Sermon Preview

COMMUNION MEDITATION

"ABUNDANT LIFE IN CHRIST"

"I came that they may have life, and have it abundantly."
John 10:10b.

My first attempt at preaching a full length sermon was based on this text. It is still easy to understand how these words of our Lord would appeal to an undergraduate candidate for the ministry. But as I recall the sermon now it must have been rather weak, for I failed to distinguish between general enrichment of life and the peculiar nature of enrichment in Christ.

Later on and early in my ministry I used the text again for a sermon under the title "On Being Alive." I still have the outline in my files. On examining it, I think my second attempt also failed to do justice to the text.

Now out of a richer personal experience and a better understanding of the New Testament, I realize that in both instances I lifted the words out of their essential New Testament setting and gave them another setting of a more personal and general nature. I know now that I must bring into an interpretation of these words the basic theme of the Gospel of John which is Life in Christ. I know also that the concept of being "in Christ" or knowing "Christ in us" will add to my understanding and interpretation of these words of our Lord.



Sermon Preview

"THE SIXTH COMMANDMENT EXPANDED II"

"Thou shalt not kill." Exodus 20:13.

"Do not suppose that I have come to abolish the law and the prophets; I did not come to abolish but to complete."

Matthew 5:17(NEB).

The interest and response to the sermon "The Sixth Commandment Expanded," delivered on January 24th has called forth an additional development of the same theme. It is indeed remarkable how alive and relevant this Sixth Commandment has become in our day. The cheapening of human life in so many ways is certainly a prime factor in our widespread moral deterioration.

Almost all our ethical frontiers these days are located in the human physiological life line. These include such matters as contraception, abortion, laboratory experiments with living human beings, the care of the suffering and dying, euthanasia, etcetera, as well as capital punishment and war. We must follow our Lord in "completing" the commandment by applying it to the quality of all our human relations.

We must follow Jesus also in the "inwardizing" of this Commandment, since motive is in our "inward parts" and since all relationships and all acts proceed from within.

Sermon Preview

“FINDING REALITY IN RELIGIOUS LIVING”

“But the word is very near you; it is in your mouth and in your heart, so that you can do it.” Deuteronomy 30:14.

One of the most widespread phenomena of current religious life is the search for vital experiences of the divine reality. This search is sometimes described as the charismatic movement. It carries a heavy element of pentecostalism, and seeks to manifest the “gift of the Spirit” in healing, speaking in tongues, and other forms of spiritual immediacy and ecstasy.

Fortunately for those Christians who seek to evaluate this and other related movements, we have a long experience and a wide context into which to place such phenomena, and thus to find a setting which provides perspective.

The two related passages of our Scripture lesson today provide us with a basis for approaching our religious thought, experience and living in terms of the near, the normal and the readily available, rather than in terms of the marginal, the unusual and the esoteric.

The sermon will emphasize that genuine, deep and saving religious experience is “not far from us,” and that it is erroneous to assume that spiritual reality and vitality are only to be found in the strange and occult.


