Sermon Preview

COMMUNION MEDITATION

"LORD, NOT MY FEET ONLY"

"Then, Lord," said Simon Peter, "not my feet only; wash my hands and head as well." John 13:9 (NEB).

Let us come to Holy Communion this Lord's Day with ready openness to the offer of God for grace and strength for every time of need. Let us learn and follow the mind of St. Paul who declared "I do not frustrate the grace of God."

So many among us need to be awakened from our spiritual slumber. It is dangerous to level out in our spiritual pilgrimage, whose essential nature is ascent. There remain many rungs on Jacob's Ladder our hands have not grasped and our feet have not reached. To the one who thinks, feels or says, "I am good enough," the appropriate response is "How good is good enough?" The religious life is not static, however deeply rooted and established, but dynamic and moving ever onward and upward toward the potential of the soul and the beckoning of heaven. There is a destiny in our lives: we came from God, and at last we return to God. Here in earthly time and circumstance, we are still in a movement of that destiny, wherein all time and all circumstance become sacramental, and mediate to us the presence and grace of God.

To the child who asked her pastor-teacher, "What are we supposed to be doing when we kneel at Holy Communion?" the reply simply was, "Pray, mostly just pray." This is also the answer for all of us. And of course one's prayers will vary with each individual, but the best general suggestion is that we are to pray with deep openness, openness of mind, heart, soul, and body; and openness to God, to the Living Christ, to the Holy Spirit, and to every outpouring of divine grace; an openness which responds to God's readiness.

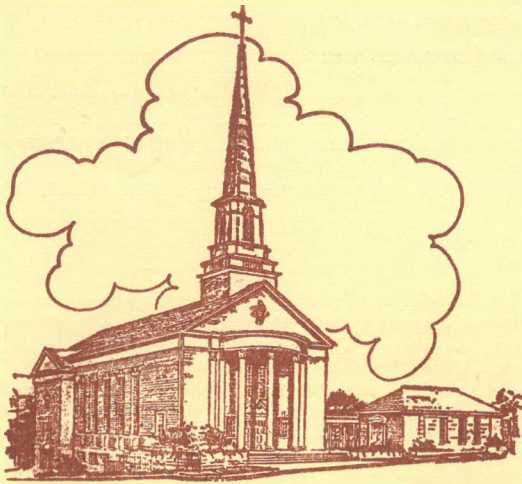

Sermon Preview

"WHO, ME?" "YES, YOU!"

"Now you are the body of Christ, and members in particular." I Corinthians 12:27.

There is no doubt that the greatest explanation of the Christian Church in all Scripture and in all history is St. Paul's forthright designation of the Church as the *Body of Christ*. Whether one takes this only as an illuminating metaphor or as a statement of theological reality, it is certainly of the greatest importance to the Christian—a great explanation by a great explainer.

Now the Church at Corinth was anything but a *body*, lacking the essential of togetherness, and even fragmented by party groupings, egocentric strivings, false beliefs and open sins. The Apostle knew full well that the ideal could not be realized without the healing of minds, spirits and relationships. He emphasizes the particularity of the membership of each one toward the realization of the ideal.

The situation at Corinth is repeated over and over in Christian history. The Body of Christ is rent asunder by the egocentricities of its individual and family units. The instrument of divine redemption is blunted by the indifference of its members. The witness of Christ's Church is muted by the timidity, lethargy and silence of its formal adherents.

In the text the great Apostle points at each of us. "Who, Me?" "Yes, You!"

Sermon Preview

"THE RESTORATION OF EDEN"

"My Father is working still, and I am working." John 5:17.

The story of creation in the first chapter of the Bible includes God's first assignments to man, to "have dominion over the fish of the sea and over the birds of the air and over every living thing that moves upon the earth." This ancient doctrine of man's dominion over nature is coming home to us now in the great ecological concern of thoughtful men, especially in the painful realization that we have neither glorified the Creator nor served his creation in our carrying out of the assignment.

One of the dimensions of vital theological consideration in our day is that of our fresh understanding of the divine creation, of our own creaturehood, and of man's place in nature and in ongoing creation. We have abundant resources for this element of renewal in Scripture, in tradition and in clear thought. Our Lord himself lived and thought as one wholly at home in his Father's World. To mention only two of his followers, Francis of Assisi and Albert Schweitzer, we learn our place in God's creation from saints and philosophers.

This divine assignment of dominion over nature — how responsible, how challenging, how threatening! Partners with God in his ongoing Creation! Earth might be fair once again, if man can ungird his technology with a reasonable and workable theology of creation.

Sermon Preview

"THE SENT ONE and the Sent Ones"

"As the Father has sent me, even so I send you." John 20:21.

While the Bible begins with the story of Creation and features the Divine Creation in many places, especially in the Psalms, its primary theme, running like a golden strand from Genesis to Revelation, is Divine Redemption. While the redemptive purpose of God seems to include all creation and all history, its real focus is upon mankind and upon individual human beings. We have spoken of Christianity as a religion of "personal salvation" as one of the ways of understanding God's redemptive purpose in history.

While the Old Testament carries strongly the understanding of God as interfering in history and in the lives of people, seeking always to ransom (redeem) his people from sin and darkness, the New Testament presents in highly dramatic form the ultimate in God's "sentness" to men.

The brief text from the Gospel of John suggests to us that our own "sentness" proceeds directly from that of Christ. As we dare to believe that we are partners with God in the creative process, we are bold to believe that we may be partners with Christ in the divine redemptive purpose.
