## COMMUNION MEDITATION

### "AMAZING GRACE!"

Sometimes HOLY COMMUNION is called "a means of grace." What do we mean by the GRACE of God?

This is what I want to deal with in the Communion Meditation during the 8:30 and 11:00 o'clock Worship Services and at greater length during the 9:30 o'clock radio broadcast over Station WTNT.

There is nothing mechanical about the grace of God. There is nothing automatic about the grace of God. Grace is not a something we get by eating bread and drinking wine nor by sitting in Church on Sunday morning.

Grace is always personal. Grace results from the personal activity of God who GIVES HIMSELF to us. He GIVES Himself. And it's HIMSELF He gives.

Even FAITH is God's gift. We don't whip up faith within ourselves by thinking positive thoughts or by taking some sort of spiritual alkaliseltzer tablet. Faith is always born of the experience of being loved. A little girl trusts her mother not because Mom says, "Mary! I'm your mother. So, you trust me!" If Mary trusts Mom it's because she has experienced Mom's love.

And how does this LOVE come to us? By word, and by gesture (action), and by gifts which serve as tokens of that love. (Could not we put the bread and wine of Holy Communion into such a gift category?)

Harold and I are looking forward to helping in the Celebration of our first Holy Communion together.

## NINTH ANNUAL BELL-RINGING

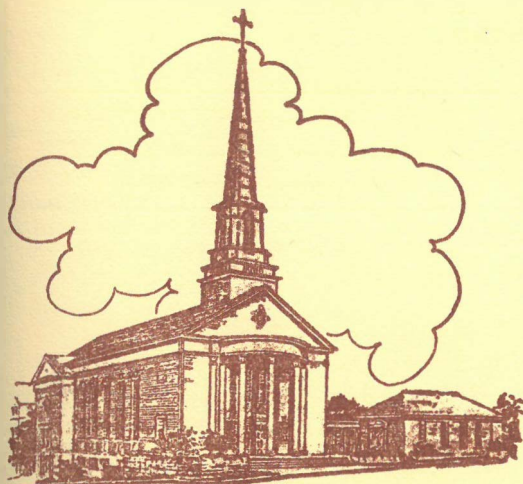
## HOSPITAL VISITATION

## Sermon Preview

### "OUR GREATEST MISTAKE AND OUR GREATEST TASK"

*"For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son that whosoever believeth in Him should not perish, but have eternal life." John 3:16.*

Here is one of our favorite Bible verses. It is a favorite because it presents the essence of the Gospel in one brief sentence. It presents the love of God standing forth in sunny outline, brave and clear.

But, I fear, it also is a favorite because we have not really heard what it is saying. Not on purpose have we missed the message. We have not intended to avoid the demand that comes wrapped up in this gift. But we often have missed it, nevertheless.

I've discovered in my own personal study of the Bible that I can study a section of Scripture and find God breaking into my experience in a new way. Then sometime later I can return to this very same Scripture and in the light of new experiences I have had, and in the light of new conditions I face, find God breaking into my experience in yet more exciting and creative ways.

My purpose on Sunday morning will be to present an old and familiar verse (John 3:16) in such a way that we all will find God revealing Himself in our experience in a new, and exciting, and life-changing way.

I want us together to see in this verse not only OUR GREATEST MISTAKE, but also OUR GREATEST TASK and opportunity.

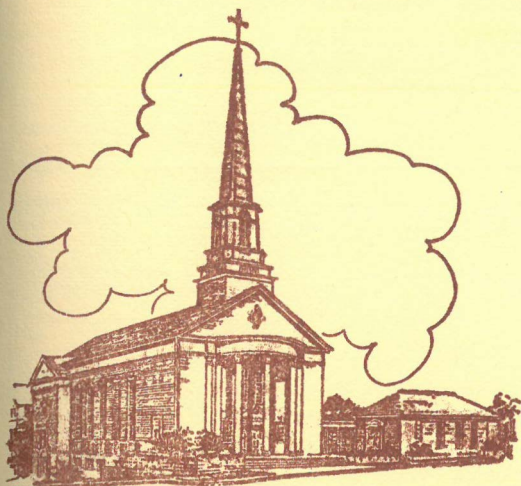

## Sermon Preview

### GOD NEVER ABANDONS HIS CHILDREN

Romans 1:18-32.

Three times in this morning's Scripture lesson we read the words of the Apostle Paul saying, "God abandoned them . . ."

Here is a good illustration of how easy it would be to lift a few verses out of the Bible and make the Bible say the most libelous things about God. Shakespeare said that even the Devil can cite Scripture to suit his purpose.

Is Paul really saying that God abandons His people? No! Then what is he saying in this particular Scripture?

1. First Paul is saying God has given each of us freedom. We are made in the image of God with a capacity to live in right relationship with Him, or we can turn our backs upon Him and that relationship. In the Scripture lesson Paul is describing people who have turned their backs upon God and His Way. And God, respecting their freedom, lets them go.

2. And Paul is pointing to the fact of judgment here also. To turn our backs upon God and to establish a pattern of life that is contrary to God's purpose is to live a life that is destined to fail and to fall. (Here is where we can take a quick look at what is sometimes called "the unpardonable sin.")

We may get the feeling at times that God has abandoned us. But the fact is God never, never lets us go.

*"That soul, though all hell should endeavor to shake,  
I'll never, no never, no never forsake!"*

Here is the "love that wilt not let me go."

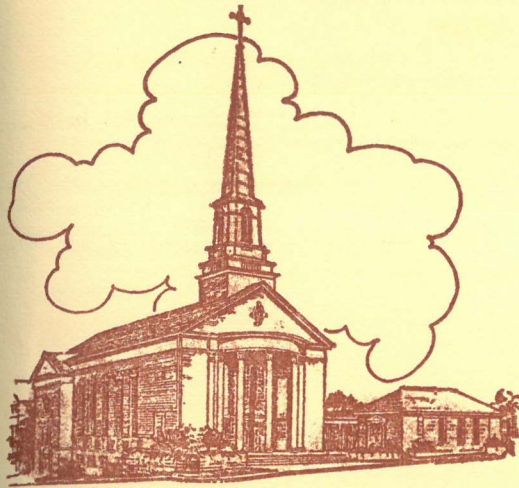

## Sermon Preview

I LIKE TO PREACH IN SERIES. I find that I can do my most effective preaching when I grab hold of a theme and hang on for a few weeks. I've mentioned already that after the middle of November I plan to begin a series of sermons dealing with some of the basic beliefs of Christian people. In October and during the first part of November I plan to deal for a few Sundays with the area of stewardship.

BUT DURING THESE FIRST SUMMER WEEKS I confess that I am at the mercy of whim. I really had not expected to move when I did. I'm not complaining about that. (I like it here. My whole family does.) But it is taking me a while to get some wheels stopped that I had going in one direction and get them moving in a new direction.

I just thought I'd mention this in case you noticed that there doesn't appear to be much over-all design in my week-to-week preaching during the summer. If there does not appear to be much over-all design in my week-to-week preaching it's because there isn't any over-all design. But there will be — later.

This Sunday's message is entitled CAUGHT IN THE ACT. It deals with the need for us to be caught in the act of being ourselves.

We need to be conscious of ourselves as the children of God. And then we need to see the roles we play in terms of who we really are.

The SCRIPTURE (Luke 18:18-23) DESCRIBES THE RICH YOUNG RULER. As I see it this man was trying to find out who he was. Jesus helped him to answer this question. And then Jesus helped him to see what he would have to do (what role he would have to play) in order to be who he really was. (This young man had to answer the question: To be or not to be?) He was not prepared to pay the price of being himself. But perhaps from his failure we can learn the necessity of accepting the opportunity Christ offers.
