Sermon Preview

COMMUNION MEDITATION

"OUR LORD'S CONFIDENCE IN US"

"Thou art Simon; thou shalt be called Cephas." John 1:42.

The fact that we are social in our deepest natures is manifest in our great sensitivity to personal acceptance and rejection. Moreover what others think of us in evaluation and confidence is sometimes determinative of what we become. To lose confidence in another is exceeded in painfulness only by another's declared loss of confidence in us.

Jesus brought out the best in persons, and this he did by an open confidence and expectation of the best. He seems always to see the image of God in us even when by our sins we have defaced that image, and to discern our potential for goodness even when our lives are evil. All this seems to be in his changing the name of Simon to Peter, as if by a process of nominal determination plus his confidence in the man he will transform a poor fisherman into a heroic apostle.

As in his confidence in Simon, so for all of us. Jesus never threw anyone away. True, some departed from him, but always by their own choice and never by his rejection. He is gracious and generous with his commendations, appreciative and thoughtful of kind deeds, and ever ready with an encouraging word.

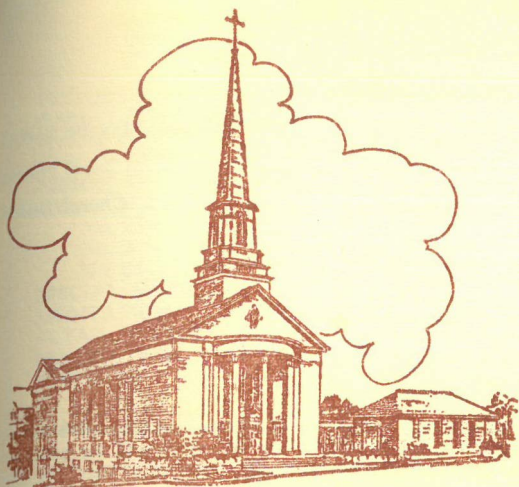

Sermon Preview

"YOU'VE COME A LONG WAY, MAMA!"

"There is neither Jew nor Greek, there is neither slave nor free, there is neither male nor female, for all are one in Christ Jesus." Galatians 3:28.

From Adam's rib to the Queen's throne, from a state of servility to economic power, from the silence of the humbled wife to the political forum, off the pedestal and into the fray, you have indeed "come a long way, baby."

As soon as mere man acknowledges your progress — which he doesn't fully realize yet — he will in his wisdom ask where do you go now? Militant feminism, as do other forms of militancy, frightens the establishment. What are you going to do with your new freedoms, and those you are demanding?

Our Christian faith is concerned. Our Lord gave a large place to women in his ministry. The Apostle Paul was a misogynist in many ways, but his basic theological principles were emancipating for women, as for all. Even the Church, however, has not quite lived up to the great truth that in Christ there is neither male nor female. The full emancipation of woman in our society is not here yet, but nothing is more certain than that it is on the way.

Sermon Preview

"EMPOWERED WITNESSES"

"But you shall receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you shall be my witnesses in Jerusalem and in all Judea and Samaria and to the end of the earth." Acts 1.8.

The New Testament is a book about God's love for men, but it is even more a book about the power of God available to men. To such as received Christ, he gave "power to become the sons of God." The Apostle was not ashamed of the Gospel for he knew it as the "Power of God unto salvation." Illustrations and references could be multiplied.

The doctrine of the Holy Trinity was not so much the result of theological speculation as it was the description of a great experience. They had known God as Father of his people Israel, they discerned in Jesus Christ a uniqueness which demanded the attribution of divinity. The presence of God came upon them with such power that they interpreted the experience as the fulfillment of a longtime promise for the outpouring of his spirit. Thus the Holy Spirit is understood by Christians as the Presence and Power of God.

Both logically and in experience power is to some end. So in the New Testament, where it is the means to many ends. In our text it is the power to witness. This is our theme for Pentecost.

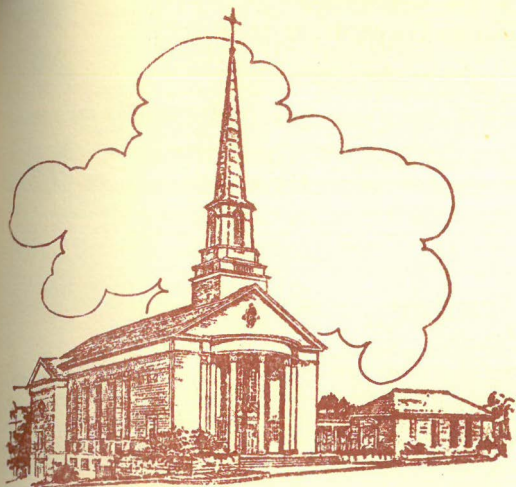

Sermon Preview

"THE INWARD GLOW"

"Did not our hearts burn within us while he talked with us on the road, while he opened to us the scriptures?"

This Sunday is Trinity Sunday in the Church Year and is also the anniversary of John Wesley's Aldersgate experience on May 24, 1738. While one would hardly suggest that John Wesley was not a Christian before Aldersgate, we do know that the great evangelical experience which came to him then certainly transformed him into a new and different person. This strangely warmed heart made incandescent his whole personality, and proved the inexhaustible dynamic for his long and fruitful ministry. The inward glow and the inward assurance became two of the great emphases of Wesleyan preaching and teaching. A large place for both was given in the hymns of Charles Wesley.

Experiences of the past are of greatest value to us when their essence is understandable and reproducible in our own experience. This principle certainly operates as to the value and validity of Biblical experiences, and no less in such an instance as Wesley's strangely warmed heart.

Most would interpret the inward glow as an emotional accompaniment of a realized spiritual grace. So with Wesley, as he seemed to realize. The intensity of such an experience will vary with the temperament of each individual and *per se* is not a test of the reality of the experience. It seems, nevertheless, true that interiorizing is essential to true Christian faith and life.

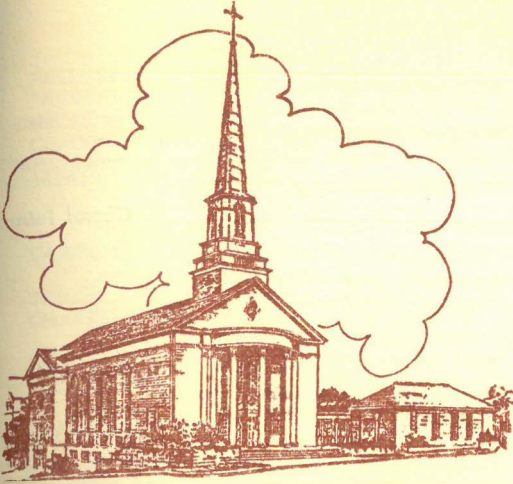
