Sermon Preview

COMMUNION MEDITATION

“Walking in the Narrow Way”

“Enter by the narrow gate; for the gate is wide and the way is easy, that leads to destruction, and those who enter by it are many. For the gate is narrow and the way is hard that leads to life, and those who find it are few.” (Matthew 7:13-14)

When I was only nine years old I got hold of a New Testament and read the Sermon on the Mount. When I came to this saying about the broad and narrow gates and the easy and hard ways, I was frightened and quit reading. I wonder now if I were reacting as a child, or as a threatened human being. In retrospect I think it was the latter. These are strong words, both threatening and promising. They are certainly worthy of our attention.

If we take them as a statement of fact, they seem pessimistic and discouraging. But if we take them as a demand for disciplined lives, we will find in them basic instruction about Christian living. So many people lose themselves in the shallows of life, or in the broad way that leads to destruction. The need for disciplined living appears at all levels of life — economic, moral, social and spiritual. Once we thoroughly meet this need at any level, we are thereby enabled the more easily to apply it at other levels.

Sermon Preview

"WHAT'S GOT YOU?"

"But I follow after, if I may apprehend that for which I am also apprehended of Christ Jesus."

Philippians 3:12

The usual way of putting it is more likely "What you got?" It is better psychologically and religiously to put it "What's got you?" The text from St. Paul really says it very well, and may be paraphrased, "I'm trying to catch up with that which has already caught me."

We are possessed by good and evil spirits. In New Testament times many forms of illness were understood as demon possession. We speak of narcotics addiction as getting "hooked." One key to the diagnosis of alcoholism is compulsion in drink habits. One may become a slave to an evil habit or to a consuming ambition.

We may rejoice that the principle involved here works in good ways also. Art may possess the artist, music the musician, and dreams the dreamer. The New Testament makes wide use of the concept to explain the experience of becoming and remaining Christian. One of Luther's heroic statements is, "I am held captive by conscience —." Many of us feel bound, covenanted, harnessed to Christ. We have been apprehended.



Sermon Preview

“ON WORKING ONE’S WAY OUT OF A HOLE”

“The Lord inclined to me and heard my cry. He drew me up from the desolate pit, out of the miry bog, and set my feet upon a rock.” Psalm 40:1-2

One of my more easily remembered parishioners of a former pastorate was prostrate after a terrible ordeal of three days. He spoke to my pastoral understanding and assurance when he said, “I’ve been in a deep black hole these three days, but I believe I’m coming out.” His experience of faith and deliverance was an authentic echo of the Psalmists deliverance as declared in the text.

We human beings do get ourselves into all sorts of holes, many of which we dig ourselves. There are other ways of saying it, such as “thrown for a loss,” and “behind the eight ball.” We get the name of Psalm 130 from its opening words in Latin *De Profundis*, “out of the depths.”

It is normal for us both to seek and gain recovery from these deficits of life. Fortunately there are many avenues of recovery and renewal, including the wisdom of common sense, the support of friends, psychotherapy and religious faith. While this sermon is primarily about recovery through divine aid, the preacher recognizes that many of these avenues are compatible and are usually found in combination.

Sermon Preview

Since Dr. Richard G. Milk, Missionary to Mexico, will speak at both our Morning Services this Sunday, we are using this space to bring again to our people the missionary and benevolence work which our Church supports. We are carrying in our Budget a total of \$36,000.00 for all missionary and benevolence purposes. This does not include the missionary pledge of our Woman's Society of Christian Service and Wesleyan Service Guild, our annual Ten-in-One Offering, the Milk Work Fund, and our giving to the Florida Methodist Children's Home. Including all these our annual giving for others will reach well over \$40,000.00.

Some of the larger items in our Benevolence Budget are: World Service and Conference Benevolences, \$12,000.00; Conference Growth and Expansion, \$7,000.00; District Missions Special, \$5,100.00; Conference Higher Education, \$4,000.00; Milk Fund and other World Mission items, \$5,000.00; Ministerial Education, \$1,200.00.

We look forward to the time when Trinity will be able to give one-half of its income to missions and benevolences. Currently we are paying approximately the same on our building indebtedness as for others. When the debt is liquidated, we should be able to sustain our present level of giving, and thereby double our giving to others.
