Sermon Preview

"NOT BY VIOLENCE COMES THE KINGDOM"

"From the days of John the Baptist until now the kingdom of heaven has suffered violence, and men of violence take it by force." Matthew 11:12

Once again we are being confronted by those who condone violence for what are considered good causes. Their argument seems to be the old one that the end justifies the means, an argument long since disproved and laid aside. And not least among its denials is the fact that means alter ends, giving us unplanned results, and bringing us to unsought goals.

The slowness with which God gives his kingdom exasperates the more eager among us. The party of the zealots is always present. These are the days of the "instants," so why not instant justice? We are impatient with the larger settings of life, and so many among us are enamoured with "now."

What means this cryptic saying of Jesus? Its setting helps little. But it does seem to refer negatively to those who seek to reach the kingdom, or hasten its coming, by force.

Is the Christian limited to non-violent means to achieve his higher ends? The larger answer of the New Testament seems to be affirmative.

LAYMEN'S DAY — OUR SPEAKER

We are happy to have Judge Robert T. Mann as our speaker for our Annual Laymen's Day. Judge Mann is a native of Tarpon Springs, a graduate of the University of Florida and of its Law School. He also holds Masters of Law degrees from both Yale and Harvard and a Masters in Government from George Washington University.

For many years a practicing attorney in Tampa, he served as State Representative from Hillsborough County for twelve years, achieving distinction as a legislator, and recognized as the "most valuable member" in 1967. He now serves as one of five judges on the Second District Court of Appeals, which sits in Lakeland.

In addition to his activity in his local church, Judge Mann served for several years as District Lay Leader of the Tampa District. Three times he was elected to General Conference, and is now in his third quadrennium as a lay member of the General Board of Christian Social Concerns.

Sermon Preview

"THE KINGDOM IS HERE!"

"The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God is at hand; repent, and believe in the gospel." Mark 1-18.

Jesus began his ministry with this announcement of the real presence of God's kingdom among men, together with a consequent need for repentance. By repentance is meant a turning from the world and clinging to it, and a turning to the kingdom with an obedient entrance into it. Self must abdicate as king of one's worldly kingdom, and Jesus Christ, as bringer and Lord of the new kingdom, must be enthroned.

We recognize the kingdom in both its tenses, as present and as coming. But its future is effectively blocked if we do not, as committed Christians, accept its contemporaneity and become obediently at home in its reality and demands. In theology this is called "realized eschatology," meaning in particular that we need not wait until last days are here or for some ultimate fulfillment before we live as citizens of this kingdom.

Since the very word kingdom suggests the social order, we jump easily and quickly, perhaps too quickly and too easily, to considering it almost wholly in social terms. Here we fall into a subtle trap. Because our society is so far from the kingdom, and this kingdom comes so slowly, we adjust ourselves to its absence and its delay, and thereby let ourselves off and down. But our Lord has said that it is here! We are called both as individuals and as Body of Christ to enter in and live within this realm of God.
