"REMEMBER ME!" said Jesus. Why? Why did He want us to remember Him? Was Jesus' self image so weak that He couldn't bear the thought of being forgotten — so He encouraged us to remember Him as a way of feeding His hungry ego? Of course not! He said, "Remember me!" because He wanted His friends to be conscious always and forever of a task and a resource.

THE TASK? To be with Him in the world, engaged in ministry. We are to be His witnesses.

THE RESOURCE? To be with Him who said, "Lo, I am with you always." Here is the power to do the task.

When the child in the Jewish home during the Passover asks the question: "How is this night different from all others?" The father answers the question, "Because in this night WE were freed from slavery." In those words the father is saying, "Though it happened so long ago, that event is OUR event."

In the Old Testament Book of Deuteronomy 1:35 we read that the Hebrew people who escaped the bondage of Egypt will die in the wilderness without getting into the Promised Land. Their children will see it, but the old generation will die before they get there.

However, in the fifth chapter of that same book, we find Moses speaking to the children of those who escaped and saying to them, "The Lord our God made a covenant with us in Horeb. Not with our fathers did the Lord make this covenant, but with us, who are all of us here alive this day." But they were not born yet when the covenant was made. How could God have made the covenant with them when they were not even born yet? Moses here is helping them to understand memory as having to do with contemporary events — the past becomes our present.

We do the same thing when we sing the song, "Were You There When They Crucified My Lord?" And we know that we were. In a sense we were there on Calvary.

When we hear in the Communion Service the words, "Do this in remembrance of me!" we know that in the act of Communion we break bread and drink wine with those twelve disciples. There is a sense in which the whole Church is gathered at the table. Today is World-Wide Communion Sunday not only in that people all over the world are gathering around the Lord's Table; but it's world-wide in that the Church through the centuries is here too. This is what we mean when we say the Church is apostolic and catholic.

WE REMEMBER. But not in the sense that we remember a Jesus who was and is no more. **WE REMEMBER** becomes a statement of recognition in which we are conscious of the presence of the very One we remember.

Elton Trueblood says that a good deal of what goes on in the Church is designed to make our congregations mere spectators or "auditors taking a course for non-credit. If the Church is to be renewed, there must be a new dimension of interaction and involvement on the part of the average layman."

Howard Keeley quotes a woman who said, "When I am at Church I am among polite strangers. There is no opportunity in worship services nor in brief business meetings or 'programs' really to know the other person and understand his needs."

What sort of Church do you feel would make it possible for us to carry out the demands of the New Testament: "Bear ye one another's burdens"; "Love one another"; "Confess your faults to one another and pray for one another"?

For faith to mature and genuine Christian Community to develop, the Church must provide opportunities for the sort of openness that makes it possible for people to examine doubts and fears and to share difficulties and burdens without any fear of being rejected nor condemned.

In a Sunday School class a woman one morning had the honesty to express some doubts she had. Several members of the class gasped. Others said, "We are sure you really don't feel that way." In other words the members of that class did not have the understanding nor the preparation which would have enabled them to minister to this needy member of their class. Perhaps they were afraid that to deal openly with her doubts might mean that they would have to begin to look honestly at their own. Anyway, in this case the leader of the class (Howard Keeley) saw what was happening. He rebuked the class and praised the woman for her honesty, pointing out that the class could not minister to her if they did not know what her real needs were.

I recall several years ago visiting a woman who was dying of cancer. She knew this. One afternoon she suddenly said to me, "You know, I have been in this Church all my life. I have been president of the Woman's Society, I have served on the Official Board, I have taught Sunday School, and yet the Holy Spirit has never been anything more to me than just an empty word."

This person, you see, was being honest with me. She was daring to take off her disguise and let me see her real needs. It was a daring, risky thing for her to do because she could not know how I would respond to her. Suppose I had said in a voice of shocked surprise, "My goodness, Mrs. X, you ought to be ashamed of yourself having doubts like that!" Or suppose I had said, "Why Mrs. X, you shouldn't even be thinking things like that, much less talking like this to me." Or suppose I had said, "Oh, Mrs. X, you don't really feel this way." If I had made a response like any of those I would have rejected her. And I would have turned her off. It would have been as if I had said, "I don't care how you feel; I don't care about you."

I began where she was. I accepted her as she was — a person with doubts — a person having a real problem with her faith. I asked God to help me to provide an atmosphere and a relationship in which she would be free to face her real self. For it was only then that she would be able to accept the help God Himself was offering.

My prayer was answered. And she came through the valley of doubt into a vital faith. She died a short time later. But she died with a real sense of God being a very present help, and the Holy Spirit being a dynamic resource in her life. It is the object of every group in the Church to provide that sort of atmosphere of acceptance.

The easiest thing in the world for us to do here on Sunday morning would be to beat the old drum of complaint about the failures of the Church. We can all do that. We can sit in our Sunday School Classes and in our small group discussions and in our homes and complain about the failures of the Church. As a preacher I can stand in front of the congregation and complain about the Church's short comings. We can complain that this Church is just another club, that the Church is more interested in money and success than it is in developing the spiritual resources of its members and ministering to the community — the easiest thing in the world is to play the old game of "Let's all sit around and criticize the Church."

We all know the Church has its faults and failures. But to sit around and talk about them is of about as much value as somebody with a virus cold going to a doctor and the doctor after a brief exam says, "Well, you've got a virus cold."

Sitting around criticizing contributes to our own cynicism and inactivity — and convinces the community outside the Church that they are right after all when they say the Church is filled with hypocrites. If your aim is to weaken the Church's influence and to lessen its effectiveness, then just sit around complaining.

NOW THIS DOES NOT MEAN THAT WE SHOULD NOT BE CRITICAL OF THE CHURCH'S FAILURES. We need to diagnose the ills. But diagnosis without cure is of about as much value as telling a lady with a backache, "Lady, you've got a backache."

Lots of people think they have done their part when they tell the preacher what's wrong with the Church, or when they tell each other on the street corner what the Church's failures are.

When we who are in the Church use our greatest energy to being critical of the Church, we have no one but ourselves to blame when suddenly we wake up one day and find that the world does not take the Church seriously.

Let's resolve together to take the Church seriously — to uphold the Church (as we vowed we would when we accepted the responsibilities of belonging to the Church) with our prayers, our presence, our gifts, and our service.

I believe

So I live

Someone said that a man's life is a picture book of his creed. Our lives are a demonstration of our real beliefs.

One night recently I watched the TONIGHT show on television. Johnny Carson said, "You can tell a lot about a person by looking at his cancelled checks." Then he gave a demonstration of what he meant. Johnny read to the audience a series of cancelled checks that told the story of his TV side-kick Ed McMahon. There was a check made out to the hospital for \$250 on the day Ed was born. It was signed rather feverishly by Ed's dad. Another check for \$24.50 was to a store for a crib and other baby furniture. The final item read was a check for \$1,572.10 to the Gerber Baby Food Company for baby food. (Ed is quite a "hefty" fellow.)

Of course, this was done all in good fun. But there is an element of truth in the whole thing. You can tell a lot about yourself by reading through your checkbook stubs and seeing where most of your money goes.

Stewardship makes up a large part of our demonstration as Christians. Now, by stewardship I mean what we do with all we have and all we are. This includes what we do with the world for which we have been given responsibility by God. It includes what we do with our time, our talents and abilities, our work, our very life. It includes also what we do with our money.

Now, stewardship is not a program nor a project that comes from Methodist Headquarters or from our own local Administrative Board to be promoted each October and November. Stewardship is our God-given responsibility. It encompasses the whole of life — all of the time.

Still, in facing the realities of church life we know that there are times in the Church year when added emphasis is given to stewardship, and particularly stewardship in relationship to money. (Just as for the Christian every Sunday is Resurrection Day. Yet there is an emotional attachment to Easter Sunday that cannot be denied, and it results in a special emphasis upon the Resurrection during that particular season of the year.)

During these last two weeks in October and up through two Loyalty Sundays on November 13 and 19 we will be giving special attention to the Church program for 1973 and the budget required to support that program.

I do not hesitate to preach about the Christian's use of money or to talk about money or to write about it. I recognize that money plays a vital role in the life of the Church, and I know that money belongs in Church as much as reading the 23rd Psalm or celebrating the Resurrection of Jesus Christ. Jesus talked about money. So, I do too.

YOUR ADMINISTRATIVE BOARD ADOPTED A BUDGET LAST TUESDAY NIGHT FOR 1973.

Good budgets are born — and not made. This budget of ours did not spring ready-made from the hand of any one person. Nor did any small group of people sit down together and concoct a budget out of a combination of imagination and a bucket full of figures. Really the budget was born out of a process — a long process.

In order for a church to be what it really is — the Body of Christ — it structures itself to carry out the full range of responsibilities from worship and evangelism to missions, education, and social concerns. We have a number of commissions, boards, and committees. These groups of leaders have been looking at specific goals which we hope to reach in 1973. They have begun developing structures and programs to attain these goals. Then they put price tags on these means of attaining the goals. **THE PRICE TAGS ARE THE PROPOSED BUDGET FOR 1973.**

I say "PROPOSED" budget because that is all it will be until after we have our **PLEDGE SERVICES AND EVERY MEMBER CANVASS.**

Between now and Sunday, November 12, you will be given (1) a copy of the proposed budget for 1973, (2) a copy of the membership roll of Trinity, (3) a pledge card, (4) a letter describing in detail the plan we are using to underwrite the budget.

On two Sundays during the 8:30 and 11:00 worship services you will be given an opportunity to fill in and turn in a pledge card. The two Sundays are November 12 and 19.

On the afternoon of Sunday, November 19, over 300 members of Trinity will be visiting the homes of Trinity members who were not able to make their commitments on the 12th or the 19th in church. Follow up calls will be made through the week.

Your Finance Committee will total the amount of money pledged. They will add to that figure all money Trinity can expect to receive from other sources ("loose" offerings, special gifts, etc.). This figure will indicate the amount of money which we can plan to receive during 1973. If this figure should not reach the amount required by the budget, then the program will go back to the committees and commissions to be cut to fit the expected income. Our hope is that we will attain the goal that has been set.

I thank now those seven persons who are serving as the executive committee for our finance program, and those six who have served as majors recruiting thirty captains. And I thank all thirty captains who are now in the process of contacting 300 persons who will serve as visitors on November 19. (Already several captains have reported to the office, excitedly announcing that they are getting an eager and willing response from those who they have been asked to contact.) I'm thankful for the response. It looks as though I've got lots of things to be thankful for. And I am.
