Sermon Preview

COMMUNION MEDITATION "CHRIST THE QUICKENING SPIRIT"

"And so it is written, the first Adam was made a living soul; the last Adam was made a quickening spirit."

I Corinthians 15:45

A careful reading of the writings of St. Paul will yield frequent brief characterizations of Jesus Christ. These are always vivid, to the point, and show at the least the understanding the Apostle had of his Lord.

Two of these appear together in the scripture text. One is the concept of Christ as a new or second Adam. This is to say that the first Adam was the beginner of the old man, and that the second Adam is the beginner of the new man, the new man in Christ Jesus. As St. Paul understands the biblical drama, the fall of Adam was history's greatest tragedy and set man apart from God, a rebellious sinner left to his own devices. He sees Christ the new Adam as restorer, healer, reconciler, savior, and believes that in him a new age dawns for man.

Christ as quickening spirit fits well into the larger pattern in the Apostle's thought of the indwelling Christ, who in the hospitable personality is transforming and renewing power.



Sermon Preview

"UPON THIS ROCK"

"And I tell you, you are Peter, and on this rock I will build my church, and the powers of death shall not prevail against it." Matt. 16:18.

This classic text from the word of our Lord is used for the introductory sermon of a projected series on "The Church Challenged and Challenging." Sermons of this series will come intermittently during Kingdomtide, giving way to several special Sundays of the season.

Primitive Christians believed that they were in a movement ordained and sustained by none less than God Himself. Their sense of mission and of destiny were unvarying and compelling. They were the sent ones to mankind and their own apostolate proceeded from the imperious sense of sentness which was in their Lord Jesus Christ. Victory in time was a certainty with them because they believed it to be already eternally effected.

There is no stopping such as these. How may we become their worthy successors? Does the weakness of the Church of today not lie just here, in our lack of this sense of sentness; of this assurance of victory, and of failing to see these events of time also as events in eternity?



Sermon Preview

"I DON'T WANT TO BE TIED DOWN"

"To another he said, 'Follow me.' But he said, 'Lord, let me first go and bury my father'." Luke 9:59

It was not that this man's father was already dead and that he was simply asking time for the funeral. No, he was requesting an indefinite time of tarrying before he was tied down to that imperious invitation, "Follow me." He believed to the point of addressing Jesus as "Lord," but not to the point of a commitment of life and talent.

At almost every hand we are hearing the plea, "I don't want to be tied down." Talented people are declining to teach Church School classes because they "don't want to be tied down." Financially able people are refusing to make a pledge to the church budget because they "don't want to be tied down." Some are abandoning their marriage vows because to keep them is a form of being tied down. The affluence of our day is providing people opportunity to be free, to travel, and to do what they please. Prosperity is a good which brings many evils in its train. This strong tendency to covenant breaking is one of these evils.

What dangers lurk in this assumption of freedom! Most apparent is the danger to our group and institutional life. The Body of Christ cannot survive the dismemberment consequent to this egocentric insistence. Even deeper and far more subtle is the danger to our souls and our sanity in this cheap principle of not "wanting to be tied down."

Sermon Preview

"MINORITY DEMAND AND CHRISTIAN RESPONSE"

"Now in those days when the disciples were increasing in number, the Hellenists murmured against the Hebrews because their widows were neglected in the daily distribution." Acts 6:1.

How modern seems this protest in primitive Christian life! It was by a minority, and called attention to a form of discrimination. And that discrimination was economic in its effects. The "power structure" was reached, and response was forthcoming. The response produced a new structure and a new order, the diaconate, within the Church.

Modern protesters go beyond murmuring; they march and yell, rudely interrupt services of worship, and make strong demands, called manifestos. They not only seek corrections to present discrimination, but also for past injustices. Thus enters the principle of reparations, based on generalized theories not acceptable to all. It appears that we are beginning to have a flood of reparations demands, threatening a *reductio ad absurdum* of the very concept itself, and obscuring merit in some claims.

This sermon will review recent developments in these more recent murmurings, raising the question of whether or not they may be fitted into the patterns of Acts 6, and explaining some of the responses which have been made.
