## Sermon Preview

### COMMUNION MEDITATION "THE CONTENT OF HOLINESS"

*"Even so now yield your members servants  
to righteousness unto holiness."* Romans 6:19b

There can be no doubt about it, the Christian Church is hurting in our day. And not least is that it is suffering from mediocrity in its basic Christian commitment and quality. This means the institution, but first of all it means all of us — ministry and laity — who are its members.

The way of recovery seems to be to raise our standards to those so deeply established in the New Testament. Among these standards that of personal holiness of life stands high. In our rather common rejection of the concept of holiness of life we have let ourselves off and down. Perhaps this is what we want. If so, may we not be abandoning an essential of Christian faith and life?

As we come to Holy Communion this Sunday, let us open ourselves to the deep testing of the Holy Spirit. And even as we receive the bread and wine into our bodies, let us open our very lives to the Living Christ — unto the saving of our souls and the sanctification of our lives.

## Sermon Preview

### “THE REALITY PRINCIPLE IN PRAYER AND WORSHIP”

*“With what shall I come before the Lord,  
and bow myself before God on high?”*

Micah 6:6a

The recent sermon on “The Reality Principle in Faith and Life” has drawn surprising interest and response. Apparently it struck a level of need and concern in the lives of many people. Its general theme is capable of application to many areas of life. The sermon for this Sunday takes advantage of this capacity.

The problem of artificiality in worship is a very old one, and became a great issue of concern to the prophets of Israel. There are many instances of crying out against this unreality in the Psalms as well as in the Prophets. As old as it is, the problem is still with us, and this sermon will be directed to what the preacher considers an area of need.

It seems that the old principle of mistaking the outward for the inward and substituting ritual words and acts for a genuine personal involvement operates among us nowadays as among our spiritual fathers.

This sermon will seek to apply the insights of the prophets, more clearly focused on us by common sense and psychology, to our own quest for reality in worship.

## Sermon Preview

### "THE ABC OF THE CHRISTIAN LIFE"

*"Come ye after me, and I will make you to become fishers of men." Mark 1:17*

*"But as many as received him, to them gave he power to become the sons of God." John 1:12*

The sermon of last Sunday morning closed with a strong appeal for deep personal commitment and involvement as the essential reality of our Christian life and worship. Following the service one person present challenged the preacher, "Now show us how to become committed persons." Acknowledging this to be a valid request from the pew, the pulpit responds in the sermon for this Sunday.

The title suggests an elementary treatment of the subject, but it is hoped that we may be dealing with such basics that young Christians will find milk for growth and older Christians meat for strength.

The first step in the Christian life, and basic to all others, is *acceptance*. Essentially this is the acceptance of a person who is the Way, the Truth, and the Life. Jesus promised his followers that he would make them to *become* something different and greater than they were. Once this is done for the individual he is called upon to *continue* through his renewing commitment to Christ. In this relationship he finds his life, his soul, his very self, and moves toward the realization of his ultimate destiny.



## Sermon Preview

### "INVEST WITH CONFIDENCE"

*"For thus says the Lord of hosts, the God of Israel. Houses and fields and vineyards shall again be bought in this land."* Jeremiah 32:15.

The great man of God, Jeremiah, prophet and patriot, lived in Jerusalem during its worst time. The country side had been overrun and devastated by the armies of Babylon and now the city itself was heavily besieged. The future was dark and unpromising. But God was with Jeremiah and gave the seer a far vision of the future. On the basis of this confidence Jeremiah purchased at Anathoth, suburb of Jerusalem, a field which was part of his family land. He invested in the future, thereby becoming an example of confidence and hope to his people.

Our situation is not nearly so bad as that of Jerusalem in Jeremiah's day, but bad enough that we desperately need the restorative example of the prophet. We are besieged from many quarters, with threats to country, Church and our value system. Where are the prophets and patriots who will invest in Anathoth and restore our confidence?
