Sermon Preview

COMMUNION MEDITATION "LABORERS FOR HIS HARVEST"

"Pray therefore the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest." Luke 10:2.

Scripture Lesson — Luke 10:1-2.

This admonition of our Lord is directed to the seventy who are sent out two by two "into every town and place where he himself was about to come." He observes that "the harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few."

The awakening of our Christian lay people to their true place in the Church and Kingdom is surely one of the more promising avenues of Church renewal. Even in Protestantism, which professes the priesthood of all believers, we have developed a degree of clericalism which greatly contributes to our failure in vitality, witness and effectiveness.

On this day when we turn from the easier weeks of the summer to the demands of the fall and winter season, it seems appropriate that we worship together in terms of our responsibilities for Church and Kingdom. Coming to Communion becomes for each one a renewal of Commitment to Christ and his Church.

Sermon Preview

“RETURN TO YOUR OWN HOUSE!”

“Return to your home, and declare how much God has done for you.” Luke 8:39.

The New Testament setting for this Sunday’s sermon is the story of the healing of the Gerasene demoniac, who named himself “Legion,” to show how “many demons had entered him.” This is one of the more interesting and dramatic of the healing episodes in the ministry of Jesus.

It would be an interesting experience, at least for the preacher, to give an exposition of this entire narrative. For our present purpose, however, we choose a particular offer and response of the whole encounter.

The healing completed, now “clothed and in his right mind,” with great new vistas before him, the man comes to Jesus and requests that he might leave his home village and go away with Jesus. The reply of Jesus is simply, “Return to your home, and declare how much God has done for you.” This reply provides the theme of the message.

The place of witness is everywhere. Every human situation may become a microcosm of the kingdom. Every human relationship provides opportunities for redemptive living. Christ indeed calls and sends every believer, and sometimes to great roles on small stages.



Sermon Preview

"MY BODY — NOBODY'S BUSINESS!"

"Do you not know that your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit within you, which you have from God? You are not your own; you were bought with a price. So glorify God in your body."

I Corinthians 6:19-20.

Many strange new doctrines are being set forth and spread among us in these days, especially in the area of personal ethics. Quite the most startling, threatening, and fallacious of these is that enunciated in the declaration, "My body belongs to me, and it is nobody's business what I do with it." Apparently this doctrine is one of the strange excesses of the "rights" movements now rife among us. It is sometimes promoted by self-styled super sophisticates as an evidence of their emancipation. Unfortunately it has seeped down to teen-agers, and is sometimes shouted in defiance to parents.

This doctrine, with its sanction of supposed sophistication, is put to the practical uses of justifying sexual indulgence, drug and alcohol use, suicide and a general life style.

This dangerous doctrine is easily countered at the levels of common sense, of psychology, and of a reasonable ethics. While these levels will be mentioned in the sermon, the basic approach will proceed from a distinctive Christian point of view, and particularly from the text from St. Paul.
