Sermon Preview

COMMUNION MEDITATION

"THE FORWARD THRUST OF CHRISTIAN LIVING"
"What more are you doing than others?" Matthew 5:47.

The word *thrust* has found a place in our vocabulary more meaningful than its older suggestion of physical or manual movement. In this larger sense it means one's impact upon one's community or one's world. Sometimes it is in combination with a great religious term and comes out as *redemptive thrust*.

The ministry of Jesus seems well described as one of *redemptive thrust*. He was no recluse or ascetic, but "went about doing good." It is true that sometimes he withdrew for rest and renewal, but always he returns to arenas of human life and need. Even man's great negative to him, the Cross, becomes the focal point of his redemptive impingement upon history.

The question he poses for us "What more are you doing than others?" tests our lives by this great ideal of *redemptive thrust*. There is no avenue of escape from the test short of an abandonment of Christian commitment. Holy Communion is a time of openness and self-examination in the light of God's love for us. This great test will be for us a sharp instrument of this measurement.

"THE PASSION FOR RIGHTEOUSNESS"

"Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they shall be satisfied." Matthew 5:6.

The Bible abounds in figures wherein the appetites of the body, and the satisfaction of these appetites, are used to illustrate the needs and the fulfillments of the soul. As the bounty of the earth responds to the hunger and thirst of the body, so do the mercy and grace of God respond to the longings of the soul.

This Beatitude of our Lord is one of the choicest of these figures. Those who really desire righteousness in their lives can realize it, not so much in personal achievement as in spiritual realization. Personal righteousness is a fruit of the Spirit, a gift of God.

The Bible knows no saintliness which does not include goodness. It makes no separation between one's devotions and one's actions. It is a great fallacy to separate religion and morals.

Do you want to be good? Is the desire in you as hungering and thirsting? Is it a deep passion of your soul? Our Lord's promise is your satisfaction.

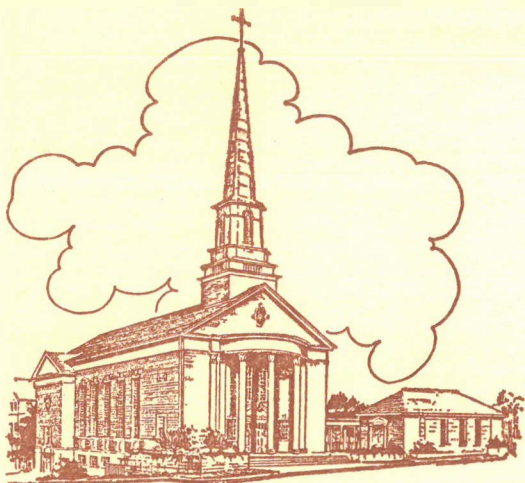

Sermon Preview

"THE COURTESY OF JESUS"

"So God created man in his own image, in the image of God he created him; male and female he created them." Genesis 1:27

In the second of the two stories of creation in Genesis God is recorded as observing, *"It is not good that man should be alone."* So from the beginning man has been a creature in relationship with other creatures like himself. The quality of these relationships seems to have been left for man himself, with God's help, to work out. Thus entered the ethical dimension at the deepest level of man's existence. His ethical conduct was not just in his relationship with one other man, as between Cain and Abel, but with an ever widening circle of men, and thus became social, and even political.

Good manner and good conduct are woven into the same fabric without a break. Unfortunately some people allow a break at this point. Some very kind people among us are cruel in other settings. Persons genteel in manner can be unjust in larger relationships. Frequently individual courtesy, expressed between individuals, does not carry over into group life.

This sermon will use some sayings and acts of our Lord to show us what true Christian courtesy is.

Sermon Preview

"THINGS OF GOOD REPORT"

"Finally, brethren, whatsoever . . . things are of good report . . . think on these things."

(from Philippians 4.8)

Bad news seems to be more marketable than good news. Those who work in what are called the mass media should not receive all the blame for this; they are simply supplying the demands of the public. All of us are caught here in a kind of vicious circle, in which demonic forces have free play.

The pulpit is the place primarily for the grand good news of the gospel. This it must proclaim in the face of all bad news, all darkness, and all tragedy. Perhaps it is also the place for calling attention to some lesser items of good news which are not too difficult to find. There are indeed some *"things of good report"* among us, and we are false to ourselves and to our neighbors unless we *"think on these things."* We just might break that demonic circle in which we are caught.

This sermon will attempt to lead us into a more ready mindfulness of *"things of good report"* among us, and is intended as a small contribution toward breaking through to a greater hopefulness than now prevails among us.

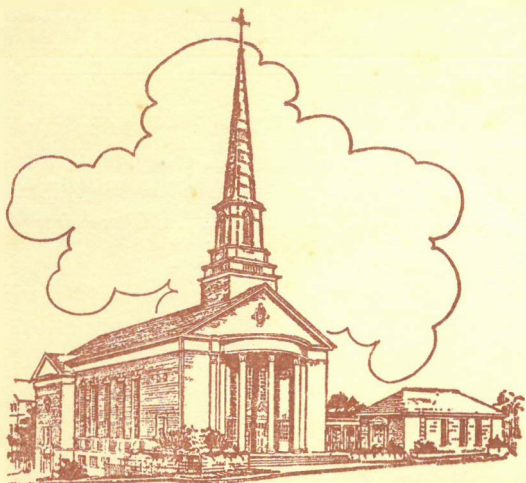
