Sermon Preview

COMMUNION MEDITATION WHEN JESUS SAID "I AM"

One of the interesting features of the Gospel of John, of theological significance and devotional value is the occurrence in it of the several "I am" sayings of our Lord. There are seven of these great personal Affirmations, the first being "I am the bread of life," found in John 6:35. This will be the primary theme of our Communion Meditation. It is noted that six of these sayings are made basic to the Table Dismissals in our Communion Service. One of them, "I am the resurrection and the life," is not included, being rightly reserved for its prominent place in our Funeral Ritual.

It is suggested that as preparation for coming to Communion we all read and study the passages in which these "I am" sayings occur. These are: Light (8:12); the Good Shepherd (10:11 and 14); Door (10:7 and 9); Resurrection and Life (11:25); the Way, the Truth and the Life (14:6), and the Vine (15:1 and 5).



Sermon Preview

“THE REACH OF CONSCIENCE”

Scripture, Luke 10:25-37

However we may define conscience, or the moral law within, we know that it has astonished philosophers, challenged psychologists, assured religionists, provided drama for writers, and bothered everyone of us.

The conscience seems not to be an entity, a thing in itself, but a complex, reflecting the total life setting and commitment of the individual. Hence the wide variation of conscience among us.

The Christian conscience, like the Christian mind, is more definable and understandable. The Christian experience certainly gives one “a more delicate conscience.”

The conscience of the Christian usually outruns law, but in recent years, especially in human relations, law has gone beyond our conscience, and we are slow to catch up. This sermon will declare the Christian necessity of extending conscience, especially through universalizing some of its central conceptual and categorical ingredients.

Sermon Preview

"THE SAVING REMNANT"

"Yet I have left me seven thousand." I Kings 19:20.

Some patterns of God's participation in history run so deeply and extensively throughout the Bible, that we are justified in deriving from them an understanding of his continuing activity among his children.

One of these is that of the Remnant, the Biblical designation for the faithful minority who remain ever true, becoming redemptive in their influence in their contemporary setting and carriers into the future of God's righteousness and promise. Among instances of Biblical Remnants and illustrations of the "remnant principle" are: Abraham's prayer for Sodom (Genesis 18:23-33); Gideon's band and its selection (Judges 7); the Lord's declaration to Elijah, "Yet I have left me seven thousand" (I Kings 19:20). The prophet Isaiah builds his hope for a renewed Israel upon the expectation of a remnant which will be the true Israel.

We will readily recognize that here is a pattern which we need for our encouragement and hope in these days. Does God still live and act among us in this manner?



Sermon Preview

“OUR MINISTRY OF RECONCILIATION”

“All this is from God, who through Christ reconciled us to himself and gave us the ministry of reconciliation.” — II Corinthians 5:18.

The word and concept of reconciliation between God and man and between man and man are distinctly Pauline, occurring in at least five places in the Epistles. The New Testament experience required a great new word, and the Apostle drew on his great personal resources to provide one.

Life's worst state is to be estranged from God; life's next worst condition is broken relations between persons. Life's best state is to be reconciled to God and to live in joyous relationship with him. Our happiness depends upon good relationships with other human beings.

The most frightening aspect of the world today is its widespread and deep brokenness. We are alienated from each other at every hand. The very fabric of social order is threatened by these separations. If the Christian Church is to keep its assignment, it must exercise its ministry of reconciliation everywhere and at all times.
