



I bought a book of songs a while ago—*Songs of Sydney Carter in the Present Tense*. One song is entitled, “Present Tense.” It’s a plea for a religion that is not trapped in tradition; it’s an appeal for a faith that is alive to the present. Yet, like so many other calls to renewal in religion it is one-sided. Here’s one verse of his song:

“The living truth  
Is what I long to see;  
I cannot lean  
upon what used to be

So shut the Bible up  
And show me how  
The Christ you talk about  
Is living now.”

I sympathize with his longing for a present tense faith. The Church does need to show to the world the living Christ. Probably all of us stand in the endless line with those Greeks who came to the disciple Philip saying, “We would see Jesus” (John 12:21).

But there is a naivete that slams shut the door on any possibility for anything but a superficial and distorted Christian experience in the entreaty, “So shut the Bible up . . .”

The Christian Faith differs from all the religions in the world in that it is an HISTORICAL FAITH. That is, we believe in a God who acts in the happenings of history, and supremely in that particular Event we know as Jesus Christ. The Christian Faith is not basically a philosophy, nor a code of ethics, nor a set of teachings, but a relationship with God as God has expressed Himself in history in the Man Jesus. And the only place we can turn to verify our Christian experience (to determine whether or not it is a CHRISTian experience), and the only place we can turn for a description of the Jesus of history and the Christ of the earliest Church is the New Testament. So, “to shut the Bible up” would be to attempt the impossible—to try to produce the fruits of the Christian life while cut off from the roots of Christian understanding.

I had a professor in school who used to say, “Remember, the Christian Faith is theocentric, Christonormative, and bibliobasic.” In other words it is center in God as God has revealed Himself in Jesus Christ whose life is proclaimed in the testimony of the Scriptures.

WOULD YOU LIKE TO DO SOME REAL BIBLE STUDY? The reason I say "real" Bible study is because so much that goes on under the guise of Bible study is not BIBLE study at all. — Often it is nothing more than reading a book about the Bible or listening to a preacher (or layman) telling you what HE sees in the Bible. No, commentaries about the Bible have their place. (So do preachers, sometimes.) But when they stand between you and the Bible, they are apt to be walls rather than windows.

When I want to enjoy one of these flamboyant Florida sunsets, I want to go somewhere and see it for myself; I don't want to just read somebody else's description of it. Of course, descriptions have their place. Years ago I read a description of a sunset that went something like this: "I've dreamed of sunsets when the sun supine, lay rocking on the ocean like a god; and threw his weary arms far up the sky; and with vermillion-tinted fingers, toyed with the long tresses of the evening star." A description like that has helped me to appreciate more deeply what I see when the sun goes down; but I would not want those words or any others to be a substitute for the thrilling sight of a sunset first-hand.

Right now I am in the process of writing out a list of questions that have come out of my reading of the Gospel of Mark. These questions serve as a guide. There is some interpretation of the Gospel in the way the questions are asked. **BUT I AM DOING MY BEST TO DESIGN THE QUESTIONS IN A WAY THAT WILL ENABLE YOU TO GO INTO MARK AND HAVE A FIRST HAND EXPERIENCE OF GOD SPEAKING TO YOU THROUGH THE MAN WHO STANDS CENTER-STAGE THERE AND THROUGH THE SAYINGS AND EVENTS RECORDED THERE.**

### COLOR IN CHRISTIAN SYMBOLISM

As God has flooded earth and sky with color, so the Church has sensed the symbolic use of color in its worship. As nominating colors in nature change with the seasons of the fourfold year, so there is a color sequence in the Church year. There has been built around the Church calendar a symbolism of colors which applies especially to the antependia (or hangings) on the altar, lectern, and pulpit, and to the vestments worn by the clergy.

The earliest definite knowledge of the use of specific color in the service of the Church is Clement of Alexandria's (150?-220?) recommendation of white as suitable to all Christians. The Canons of Hippolytus assign white to the clergy as becoming their office. The mediaeval development of color symbolism may be examined in the *Rationale Divinorum Officiorum* of Durandus; this 13th century prelate explains the meanings of all colors but, interestingly enough, knows of no such thing as either a standard use or a standard meaning.

WHITE is the symbol of purity, joy, truth, perfection, holiness, and glory; it is the color of happiness and rejoicing. It is used at Christmas, Epiphany, Easter, As-

censiontide and some other occasions. It is also the proper color for baptisms, marriages, and confirmations, and is associated with Holy Communion.

VIOLET is the symbol of mourning, penitence, humility, suffering, sympathy, and fasting. The similar color PURPLE is the royal color, referring to the triumphal entry of the King of kings, who was of royal (Davidic) descent; it is also the color of penitence, referring to the purple garments put on our Lord when they mocked him. VIOLET is used in the penitential seasons of Advent and Lent, and on some other occasions.

RED is the symbol of the Holy Spirit (from the tongues of fire which appear at the first Pentecost) and is used during Pentecost. It is also the symbol of blood and is used to denote the days of martyrs, who died for the Christian faith. It is used on Reformation Sunday and on some other occasions.

GREEN is the universal color of nature and symbolizes hope, life, and growth. It is used during Epiphany and Kingdormtide, the teaching seasons of the church.

BLACK is the symbol of grief, sorrow, and mourning. It is used on Good Friday.—Copied.
