Sermon Preview

COMMUNION MEDITATION

"NOT SERVANTS, BUT SONS OF GOD"

"Wherefore thou art no more a servant, but a son; and if a son, then an heir of God through Christ." Galatians 4:7.

If in the complex development by which Christianity became independent of Judaism there is a Declaration of Independence, it has to be St. Paul's Epistle to the Galatians.

The Apostle had already acted upon his conviction that in Christ there was a new dispensation by which old legalistic and ritualistic requirements were transcended. He had introduced people to Christ on this new basis and had formed new fellowships for instruction and worship.

But some of the more restrictive older Christians in Jerusalem were horrified at this degree of freedom, and sent emissaries to correct the error. St. Paul's response was quick, incisive and effective. The Epistle to the Galatians delivered his response to that situation, and has remained in our sacred heritage as a bill of rights against all of those who would reduce us again to some form of servanthood.

Sermon Preview

"ARROWS IN THE HAND OF A MIGHTY MAN"

"Honour thy father and thy mother, that thy days may be long upon the land which the Lord thy God giveth thee." Exodus 20:12
"As arrows are in the hand of a mighty man; so are children of the youth." Psalm 127:4

The Fifth Commandment makes it clear that man can be powerfully served by tradition — one generation should give God's name to another — and family life, in particular, is the sphere in which God seeks the service of this tradition. In more than one way, one generation of God's people depend upon another. The understanding which one generation has of the truth that comes to it is conditioned by the words and deeds of previous generations. When we honor our father and our mother we are to look at what "good" they have offered. The generation following us will do the same. Will there be any "good" for them to honor?

It is in the family life that good can be carried from generation to generation. We should know it is the hands of parents which are "mighty" in this respect. Children, as "arrows," are projected to the target of good. Our hands guide and direct them. Since it is God that is good, therefore, to God we must direct our children. It should be made known to our children that Christ is the ultimate concept of God and, that through Christ, God gave Himself for the salvation of the world. It is a wild exaggeration and a dangerous expectation to say that Christianity is *not* taught, but simply caught. The Church is in trouble when we fail to raise an Isaac to follow an Abraham. What is your responsibility?

Sermon Preview

"GOD IS OUR COMFORTER"

*"Blessed be God, even the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ,
. . . the God of all comfort." II Corinthians 1:3.*

Our text for this sermon comes from Paul's second letter to the Corinthians. Paul had founded the church at Corinth and then gone on to Ephesus. Word reached him that trouble was at hand in the Corinthian church. Some of the people were living immoral lives; others were critical of Paul's ideas about the gospel and causing factions within "the body of Christ."

As the churches Paul founded suffered, Paul himself suffered, just as a parent suffers when his child is injured. He was crushed to see the church in trouble. He took it to heart and it cut into the basic fabric of his life. Comfort was Paul's greatest need at this time.

So he sat down and wrote a letter, putting everything in perspective, placing his critics in their places, and emphasizing how the love of Christ would adjust the irregularities of living and heal their divisions.

Paul speaks out of personal experience. He has been there, as we say. He was in trouble and the God of comfort came. He has a word for us in our time of hurt and division. May we find strength in knowing "the God of all comfort."
