## Sermon Preview

### COMMUNION MEDITATION

#### "BLESSED ASSURANCE"

*"When we cry, 'Abba, Father!' it is the Spirit himself bearing witness with our spirit that we are the children of God."* Romans 8:16.

When Charles Wesley began one of his hymns with the question, "How can a sinner know his sins on earth forgiven?" he already knew the answers, and indeed proceeds in the remainder of the hymn to rejoice in these assurances. One of the distinctive emphases of developing Methodism was this one of the inward witness. On his deathbed Samuel Wesley, father of John and Charles, declared this witness to be central in Christian faith and experience. John Wesley wrote of his Aldersgate experience, "The Spirit itself bore witness to my spirit that I was a child of God, gave me an evidence thereof, and I immediately cried "Abba, Father."

While others constantly put our claims to Christian faith to the test, we should from time to time test ourselves as to the strength and vitality of our faith. Others usually make the ethical test only, since this is the one most available to them. We must grant this and make it ourselves. But at the deepest level our self tests are those of inward assurance and peace.

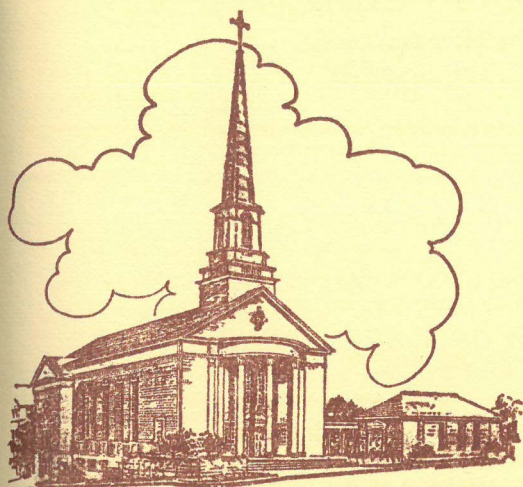

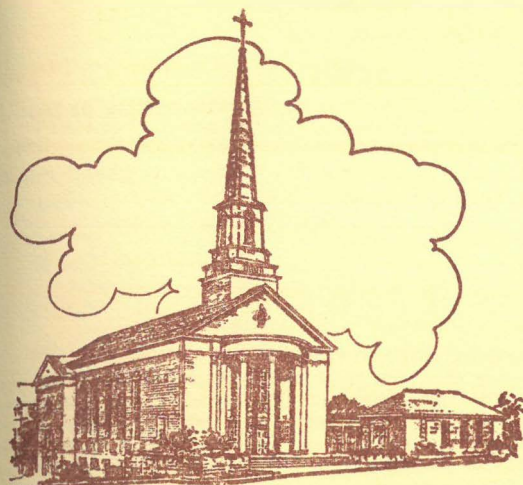

## Sermon Preview

### "WHO IS A CHRISTIAN?"

*"Now those who were scattered because of the persecution that arose over Stephen traveled as far as Phoenicia and Cyprus and Antioch, speaking the word to none except Jews. But there were some of them, men of Cyprus and Cyrene, who on coming to Antioch spoke to the Greeks also, preaching the Lord Jesus. And the hand of the Lord was with them, and a great number that believed turned to the Lord . . . ; and in Antioch the disciples were for the first time called Christians." Acts 11:19-26.*

"He's a good man! He lives his life by high moral standards; he is active in his church; he believes the Bible; he believes in God; therefore he is a Christian!" It that so? No, it is not so.

"He is a man of faith; therefore he is a Christian!" Is that so? No, it is not so. I've known lots of people (and you have too) who have plenty of faith. But they have too much faith in too little.

It was at Antioch that the followers of Jesus first were called Christians. During the 8:30 and 11:00 A.M. services I plan to deal with this basic question: WHO IS A CHRISTIAN?
