Sermon Preview

“INTO ALL THE WORLD”

All the words of Jesus are precious to the believing Christian; some cherish their red letter Bibles. The words of the risen Christ are all the more interesting to us. A study of these shows a complete consistency with his earlier teaching.

Almost all of these resurrection sayings of our Lord fall into the category typified by the Great Commission of the Gospel of Matthew — a call to service and a sending forth “into all the world.” The early followers of Jesus were self-conscious about their apostolate, having a powerful sense of sentness.

We have quoted the Great Commission over and over as the primary text for the Christian missionary enterprise. Indeed it embodies our essential orders. The phrase “into all the world” has been received and interpreted essentially in a geographical sense. In more recent years we have come to understand it in a more social or cultural sense. The mission field is not simply far away, to “all the dark places of earth’s heathen races,” but everywhere in our life and culture where there is an unevangelized area. To feel the real impingement of our Lord’s command “into all the world” begins with that part of the world which is inside one’s own life and personality.



Sermon Preview

“FIRST THINGS FIRST”

“... but first they gave themselves to the Lord . . .”

II Corinthians 8:5.

The Apostle is about the business of promoting an offering within the Church at Corinth. His appeal is skillfully done. It has the depth of theological commitment, “... but first they gave themselves to the Lord.” It also uses the appeal to what others have done; it is of the churches in Macedonia he is speaking, expecting the Corinthians to do at least as well.

It is to the Apostle’s insightful sense of priorities that we turn for the sermon theme. His Lord before him had said, “Seek first the Kingdom of God and its righteousness.” One of the greatest threats of current thought, even within the Church, is that we lose the order of priorities on which our value system is built.

The big cry in the Church today is for renewal. How shall we ever know renewal save as we first give ourselves to the Lord?

So many people within our churches have lost the distinctive image of the Christian. How shall they ever regain this image except they give themselves to the Lord?

Even some ministers confess they have lost their role and no longer have any message. How shall they ever find their role and bring an authentic message to people unless they first give themselves to the Lord?



Sermon Preview

"THE AGONY OF CHRISTIANITY"

"Blessed are those who are persecuted for righteousness' sake for theirs is the kingdom of heaven." Matt. 5:10.

It appears from all around that it is not going to be as easy for Christianity and the Church as it has been for several hundred years in Western civilization. What has been called Christendom, meaning a society and culture pervaded and colored by Christianity throughout, is no more. While we have not had an established Church in our country, the common acceptance we have enjoyed has amounted almost to an establishment.

While this acceptance has not been formally abandoned, there are many evidences of its lessening. It is hardly likely that we are going to suffer persecution from the world, but we are already suffering an increasing measure of indifference, which is strategically worse. To be persecuted is at least to be noticed, but to be bypassed by those who make the decision of the hour is a defeat from which it is difficult to recover.

We are also suffering from inward agonies at many levels of our life. The generation alienations of the world are affecting us, first within our families, and also within the larger family which the Church seeks to be. The impatience with all institutions inevitably includes the Church as institution. Ferment and disturbance in ethical and theological thought shakes and sometimes dislodges long accepted beliefs and values.

Those who choose to remain within the Christian covenant are called to radical obedience and to heroic demonstrations of our faith.
