Sermon Preview

COMMUNION MEDITATION

“YOU CAN SAY THAT AGAIN!”

Once when a lawyer who made many public speeches asked me how preachers could find something to speak about so frequently I replied, “It’s a matter of finding fresh ways to say the same things over and over.” Thus the liturgical year rolls around and brings us to Advent where we start over with the “old, old story of Jesus and his love.” Those of us who know the story “by heart,” love to tell it; and some, even among those who know it best, seem hungering and thirsting to hear it like the rest.

The Apostles — the sent ones — were instructed to “go and tell.” Jesus was constantly telling those whose lives he had touched to “go and tell.” This is the nature of the Gospel; it cannot be contained; it bursts forth in joyful witness to all mankind.

No one who takes upon himself the privilege of declaring the Gospel need ever run out of something to say. A sermon is not a lecture or simply an address: it is proclamation, it is message, it is good news.

The Service of Holy Communion is essentially celebration, celebration of the mighty act of God in Christ, and for each of us celebration of our own discovery and understanding of this great event.

Sermon Preview

"FOR JUDGMENT HE COMES"

"For judgment I came into this world, that those who do not see may see, and that those who see may become blind." John 9:39.

In our celebration of Advent we are very apt to emphasize its joy and wholly neglect its judgment. Thus we keep it more emotional and less theological, soon passing through its days with no residue of renewal, no fresh deposit of depth, no new sense of sin. This sermon is intended as an effort to keep the element of judgment near the center of our understanding of our Lord's coming.

Jesus says it himself in the text from John, and adds that this judgment will radically alter man's view of himself and his world, destroying too ready confidence in man's way and opening the eyes of the humble.

It is especially appropriate this Advent that we remember judgment. Whether we are open to judgment or not, prevailing conditions among us seem to call down upon us the very wrath of God. If we are "one nation, under God," surely this must mean "under the judgment of God." In this all mankind seems to be under the same judgment.

It is a sound principle, supported by both theology and psychology, that judgment and redemption go together, the latter not possible without the former. The physician's diagnosis and the patient's acceptance are prerequisite to proper therapy.



"FEAR NOT, FOR BEHOLD!"

"Fear not, for behold I bring you good tidings of great joy which shall be to all people." Luke 2:10.

The earthly sojourn of our Lord both begins and ends with the angelic admonition, "Fear not." That this word of encouragement to earthlings is heaven sent should be of great significance to us. In the annunciation of our Lord's birth and in the declaration of his resurrection this great word brackets the earthly ministry of Jesus.

And in between what a life of fearlessness he lived! Conscious as he was of the presence and care of his Heavenly Father, his life among men was one of courage beyond heroic dimensions. This he carried all the way to the cross.

Moreover in his upbuilding and guidance of his "little flock," his constant care was that they be relieved of fears and anxieties, and be always of good cheer, even in the shadow of his Cross.

Indeed according to the New Testament, the real opposite of faith is not doubt, but fear.



Sermon Preview

"THE SENSE OF SENTNESS"

"As the Father has sent me, even so send I you." John 20:21

It is difficult to imagine how more of Christian truth and theological content could be carried in so short a span of words as in this brief declaration of our Lord. Here is theology of the incarnation, its nature and purpose; and here is theology of the Church, its origin and its mission.

The sense of sentness was deep and compelling in the work of Jesus, and in this passion of mission he went from person to person, from need to need, from suffering to suffering, from place to place, and at last all the way to the Cross. If his whole work is seen in one single impression in our understanding, or makes one single impact upon our awareness, it is that he is the Sent One and that he brings to us the very love of God. Only the proud, the obtuse and the utterly mean can resist the impingement of this divine confrontation.

Neither can those who receive him turn aside his imperious "even so send I you." Our Christian mission, our own sense of sentness, is not an option for any of us who bear his name. It is in the very nature of his ministry that those called to be with him are sent out. Disciples become apostles, and the Church gathered becomes the Church scattered.
