Sermon Preview

"THE MEASURE OF OUR INVOLVEMENT"

"And they were in the way going up to Jerusalem; and Jesus went before them." Mark 10:32

A very big word in current thought is *involvement*. It is especially useful to all who are concerned over man's present disorder. The temptation to disengagement is inevitable and strong in most of us. There seems so little we can do. And we sometimes embrace our relative helplessness as welcome deliverance from responsibility. We are required as Christians to face up to our own Jerusalem and decide whether we are to reside in pleasant suburbs or go into the inner city with Jesus.

As always he is our pattern. The story of his entry into Jerusalem is a story of deliberate involvement, the cost of which he had surely considered.

This sermon will continue to follow the theme of moving from a mini-faith to a maxi-faith, which is especially applicable to the whole matter of personal involvement.




