Sermon Preview

WORLD-WIDE COMMUNION SUNDAY

“DRAW NEAR WITH FAITH”

The oldest cult form of Christianity is the Lord's Supper, instituted by our Lord himself. Its Biblical antecedent is the Passover, observed in celebration of Exodus by faithful Jews everywhere. In the context of faith the Lord's Supper is central, central as worship, as commitment, and as a lively means of grace.

In spite of its antiquity and centrality, Christians differ greatly in their understanding and usage of the Lord's Table. The range of difference runs from the Memorial Service only to High Mass and Real Presence. Historically and theologically we are in the middle ranges of the spectrum.

As one grows older and openness becomes a way of life, one becomes not only tolerant but receptive to different forms and levels of Holy Communion. This is possible because the vital ingredient from the human point of view is the faith response of the individual. This will vary from person to person; of two communicants kneeling together one may be going through conventional forms while the other may be sensing the very presence of the Living Lord.

The key seems to be in the words of the invitation, “Draw near with faith.”



Sermon Preview

"WHO MAKES OUR AGENDA?"

"Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you; and lo, I am with you always, to the close of the age."

Two or three years ago I heard a speaker say, "The world will make the agenda for the Church during the remainder of this century." My reaction was one of understanding, and even appreciation, but with some feeling that the statement was leaving out something of primary importance. That something is that we move into the world, whatever its condition and needs, with a given, namely the Christian Gospel. Therefore, the number one item on our agenda is our apostolate, our sentness by the SENT ONE.

But I reflect solitarily that I must not too quickly give hostage to some form of pietistic otherworldliness whose almost only undertaking is to save souls from the evils of this vale of tears. There is a wise adaptiveness of our message and ministry to prevailing needs of mankind. For our example we have nothing less than our Lord himself, whose compassion for the suffering of human beings has hardly been reached even by the most charitable and social minded among us.

Certainly the world gets its high place on our agenda. Our ministry is this two-dimensional, the given of God and the needs of men, which may be called the theological and the sociological. The Christian and the Church are "in-between," the redemptive bridge to carry the compassion of Christ to the hurts of men.



Sermon Preview

“LIVING WITH CHANGE”

“Because they have no changes, therefore they fear not God.” Psalm 55:19b (KJV)

Some of us are having a hard time with the pace of change in our day. We are not prepared for so many quickly emerging happenings and we suffer from what one writer calls “future shock.” Tomorrow becomes today before we are ready.

One’s reaction to change will vary with age, temperament, social and economic position, education and other factors. Quite common among us is resistance to change, and often when resistance is ineffective we manifest unhappy resignation, and sometimes seek withdrawal and irresponsibility, with occasional bitterness.

Perhaps most of us need to do a bit of shifting in our basic set of mind, managing to accept both the inevitability and desirability of change. Genuine Christian experience and faith really should produce an openness in us in mind and spirit, even to the point of viewing the changing nature of things as opportunity for creative and redemptive improvement.

The Christian may thus see himself as a “change agent,” a partner with God, as recent sermons have affirmed, in both the creative and redemptive process.

Sermon Preview

"OPENNESS AS A WAY OF LIFE"

"But Jesus said, Do not forbid him. . . . For he that is not against us is for us." Mark 9:39, 40.

In order to understand openness as a way of life it will be helpful to find examples of closedness. Although such abound, past and present, in Scripture and out, perhaps our best selection will be the Pharisees. Surely their way of life, patterns of thought and attitude toward other ways of thought demonstrate classic closedness. Furthermore their conflict with Jesus was in its essence a conflict between their closedness and his openness, and especially at the point where his generosity threatened their proud exclusiveness.

But we mustn't place too much burden upon the poor Pharisees, lest our very chastisement of them become a substitute for the examination of our own minds. Pharisaism, especially in its closedness and exclusiveness, is unfortunately a tendency of the human mind, a sort of occupational hazard of the religionist and the moralist. We are all subject to it.

When we look for an example of openness, we are most fortunate to find it at the very highest level, even Jesus himself. The gospels abound in incidents which manifest his generosity and inclusiveness.

Thus are we able to build on good foundation a strong case for openness as a Christian mind and spirit, even as a way of life.

Sermon Preview

"LOYALTY AS A WAY OF LIFE"

He said to him the third time, "Simon, Son of John, do you love me?" Peter was grieved because he said to him the third time, "Do you love me?" And he said to him, "Lord you know everything; you know that I love you." Jesus said to him, "Feed my sheep." John 21:17.

As there are no panaceas for our physical afflictions, there seems to be none for our social ills. But if one could write a series of prescriptions for these latter ills, the first would surely be the restoration of personal loyalty as a way of life.

The skillful diagnostician looks at our society and says, "Thou ailest here and here and here." There is widespread breakdown of confidence, both among us as persons and in many of our basic commitments. The remedy is loyalty, which is itself a compound of love and duty.

There is a certain prevailing cheapness in our assorted life commitments, manifesting itself in marriage, church membership, patriotism and other relationships. The source of this devastating cheapness appears to be in flaws of character, some of it of psychopathic depths.

Where do we go from here? There is widespread awakening to the great threats to mankind, war, pollution, poverty. In our mobilization to save our civilization, we must not forget the moral and spiritual factors.
