individual Christian also needs a working awareness of the historical context of his faith, both for theological understanding and for the effectiveness of his redemptive living.
