COMMUNION MEDITATION

"THE RENEWAL OF OUR HOPE"

"Lift up now thine eyes, and look from the place where thou art, northward, and southward, and eastward, and westward." Genesis 13:14.

This verse of Scripture is the word of God spoken to Abraham as a part of the promise to enter into the Promised Land and know an expanded life. It may be well removed from this context and given relevance to our own situation.



Sermon Preview

"WHEN PUSH COMES TO SHOVE"

"And fearing that we might run on the rocks, they let out four anchors from the stern, and prayed for day to come."

Acts 27:29

There is no doubt that we are in the midst of a disturbance of great extent and as yet unknown depth. One can hardly select an area of our life where such elements as uneasiness, threat, ferment, and even turbulence and revolution cannot be found. Only a few years ago we were considering how to cope with our rapidly changing society, now we are concerned about moral deterioration, social disruption, and possible severe repressive measures to counter some of these.

As Christians we like to think of ourselves as always on the offensive, making the "redemptive thrust," as we like to say it. But now we are thrown on the defensive, not simply to protect our beliefs and our institutions, but the very system of meaning and values by which we live, and on which our society has been built.

The story in Acts of a storm at sea and the drama enacted on board the ship bound for Rome with St. Paul as prisoner will be used as an analogy for us in the living of these days.



Sermon Preview

“SAINTS AMONG SOPHISTICATES”

Scripture — Acts 17:16-32

Saint Paul among the assorted cosmopolites and sophisticates in Athens is not the most admirable of his evangelistic endeavors. Yet the episode has in it many of those elements found in our current secularized and urbanized culture. Here is a New Testament setting easily transposed to our own situation when we seek to speak the gospel amidst the currents of competing ideologies.

Present among the multitudes were “Jews and devout persons.” Also remnants of the declining “Epicurean and Stoic philosophies.” Those moderns who are so enamored of now have their prototypes in the Athenians and foreigners who “spent their time in nothing except telling or hearing something new.” The apostle’s spirit was justly provoked when “he saw that the whole city was full of idols.”

History does indeed repeat itself! And it is still not easy to blend Jerusalem and Athens into one. Philosophy and theology remain separate disciplines, the sermon and the lecture require different rhetoric. Creative encounters between saint and sophisticate require no small doing on the part of both. Paul’s Athenian adventure was not after all a total failure. When the saint makes his witness he must not forget the sophisticates, who may also be sinners.



Sermon Preview

“WHICH ONE IS YOU?”

Scripture Lesson, Luke 10:25-37.

In the story of the Good Samaritan we are more likely to identify ourselves with the priest, the Levite or with the Samaritan. This sermon will attempt to lead to identifications also with the man “who fell among robbers” and with the robbers who “stripped him and beat him, and departed, leaving him half dead.”

A sermon I heard as a young man used the following easy to remember outline:

- I. “What Is Thine Is Mine” — Robbers.
- II. “What Is Mine Is Mine” — Priest and Levite.
- III. “What Is Mine Is Thine” — Samaritan.

Except for the exclusion of the victim, who is designated only “a man,” that is any man, the simple outline provides us with a workable approach for the development of a sermon.

Within the spread of this parable we are able to entertain several of the pressing problems of our times. Each one present will be invited to identify with each character, or imaginatively to enter each role, especially with the first two, Victim and Robber, as unaccustomed and more difficult identifications.
