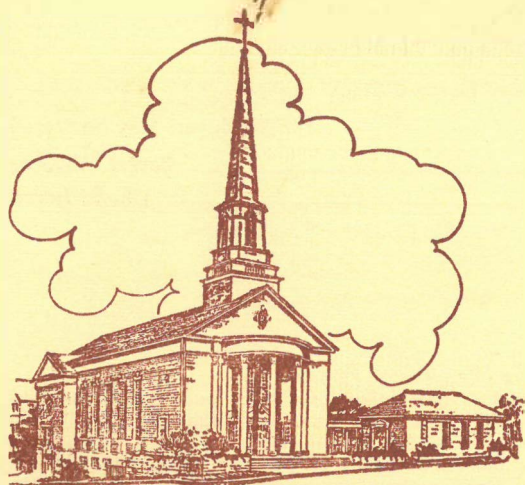

Sermon Preview

"GOD'S YES MAN"

"For all the promises of God find their Yes in him."

II Corinthians 1:20.

This insightful explanation of Christ as God's mighty Yes to man is taken from a paragraph in which the Apostle skilfully uses the historical-theological argument to justify and sustain his gospel message. We will begin with him in this setting and take a brief look at the New Testament story against the background of the great Old Testament experience. As Jesus himself said that he came not to destroy the law and the prophets, but to complete, we see the gospel act in the larger setting of the drama of the divine redemption.

The text is certainly applicable in an even larger setting of life, and the sermon will use this approach to help us to see Christ as God's great Yes to man's greatest questions and problems. He is indeed preeminently God's YES MAN to us.

It is interesting and helpful to us how easily we may fit this understanding of Christ into other concepts of the New Testament. St. John calls him the Word of God; here St. Paul tells us that this word is Yes. The writer of Hebrews tells us that in these last days God has spoken unto us by his Son; the word he speaks is Yes.

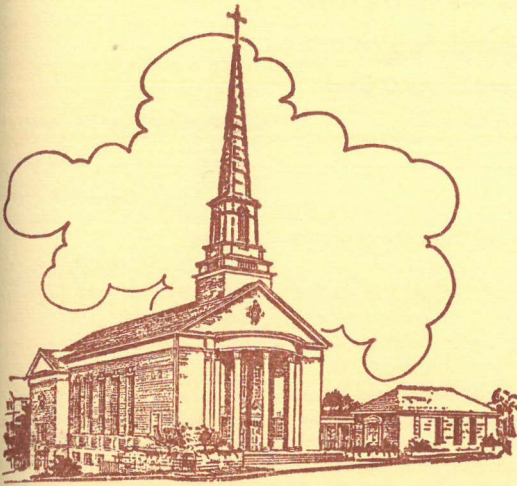

Sermon Preview

"THE WITNESS OF ASSURANCE"

"I know whom I have believed, and am persuaded that he is able to keep that which I have committed unto him against that day." II Timothy 1:12.

This great affirmation of Christian faith becomes even more meaningful to us when we understand that it is a word of witness and encouragement from an older Christian to a younger friend and colleague. The great apostle is nearing the end of his heroic and fruitful apostolate. He does not know really the greatness of his contribution to the Church and Kingdom. But he does know the depth of his commitment and the reality of Christ for his personal life. To this realization he testifies to Timothy in this great verse, which we turn today into his testimony to all of us.

The first observation we make is what the verse says about St. Paul himself, which we have already noted. The second is his great confidence in the reliability of his Lord. The third is his explanation of the relationship between a believing, trusting Christian and Christ. The statement "he is able to keep that which I have committed unto him" literally translated reads "he is able to guard my deposit."

Sermon Preview

"WHEREWITH SHALL I COME BEFORE THE LORD?"

*"With what shall I come before the Lord and bow myself
before God on high?" Micah 6:8a.*

Central to all religion is some form of prayer or worship, some encounter between the devotee and his God. In some instances there is a divine intrusion into a generally secular setting, as the appearance of God to Moses in the burning bush. In most instances man is the seeker, with the settings ranging from the simplest individual prayer to an elaborate ceremonial, as in High Mass. Architecturally this range runs from a rustic outdoor altar to a grand and glorious cathedral.

Man so desires the favor of God that he has sometimes contrived to get this by his own devices, even resorting to forms of cajolery to obtain the divine presence. It seems inevitable also that men confuse means and ends and become lost in forms and symbolism, seeking often to recover from felt emptiness by further elaboration and enrichment.

The purification of worship was a major concern of the prophets and also of Jesus. This remains a major objective for all who design and lead services of worship and for all who worship in public.

Out of scriptural teachings and our common sense and common needs this sermon will seek to find the reality of worship for the Christian of today. It is no accident that liturgical reform is one of the strong currents in the larger movement of Church renewal.

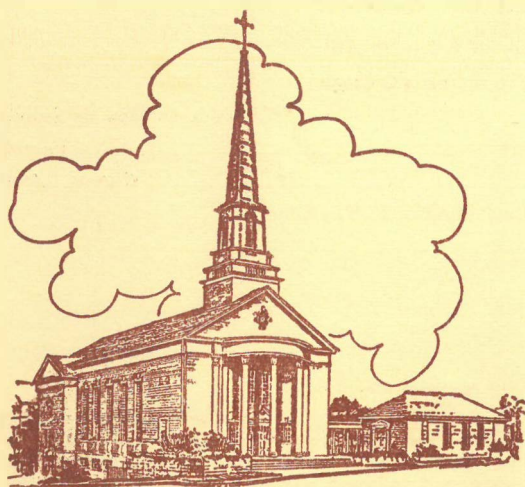

Sermon Preview

"WHO, ME?"

"Who am I that I should go to Pharaoh, and bring the sons of Israel out of Egypt?" Exodus 3:11.

It has been observed that one's real religious faith begins at the point where one realizes that God knows one's name. Another way of observing the same truth is that the first religious idea and feeling is that God is directly, immediately and personally interested in and concerned for a particular individual, me, or you.

When God called to Moses out of the burning bush to lay a tremendous commission upon him, it is no wonder he was thrown into some consternation, and responded with the ancient equivalent of the modern "Who, me?" Great Bible leaders often feel this same astonishment at God's selection. Many persons with a strong sense of Christian vocation think "the Lord has laid his hands on me."

Prior to the vocational element is the even deeper individualizing of the essential religious relationship, seen in many Biblical encounters between God and a human being, as, for instance, Jacob wrestling when he was "left alone at midnight." It appears that the deepening of religious faith lies primarily in its individualizing.
