Sermon Preview

COMMUNION MEDITATION

"A SENSE OF BEGINNING AGAIN"

"Brethren, I do not consider that I have made it my own; but one thing I do, forgetting what lies behind and straining forward to what lies ahead, I press on toward the goal for the prize of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus."

Philippians 3:13, 14.

This personal affirmation of St. Paul is frequently, and appropriately, used as a text for New Year's Services. It is found in a paragraph in which the Apostle is thinking of possessing Christ or being possessed of Christ. The King James Version uses the word "apprehend," in the sense of "catching up with" or "getting hold of," as when a law enforcement officer "apprehends" an offender.

To become Christian is more correctly understood as being found of God rather than finding God, although the two concepts are not opposites, and certainly not mutually exclusive.

St. Paul regards the Christian life as a race for a very great prize. He is *on his way* to something very great indeed. In modern terms we would think in terms of process, and understand something of the dynamics of the relationship he has with his Lord. Involved here also is the great Christian concept of sanctification.



Sermon Preview

“WHICH WAY FROM HERE?”

“... meanwhile let us go forward on the road that has brought us to where we are.” Philippians 3:16b (Jerusalem Bible).

Things in general do seem to be settling down a bit. Some of us have already started breathing sighs of relief, long hoped for. But the wish may be giving rise to the thought, and we could be somewhat premature in our anticipations of stabilization.

Yes, there is still revolution in the air — and in the minds and hearts and souls of men. Even if we succeed in braking runaway movements and restraining more eager, especially violent-minded revolutionaries, we must still recognize the need and inevitability of change. Indeed our restraint of too rapid and unacceptable change obligates us to assume responsibility for change, even to become ourselves what nowadays are called “change agents.”

Many of us of Christian persuasion believe that we not only must not break away from our past, but must proceed toward change on the basis of the substance and motivation we have in essential New Testament Christianity. In this heritage we have the sufficient dynamic and in the concept of the Kingdom of Heaven we have a pattern. The Jerusalem Bible version of Philippians 3:16b gives us an interesting rule of procedure.



Sermon Preview

“CHRISTIAN LIFE STYLE, NOW AND THEN”

“As therefore you received Christ Jesus the Lord, so live in him, rooted and built up in him and established in the faith, just as you were taught, abounding in thanksgiving.”

Colossians 2:6, 7. *RSY*

One hears often these days the term “life style,” used in various contexts, and usually with a qualifying adjective. Our Lenten Lectures this year are to be under the heading, “Christian Life Style in the Decade of the Seventies.” If there is a concept reflecting substance in the general term, it is well to consider our “Christian Life Style.”

All sorts of thoughts surface when one entertains this concept. The first, and most persistent one, is whether the life style of Christian people changes with the times or remains essentially the same. The answer comes without much tarrying that essentially it remains the same.

This essentiality is historical and theological. We are “a colony of heaven.” We are “in the world, but not of the world.” We are rooted in the timeless, and when “change and decay” are all about us, we seek and find those things which abide.

Texts for our theme abound. To give us better focus we have selected one from St. Paul, hoping to make it meaningful.

Sermon Preview

"THE SIXTH COMMANDMENT EXPANDED"

"*Thou shalt not kill.*" Exodus 20:13.

As regards the Ten Commandments, we are strict reductionists! This appears both in our interpretation and in our obedience. We like to think that obedience proceeds from interpretation, but it is more likely that we explain downward to the level of our willingness to observe.

This pattern is quite easily discernible in our understanding and usage of the Commandment, "Thou shalt not kill." Former generations, even theologians, reduced the commandment to mean only "Thou shall do no murder," using the Cain-Abel episode as the essential pattern. This excluded such killings as we do in capital punishment and in warfare, thus letting us down to a level of fairly comfortable justification.

We are in a time of the devaluation of human life. Since the worth of a person is the keystone in our Christian ethical system, we must counter the trend toward cheapening life by strong and forthright theological support of this basic concept and practice.

One way to do this is to reverse the common reductionist interpretation and move upward to an expanded understanding and application of the Sixth Commandment. Fortunately, our Lord in the Sermon on the Mount, has long ago given us one of the primary directions for this larger and deeper understanding of the words, "Thou shalt not kill."
