Sermon Preview

COMMUNION MEDITATION

"OUR GROWTH IN CHRIST"

One of the recurring phrases in the writings of St. Paul is "in Christ." It occurs in various forms, and is intended to convey to the reader a concept of the relationship which exists between Christ and a Christian. He writes, for instance, of being "baptized in Christ," "speaking the truth in Christ," and of "my bonds in Christ." Sometimes the same general meaning is apparently intended when St. Paul speaks of Christ in the Christian, as in the statement, "I live, yet not I, but Christ lives in me."

The Apostle seems to intend this concept to give us insight into the essential reality of Christian faith and life. The modern phrase from psychology, "the dynamics of interpersonal relationship," will help us, since St. Paul is certainly emphasizing the dynamic nature of authentic Christian experience.

This suggests that we are to think of our Christian life as process rather than position, that we are to remember that justification begins sanctification, and that every real Christian is on his way upward to ever higher realization of the spirit.

Sermon Preview

"THE PRINCIPLE OF ALTERNATION — A PATTERN FOR LIFE"

*"Come away by yourselves to a lovely place, and rest
a while."*

Mark 6:31

When we view the whole ministry of Jesus certain patterns begin to appear. One of the more distinct of these is a pattern of alternation between work and rest, activity and prayer, engagement and disengagement. Jesus was certainly a participant in the life of his time, and was involved in the lives of people, as one "who went about doing good." He certainly shows no tendency toward ascetic withdrawal. But he was also a man of prayer, as seen in many episodes of his ministry.

This pattern of alternation is indicated for all of us who intend to practice the Christian life in all relationships. We would like to be indeed the "salt of the earth," but we so quickly lose our seasoning power. Renewal becomes so necessary for us. The example of our Lord in withdrawing for quiet prayer is a powerful one. If he, who lived so close to his heavenly Father, need this, how much more we, frail mortals of earth, need it.

Sermon Preview

"WHERE IS YOUR FAITH?" — Luke 8:25

For this sermon its text and title are the same. This is the question Jesus asked of his followers when they were frightened by the storm on the lake. It will be freely used to open up for discussion the nature of our faith.

There are many definitions of Christian faith, leading us to recognize that it is not a simple entity, but a complex of many elements. Considering that the initiative in the saving relationship between God and man is God's, we may say that God offers his grace and man responds. Since this response is of the whole person, emotion as well as thought, we may say that this is our faith, the response of the whole person to the divine offer.

When we seek to analyze this response, its components are easily discernible. There is intellectual assent, strong trust, ethical commitment and action, and living assurance. It is hoped that the sermon will contribute to an understanding of our faith.
