Sermon Preview

COMMUNION MEDITATION

"GOD'S GOOD GIFT"

"If you then, who are evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will the heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him"
Luke 11:13

In the Gospel of Matthew (7:11) this verse reads *"how much more will your Father who is in heaven give good things to those who ask him."* Supposing that Matthew is the earlier version and Luke a revision, we can imagine the latter coming to consider God's many good gifts and deciding that among these the Holy Spirit is among his greatest. Our Wesleyan forebears spoke often of "the gift of the Holy Spirit" as a sanctifying power in their lives.

It is more than appropriate that on Pentecost Sunday we think about this good gift of God, the Holy Spirit. Many people have difficulty in understanding the theology of the Holy Spirit. At the great risk of oversimplification, we suggest that we may find help in thinking of the Holy Spirit as the Presence and Power of God among us.

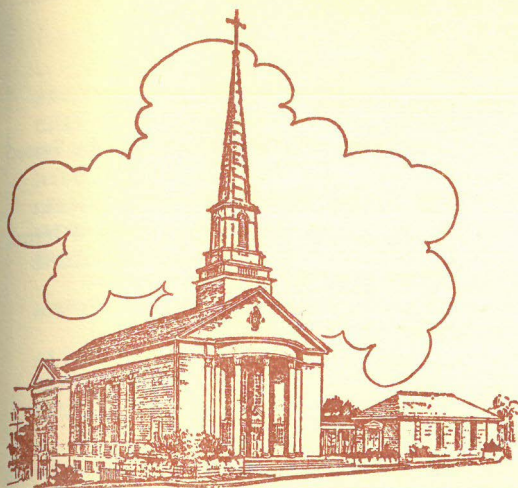

Sermon Preview

"A PASTOR'S PRAYER"

II Corinthians 13:14

ANTHEM NOTE

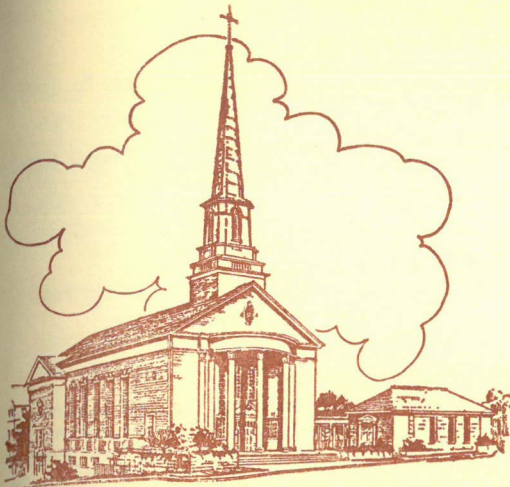

Sermon Preview

"ONE THING IS NEEDFUL"

Most everyone will recognize that the sermon title is taken from our Lord's gentle rebuke of Martha who was "anxious and troubled about many things." The one thing needful was a single minded devotion to the highest presence available.

This sermon will turn this word of Jesus into a search for a viable essential in the briefest form possible of the "law and the prophets." This is an old search, resulting in forms of what we call the Golden Rule in almost every religion known to man. Jesus himself summed up the whole in the two Great Commandments, which he selected from the Old Testament.

When we study and analyze the attitude and teachings of Jesus thoroughly, we find that his expectation of us may be concentrated in the concept of "obedient love." Both obedience and love are primary ingredients of our faith response to God's offer. When we are "anxious and troubled about many things," our sure recovery is through our obedient love to God expressed in all our relations with man.

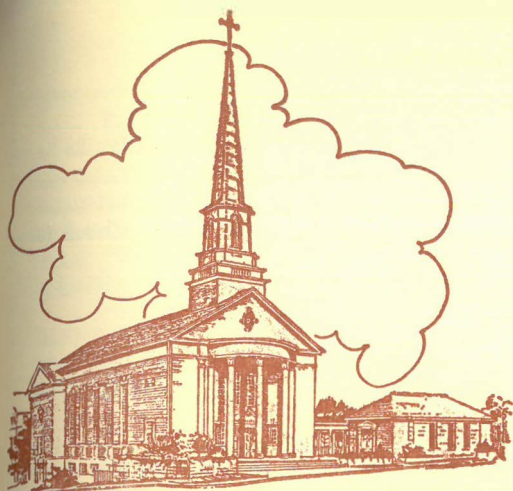

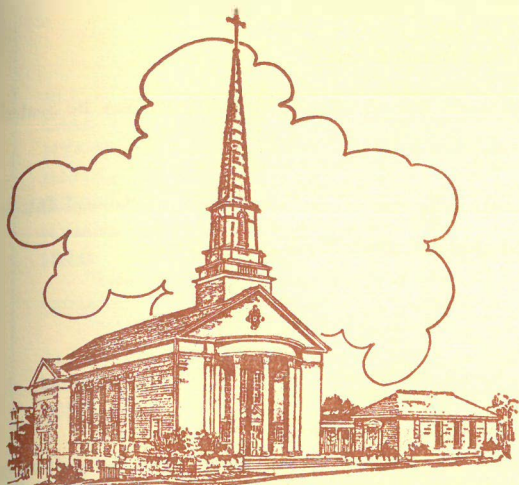
