Sermon Preview

COMMUNION MEDITATION

"HOW JESUS TRANSFORMS OUR LIVES"

Scripture: John 2:1-11.

Some of the nature miracles of Jesus are perhaps best understood as acted parables. One such is the Cursing of the Fig Tree. Another is the changing of the water into wine at the wedding feast in Cana of Galilee.

That Jesus was present at a wedding feast is significant in itself, showing his life-affirming mind and spirit, and encouraging us to believe in redemptive involvement in common life.

Consider all the transformations Jesus brought about. Rooted in Judaism he transformed it into Christianity. He walked the hills and valleys of Palestine and made it the Holy Land. He lived as a poor man and sanctified poverty. He suffered deeply and in his victory made even suffering redemptive.

The story of Christianity is the story of transformed lives. The living Christ is the quickening spirit, lifting men from despair to hope, changing common men into saints, and giving us all visions of better things to be.

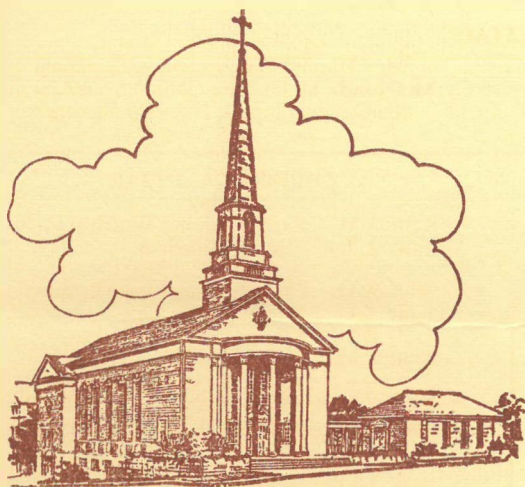

Sermon Preview

"LOOKING UNTO JESUS"

"Looking unto Jesus the author and finisher of our faith."

Hebrews 12:2a

We are now deep into the Lenten Season, with our thoughts more and more fixed upon Jesus as he moves toward Jerusalem. The great drama moves toward its tense episodes and great climax in the crucifixion and resurrection of Jesus. He is easily the central figure on the stage and all eyes turn fixedly upon him.

As it was in the development of the drama of Holy Week in Jerusalem in that time so long ago, so it is in our understanding of the whole of Christian history, and so it is in the faith of the Church and of each believer.

"Ecce Homo!" Behold the Man! Indeed we are found "looking unto Jesus." No effort on our part is required. There is a fascination about him which draws our attention, even though we may will otherwise.

There is a suggestion implied in the word from Hebrews that if we begin with him we shall finish with him. Here is where some enter into error, trying to bring him in and fit him into some scheme of thought and life already adopted and underway. But this gives him only an accessory role, and along the way he gets left out altogether or is retained as Lord in name only, or as ornament. To begin with him is to give him first place. Thus the pioneer of our lives becomes preserver and fulfillment to the end.

Sermon Preview

“THIS QUESTION — IT KEEPS COMING UP!”

“What do you think of the Christ?” Matthew 22:42.

It is interesting how old questions keep coming up. And this one especially. It seems by this time we would have it so answered that we could put it to rest—the sceptics by thinking it doesn't matter and the orthodox by settling down on their firm conclusions.

We perhaps remember it best in its KJV wording, “What think ye of Christ?” Interesting indeed it is that the questioner is Jesus himself and those questioned the Pharisees. We may assume he still asks and we are called to be the respondents.

In the religious ferment of the day images of Jesus and claims about him abound. There is much richness, considerable confusion, and some nonsense in all of this. Before one gets lost in this strange tide of religious search or throws over the whole matter as hopeless, it might be well for us to consider a couple of thoughts.

First, we find in the New Testament itself a considerable variety of views of Jesus. Second, there is a degree of richness in the personality of our Lord which allows, even invites, variations in our understandings and views of him. A consideration of these two observations will contribute the primary substance of the sermon.

Sermon Preview

"A PLACE FOR THE CROSS"

"For Jews demand signs and Greeks seek wisdom, but we preach Christ crucified, a stumbling block to Jews and folly to Gentiles." I Corinthians 1:22, 23.

How does the Cross of Christ fit into your world-view? Does your philosophy of life have a place for a Savior? Even a suffering and dying one? Think of it this way: If your scheme of all things were pictorially represented, then cut up jig saw puzzle fashion into pieces, would you have a cross, and could you fit it in to your satisfaction or at all?

Paul strongly preached "Christ crucified," but this seemed the height of folly to the Gentiles, who had no background in the first place for a Messiah, certainly not a crucified one. While the Jews inherited and held all sorts of ideas about a Messiah, they stumbled over the very thought of a crucified Christ.

Doubtless many of us, even Christians, could well identify with either Gentiles or Jews in our inhospitality to the Cross. But there it is, looming large in the New Testament, central to the redeeming work of Christ, strong in our understanding of God's love.

A place for the Cross? A place for the Cross in your mind? A place for the Cross in your heart? Here the Gospel sharply impinges upon each of us.
