HOW MUCH MONEY SHALL I GIVE TO TRINITY CHURCH? I have to answer that question. So do you. As long as I live in Tallahassee, I will do as I have in every other community where I have lived and been a part of the church. I will give. BUT — HOW MUCH? To give or not to give. That is not the question. BUT — HOW MUCH? Now that is the question.

Should I take the \$234,000 budget figure for 1973 and divide it by the more than 2,600 members of Trinity and then say, "Now, that is what I shall give?"

Or should I look at what I gave last year and decide, "Now, that is what I shall give?"

Or shall I look at the budget and decide how much of the program I like and how much of it I don't like and determine my giving by that?

O shall I look at my pay check, add up all of my other obligations and interests, and if I have anything left, I'll give that?

Or — and on and on I could go lifting up all sorts of alternatives.

In answering the question "HOW MUCH?" some people would simply say, "Just tithe and you won't have any problem." But I've listened to people discuss the tithe. Each one has had his Bible at hand and each one has come out with different interpretations of what it means to tithe. For example, one says, "To tithe means to give ten per cent of your income to the church." Another says, "To tithe means to give ten per cent after income tax (take-home pay) to the church." Another says, "To tithe means to give ten per cent of one's income to the church and other charity purposes." Still another says, "The tithe is part of the Old Testament Law. Being Christians, we don't abide by that old Jewish Law. So the tithe has nothing at all to do with me. I'm saved by grace — not by Law."

Well — take your pick. Or maybe you have your own interpretation that is still another variation from any of these above.

Jesus did not say much about tithing. He did say, "Woe to you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! for you TITHE mint and dill and cummin, and have neglected the weightier matters of the law, justice and mercy and faithfulness; THESE YOU OUGHT TO HAVE DONE, WITHOUT NEGLECTING THE OTHERS." (Matthew 23:23.)

One thing is certain, from my observation of the teaching and life and meaning of Jesus our own giving as Christians should not be less than that which is given by those who strive to live by the Law.

I have to decide "How much?" No one else can decide for me. So with you.

But there are certain principles I must keep in mind: Jesus said, "To whom much is given, of him shall much be required." My giving must be in proportion to what I have. The Apostle Paul describing the giving of Christians said, "For they gave according to their means . . . and beyond their means of their own free will." (II Corinthians 8:3.)

Jesus said, "Freely ye have received; therefore freely give." I have received God's love and grace freely. (God has not been stingy with His grace.) Therefore, my giving must be consistent with God's own generous giving.

Our Chancel Choir will offer a Christmas Cantata during both morning services on December 10. Other special music programs for December include a presentation of "Amal and the Night Visitors"; a special musical presentation by our Youth Choir; and special musical offerings by our children's choirs.
