Sermon Preview

COMMUNION MEDITATION

“POWER WITH PURPOSE”

“But to all who received him, who believed in his name, he gave power to become children of God.” John 1:12.

The New Testament is indeed a book about power—the power of God in the lives of human beings. Power is in the presence of God; power is imparted to those who receive Him by the living Christ; the Holy Spirit is indeed according to the New Testament best understood as the Power and Presence of God available to men.

Some Christian people become seekers of power for its own sake, or for the sake of some ecstatic and dramatic experience. Others seem to think of spiritual power in terms of the unusual and miraculous.

The observation of the Gospel of John in its great prologue may be taken as a basic in our understanding of power. Christ imparts his power to those who receive him in order that they may “become children of God.”

The idea of “becoming” is a key word for our understanding of spiritual power. The dull man is sensitized; the slow man is quickened; the bad man is made good; the good man is made better; and all together we become sons and daughters of God.

Sermon Preview

“SOMETIMES I'M UP, SOMETIMES I'M DOWN”

“But he himself (Elijah) went a day's journey into the wilderness, and came and sat down under a broom tree; and he asked that he might die. . . .” I Kings 19:4.

The story of Elijah running away from Jezebel to Horeb, and to the “still small voice” is one of the great narratives of the Old Testament. Elijah must have been something of a manic-depressive. He had gone from his “high” in the victory over the priests of Baal by way of Jezebel’s threat on his life to his “low” of despondency and suicidal wishes when he came to rest under the broom tree.

From that point on the story is one of recovery, recovery from this despondent “low” to restoration to a level of normalcy and to divinely guided re-orientation to his prophetic mission.

The elements in the process of recovery seem quite modern. First he ate a big dinner, activating psychosomatic factors. At Horeb, a true retreat experience, he was led to see his situation in a larger context. Also, here he learned that things were not nearly so bad as he had declared out of his despondency. The “still small voice” also ordered him to anoint his successor in prophetic office, letting him down somewhat at ego level, but lifting him in prophetic commitment.

ABOUT THE ANTHEM

Johan Helmich Roman, sometimes called "the Swedish Bach," was born in Stockholm in 1694 and died in 1758, so that his life span parallels that of the giant Baroque musicians, Bach and Handel. Besides adapting works by important composers of his time for performance in Sweden, he wrote a large number of original compositions, many for church use, and has been called "the Father of Swedish music."



Sermon Preview

"AND IT WAS WINTER"

Those who study scripture, and study it carefully, find phrases that throw an interesting sidelight upon the character of Jesus. We usually think of Christ as being surrounded by the poor people, his disciples, or as One walking, talking and healing among the soul-starved people. But here is a different scene. "And it was winter. And Jesus walked in the temple in Solomon's porch." (John 10:22, 23.)

We don't know the exact month, but it was probably about this time of year and the winter rainstorms had arrived from the Mediterranean. As we glimpse the temple court through the driving rain, we see a lonely figure on the porch of Solomon, seeking refuge from the penetrating cold. Christ had left the sunshine of Galilee to find the coldness and loneliness of the city of Jerusalem.

"And it was winter." But it was not the wind which made the winter for Jesus. It was not the rainstorms that brought on the coldness and loneliness of Jesus. It was the icy hostility of man. Christ had come face to face with the cold ingratitude of city man! And it was winter.



Sermon Preview

“CHRISTIAN DIMENSIONS OF SUCCESS”

“For what does it profit a man, to gain the whole world and forfeit his life?” Mark 8:36.

“... for a man’s life does not consist in the abundance of his possessions.” Luke 12:15.

We generally agree that the desire for success and its diligent pursuit are normal. One who relishes his failures we regard as psychopathic. The “American Way of Life” certainly has personal success as one of its main ingredients, and even the sanction of religion is assumed to justify our position.

The greater our shock then that our young people are so widely challenging the success syndrome of our culture. They seem to have penetrated our consciences and awakened our consciousness. It seems more than appropriate that we look at success from the standpoint of Christian faith.

When we look at success analytically we discover two primary elements, *accumulation* and *recognition*. Superficially *accumulation* seems more effective, but a closer look will reveal that *recognition* has a deeper place in human personality. It is true of course that they are found inextricably inter-related.

The point of intersection where the Christian gospel meets the human drive for success must mean either new direction for that drive or some dilution of the gospel.
