## Sermon Preview

### COMMUNION MEDITATION

#### "THE FULNESS OF CHRIST"

*"Till we all come . . . unto the measure of the stature of the fullness of Christ."* Ephesians 4:13.

The ambition of St. Paul for himself, and indeed for all Christians, is indeed very high, nothing less in fact than the realization of the state and consciousness of knowing the indwelling Christ. The phrases "in Christ" and "Christ in you" are used for the same great concept. In the verse from Ephesians he enlarges the concept to the "fulness of Christ."

We impose various limits upon Christ, and do not frequently allow his fulness to become real to us. Some of these limitations are intellectual, but more often they are morally based. We hinder and frustrate the grace of God in our lives by our sins. We are slow to surrender our will to Christ, "lest having him we have naught else besides." We fail to understand him not because we are intellectually mature and sophisticated, but rather because we are morally immature and often only sophisticated in a pretentious or even pseudo fashion.

The text suggests progression, and even ascent. To read it is almost to feel the march of pilgrim feet. This is sometimes described as sanctification. Another feature of the text is that it includes a fellowship or group, ". . . till we all."

Is there anyone among us who has received the fulness of Christ? Is there anyone to whom Christ could not mean more? His readiness is apparent throughout the New Testament. Surely all unreadiness is ours, not his. For what do you wait?

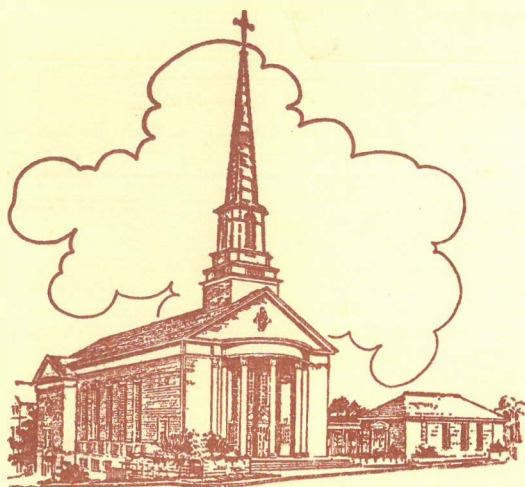

## Sermon Preview

### "THE WHEREABOUTS OF GOD"

*"I dwell in the high and holy place, with him also that is of a contrite and humble spirit."* Isaiah 57:15.

This sermon will be the first of an intermittent series to be preached during January, February and March on the general subject, "Old Testament Questions and New Testament Answers."

Doubtless the question of the whereabouts of God is one of the oldest men have ever asked. It occurs to the naive mind of the child and primitive man, where the deepest philosophy has its origins. It continues to be asked by all whose minds turn to ultimates. It is asked in complaint and derision. "Where is now thy God?" Those in great stress cry out with the question, "O that I knew where I might find him." The question occurs soon or late to all of us, and we need and want an answer.

Fortunately answers have come forth in rich supply, and yet the mystery remains. Ancient religions made their gods more easily available by localizing them, as an Olympus or Sinai. This tendency has never been outgrown, and in the Ark, the Temple, the Sacred Host, and in the over-use of symbols we fluctuate between thinking of him as too far away, as in deism, or too near, as in pantheism.

The answer of our Bible seems to be that God is present throughout his universe, and especially present in some places—in some hearts. Perhaps the best answer to the old question is not so much intellectual as devotional and evangelical, even in our openness, or receptivity, and in our essential commitment.

## Sermon Preview

### "MY BROTHER'S KEEPER"

*"And the Lord said unto Cain, where is Abel thy brother? And he said, I know not: Am I my brother's keeper?"* Genesis 4:9

It is interesting — and disturbing — that the question of responsibility for our brother should arise in this most primitive Biblical context. Ethical considerations are never merely individualistic, and in their very nature are social.

Cain adds lying to killing — a common practice in warfare — and then seeks evasion in cynicism. This question is one of mankind's oldest — "Am I my brother's keeper?" One could say that all the remainder of the Bible is an affirmative answer to his question. We know that the answer is affirmative, but after all these long centuries we are reluctant to answer so in life and deed.

New Testament answers to this Old Testament question? These are abundant; we have multiple choices to the point of being overwhelmed; we must choose among them in order to focus clearly.

Perhaps the Story of the Good Samaritan is the best single New Testament answer. It is our Lord's answer to Cain, and must become ours also.

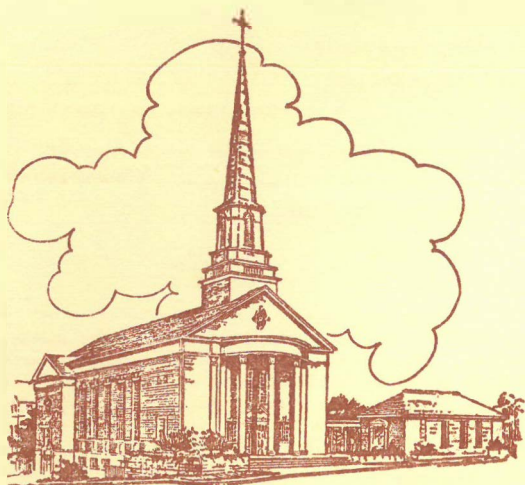
