Sermon Preview

COMMUNION MEDITATION

"ONLY TO TOUCH THE HEM OF HIS GARMENT"

"[They] besought him that they might only touch the hem of his garment: and as many as touched were made perfectly whole." Matthew 14:36.

In the very nature of the religious experience we must be content with minimal realizations. God does not make himself and his way fully known to us. Indeed the distance between God and man is so great that man is capable of receiving and appropriating the divine revelation only in relatively small proportions. Our discontent with this unbridgeable distance is the root of the first temptation of Adam and Eve, and also the explanation of the Tower of Babel project.

Deeply understood, this limit on man's mystical receptivity appears as actually affirmative rather than negative. The fact that there is something *beyond* and always something *more* awaiting our realization is indeed an essential dynamic of a vital faith. There is a certain divine "teasing" of us that invites and challenges us upward, even as Mount Everest, "because it is there."

The verse of scripture above is one of two where suppliants were content only to "touch the hem" of our Lord's garment. These episodes and the accompanying recognitions are used to support the large observation that God's grace is so very powerful that for us human beings, indeed "a little bit goes a long way."

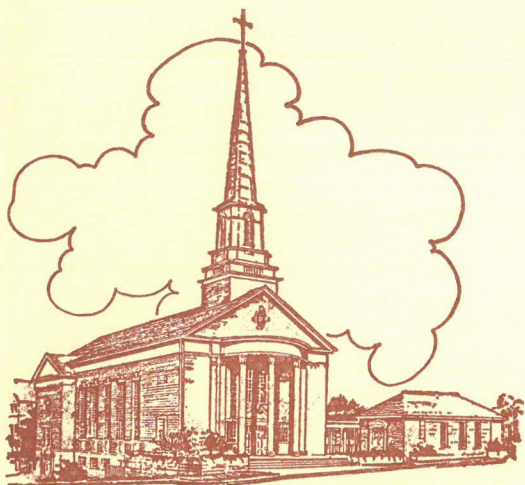

Sermon Preview

"THE MAN WHO CHANGED GOD'S MIND"

Scripture: The Story of Noah — Genesis 6-9.

The summer is blessed in the absence of so many special days and seasons demanding our observation. The preacher is more free to gather his themes from over the whole range of the Bible. Many Old Testament themes and texts are promised in the summer's preaching.

The story of Noah and the Flood leaves us with certain imperishable heritages. It includes two of the basic concepts of Holy Scripture, the Covenant People and the Saving Remnant. Three great symbols of permanence: the Flood itself as event of Divine judgment, the Ark as means of survival or a way of salvation, and the man Noah himself who found favor in the sight of God and became the bridge person, or the remnant, out of whose life and work would come the new day.

The stand-out point of the story for me, and hence the primary emphasis of the sermon, is the intervention of a man between the wrath of God and the failures of men. This is a major theme of the Bible, as instanced here in Noah, Abraham praying for Sodom, Moses asking to be "blotted out" if God could not forgive, and the Cross of Christ stark against the sky.

The question is: Does God still do business this way? Can one life be socially redemptive? If so, then we ask where is that man among us now?

Sermon Preview

"AN ANCIENT PARABLE OF MODERN MAN"

The Tower of Babel, Genesis 11:1-9

The story of the Tower of Babel is one of the more interesting of the early accounts of the beginnings of things as we find these in the book of Genesis. Like others of these stories, this one is remarkable for its understanding of human nature, especially for its insight into man's strong tendency to self-exaltation. With undoubted achievement ability, an endowment of the Creator, man begins to presume an inordinate self-sufficiency, to the point of encompassing even heaven in his own plans and construction.

It is passing strange how old stories retain their validity for all time. What better parable of modern man than this one. Here we are, on this globe, piling achievement upon achievement, penetrating the innermost secrets of nature, conquering diseases, traveling faster than sound, and really assuming that "nothing we propose to do will be impossible for us." But before we enjoy our self-idolatry too much, we'd better look again. Wars abound in the earth, men still hate and kill, children are neglected, and evil is rampant. What's really going on here? May be we aren't suppose to "do our own thing" all the way to heaven and back! May be we have some inescapable limitations! May be we are still subjects of a Sovereign Lord! Worth thinking about? "Come, let us reason together."

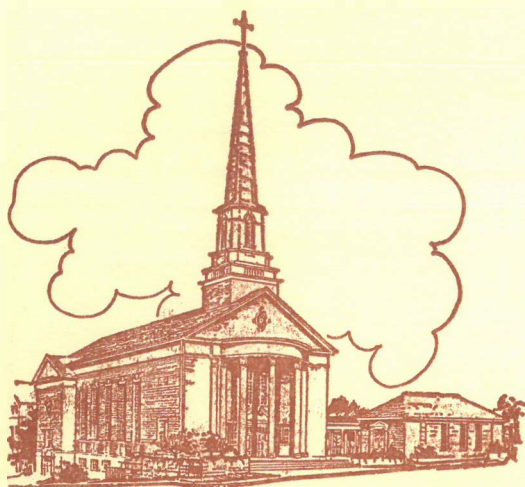

Sermon Preview

"ON DOING ONE'S OWN THING"

"In those days there was no king in Israel: every man did what was right in his own eyes."

Judges 21:25

The phrase is new but the idea and practice of "doing one's own thing" is as old as mankind and as deep as human nature. It seems inevitable that there is tension between the individual and his assorted groups. Our social order and progress depend upon a continual balancing of these forces. Pure individualism produces anarchy. To make the group, state, church, or whatever, the be-all or end-all of our human endeavor means repression, slavery, statism, totalitarianism.

Some kind of hierarchical arrangement seems necessary for order and progress, even in a democratic society. The essential democratic test of such a system is its fluidity and openness. If the levels of the hierarchy are fixed, as in any caste system, so that one may not freely move to other and higher levels, the system doesn't stand the test. Ghetto living is not location but confinement to a location and a condition. The innate individualism of human beings is inevitably dynamite to such rigidity.

This sermon will take an ancient text for a springboard and attempt to face a present concern in a "contemporary" and "relevant" manner.
