Sermon Preview

COMMUNION MEDITATION

“THE TRUE BREAD FROM HEAVEN”

Scripture Lesson, John 6.

It is suggested that all of us coming to Communion this Sunday read the entire sixth chapter of the Gospel of John. Direct narrative accounts of the institution of the Lord's Supper are found in the Synoptic Gospels and also in Paul's First Letter to Corinth. In the Gospel of John, however, we have this lengthy, dramatic, and interesting indirect setting for the establishment of this Christian celebration.

The Communion Meditation will consist first of all of a narrative resumé of John 6, followed by focusing on our Lord's Declaration that he is himself the “true bread from heaven.” The Old Testament take-off here is from the episode of the manna from heaven in the Exodus experience. (This illustrates once again the necessity for a knowledge of the Old Testament in order to have an understanding of the New, especially the Gospel of John.)

Our Lord's “I am the bread of life” is one of seven “I am” sayings of his, which are repeated in our Communion Dismissals. Taken together these give us something of a comprehensive insight to the self-understanding Jesus manifested.



—Sermon Preview

“GO AND FIND A MAN”

“Run to and fro through the streets of Jerusalem, look and take note! Search her squares to see if you can find a man, one who does justice and seeks truth; that I may pardon her.”

One of the great lacks of our society today is heroic figures to whom we may look up. There are hardly any such in church, state or nation. In national life there is not one great and outstanding personality around whom our divided nation can rally. In the church we hear often the question, "Where are the great preachers of our day?" Soon we must select many new bishops. Thus far no one emerges of whom it is thought or said, "He just must be made a bishop." What has happened to us? Have we deliberately chosen the security of mediocrity? Has the dimension of heroism gone from our lives?

It seems that it is with us as with Sodom when Abraham prayed for its salvation, and not even ten righteous could be found. Will God find a Moses to lead us out of this wilderness? Is the finding of a man God's way of redemption in our day as it was in ancient times? History teaches us that this is his way of exercising his will in history.

Jeremiah was exceedingly sensitive to the will of God, and could hear him say, "Go and find a man." For us, if we are to be saved, we'd better start looking!



Sermon Preview

"LAMENT FOR MANKIND"

"They have healed the wound of my people lightly, saying 'Peace, Peace,' when there is no peace." Jeremiah 8:11.

Our American society makes its entertainers, especially its funny men, millionaires within a few years. Could it possibly be that a deeper insight would reveal that we are laughing wholesale to keep from crying? And could it just be that as we avoid the blood and sweat necessary for a new world, we are also avoiding the tears, likewise necessary.

In ancient times, especially among the Hebrews, the people, kings and prophets frequently engaged in lament, sometimes loud and long, over the state of things. A large number of the Psalms are laments over prevailing conditions. The wailing wall in Jerusalem is a vestige of this practice.

We modern Americans are prone to hide our deeper ills, even from ourselves. It is possible to live at the surface level and not even know the extent of social phoniness and our involvement in it.

They say that weeping and laughing are not too far apart psychologically. Weeping first, perhaps then we could more healthily laugh, preferably at ourselves. Tears are not an end in themselves, but the concerned and sensitive man can hardly restrain them when he looks honestly at his world today.



Sermon Preview

“OUR GLORIOUS HERITAGE”

On Reading Our Chancel Windows

In response to a continuing and widespread request, the sermon time this Sunday morning is taken up by an introduction to our Chancel windows. It is hoped that a better understanding of these windows will contribute to the enhancement of worship and to a greater appreciation of our glorious heritage.

These windows are arranged in a general trinitarian pattern, and represent, moving from left to right, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Possibly more understandably, we may say that in this same order the windows represent the Old Testament, the New Testament and Church History. The west window should be read from the top downward, the center from the bottom upward, and the east from the top downward.

An overview of the design pattern of the windows will show a repetition of the geometric lay-out of each window. In each window there are three pictorial and symbolic representations of persons and events, centered and larger than other elements. Next each window has four secondary representations in side positions. Then each window has symbols or smaller representations at each corner. Each window thus shows in the goldenized bas relief and in stained glass eleven representations, or thirty-three in all. To understand thoroughly the richness of these windows is to go somewhat deeply into an understanding of our heritage.



Sermon Preview

"IS THE LORD AMONG US OR NOT?"

"Behold, I will stand before you there on the rock of Horeb; and you shall strike the rock, and water shall come out of it, that the people may drink. And Moses did so, in the sight of the elders of Israel. And he called the name of the place Massah and Meribah because of the faultfinding of the children of Israel, and because they put the Lord to the proof by saying, 'Is the Lord among us or not?'" Exodus 17:6-7.

The title for this sermon is in the form of a question and the question is asked out of a lack of faith. The people had threatened the leadership of Moses because they doubted his ability and because they feared God was no longer among them. The going had been rough and the people were tired. Perhaps they had good reasons for their doubts and fears. Moses was leading them in a roundabout way to the promised land. They were traveling through the wilderness. Men, women and children were thirsty. Certainly questions were in the minds of the Israelites.

"Why did you bring us and our children and our cattle out of Egypt, to kill us and our children and our cattle with thirst?"

Moses found positive answers to the questions of his people. However, he found these answers, not easily, but with a struggle. He depended on God for a specific purpose for his people, a definite challenge they would overcome, and continued guidance in ways and means of fulfilling their purpose and overcoming their challenge. It was Moses' faith in God that he was able to answer his people in a positive manner.

Today, right now, how can we know positively, God is among us? Does Moses have an answer to this desperate century?
