

Sermon Preview

“FOUR FRONTS OF CHRISTIAN WARFARE”

“Put on the whole armor of God.” Ephesians 6:11

One of the reasons we are not the *Church militant* is that we have long since quietly concluded that we've “got it made.” Deluded by our statistics we have assumed the easy posture of a satisfied majority. There are some evidences that we are faintly beginning to realize that we are actually a minority, and decreasing rapidly in power and influence. The full realization of our minority status, plus additional rejections, and even some persecutions, will serve toward restoring our militancy. We may be led by the Holy Spirit once again to move against our world in the name of Him who both judges and redeems.

This sermon, following the pattern of military strategy, will suggest four fronts on which we must engage in relentless warfare. These are:

- I The Theological Front: Logically and Strategically First.
- II The Educational Front: Challenge and Opportunity.
- III The Moral Front: Widespread Challenge
- IV The Evangelistic Front: Our Message to Men.

Sermon Preview

“THE SECOND FRONT: CHRISTIAN EDUCATION”

The Sermon originally planned for last Sunday, “Four Fronts of Christian Warfare,” proved to cover too much territory for one delivery. Consequently it has been broken down into a series of four separate sermons. A strong emphasis on the importance of Christian nurture suggesting the relative responsibility of home and Church, will be the purpose of the sermon for this Sunday.

The *Objective*, which has been pursued in the development of our extensive new materials for Christian education, is required here to help us understand the philosophy of curriculum building: “The objective of the church as manifested through its educational ministry is that all persons be aware of and grow in their understanding of God, especially of his redeeming love as revealed in Jesus Christ, and that they respond in faith and love—to the end that they may know who they are and what their human situation means, increasingly identify themselves as sons of God and members of the Christian community, live in the spirit of God in every relationship, fulfill their common discipleship in the world, and abide in the Christian hope.”

Sermon Preview

"THE THIRD FRONT: MORAL RENEWAL"

The sermon for this Sunday is the third of the series of four which exploded from the original one on "Four Fronts of Christian Warfare."

No doubt about it, we are in a moral crisis, manifest abroad in diverse ways. Some rejoice in this, thinking it to bring a new freedom to the individual and to promise a new day in human relationships. But others among us are greatly disturbed, sensing a threat to much we hold true, binding and precious. Perhaps it takes a crisis to make us consider and bow the head, seeking understanding and our own place in Christian strategy of renewal.

This sermon will reflect the preacher's own personal reflection and response to the challenge of the hour. It will be, therefore, somewhat subjective, but will have the advantage of a testimony.

Most of us, when in crisis, fall back on resources available. Some Christians will say, "Let's start all over again with the Ten Commandments." While recognizing the merit of this proposal, this sermon will suggest that for moral basics and ethical strength, we go *further back and deeper down* than the Decalogue.



Sermon Preview

"THE FOURTH FRONT: EVANGELISM"

"He first found his brother . . . and brought his to Jesus."—John 1:41 and 42.

Interest in the series of sermons, "Four Fronts of Christian Warfare," has been high, and the response has been more encouraging than anticipated. Although the series proper is ended with this sermon, the substance of the areas of concern touched upon will doubtless appear in many sermons yet to come.

Let us entertain no doubts about it, when Andrew first "found his brother Simon, . . . and brought him to Jesus, he was demonstrating the first work of the Church. Please note his announcement, "We have found the Christ," which remains the first text of the proclaimed word of God.

Form and technique in evangelism take up much of the discussion time in ministers' institutes and seminars. Almost desperately we are trying to devise substitutes for the saw dust trail and the mourner's bench of old revival ways. One wonders at all this, and rather considers that our need for recovery is for the substance rather than the form. Once we get back the essential meaning and compulsion, form and technique will take care of themselves.
